## The President and the Louisi ann Conservative Committee.

On the 22nd of February last Messrs. Zacharie, Burke, and Leo-nard, representing the Conserva-tive party of Louislana, had an interview with the President. They were introduced to the President by Col. Casey. Mr. Burke proposes to read his amendment to the Wheeler proposition, but the President informed him that he could not be a party to any agreemen as it was his duty to execute the law and not to onter into any pertiation or compromise; but he would be rejoiced if the opposing parties in Louisians, sould come to some understanding by which the pre sent contentions in that State could be settled. He spoke in the highest terms of Representative Wheeler, in the character of a compromiser, and said some mistakes and bear made, but if he had been Governor nu at the time of the Sep tember troubles, he would have over to the courts instead of coninformed the Louisiana Committee that he would consult with the other parties to the contest in Louisi ana, and said no man would rejoice more than bimselt if and diringement could be made by which conflicting ylevs could be reconciled and the peace and prosperity of Lonislana secured.

It being suggested to the President that some intimation from Washington would probably be necassary to influence the action of the Republicans of Louisiana, after some consideration he refferred the committee then called upon Mr. Wheeler, who stated that he would doublin his nower by new, infinence, and advise to settle the Louisiand recetion on the basis of his propositions. 18/-165


