THE WAR WAGED FIRRCELY IN THE CINCO VILLAS DISTRICT-BULLETINS OF BATTLES DURING FOURTEEN DAYS.

HAVANA: Peb. 17, 1875. The Gaceta publishes the following official resume of military operations in the Cinco Villas district for the past fortuight: BULLETINS OF BATTLE.


