Assess By Man

A BRIDGE AT GARDENVIEW.
Washington, March 6.—One of the last acts passed by Congress and signed by the President was a bill amending the act authorizing the St. Clair and Carondelet Bridge Company to erect a bridge across the Mississippi at St. Louis. The amended bill provides for two straight, continuous spans, of not less than 400 feet each in the clear of piers at low water mark, said two spans to be placed over the main channel; provided, that any bridge built under provision of the act shall not be constructed of arch spans. The bill further provides that if the bridge company accept the bridge site numbered two on the plan and survey submitted to the Secretary of War, they shall be required to erect a trestle bridge of iron or steel, to hold the chain spans—the western spans above the bridge; and, further, that after the company shall have accepted the site and definitely planned the bridge, with its piers, the same shall be submitted to the Secretary of War for his approval. An additional section, giving Congress the right at all times to repeal or amend the act, was added to the House bill.

ANTY-CIVIL RIGHTS LEGISLATION.
Richmond, Va., March 6.—Mr. Gilman, of this city, introduced a bill in the House of Delegates to day to punish parties creating disturbances in hotels, theaters and other places of amusement. It provides that persons who create disturbances in hotels by unreasonable demands for accommodations, after the proprietor or his agent has declined to entertain them for want of room or other reasonable appliances, shall be punished by a fine and imprisonment. In the case of theaters, managers are to have the right to issue tickets, stamped, not transferable, and when a party got the original purchaser demands admission the door-keeper can refuse him, but the price of the ticket must be refunded, and if he refuses to take the money, and thereby creates a disturbance, he is liable to arrest and fine. There are similar provisions regarding steamboats and railroads.

A NEGRO MEMORIAL.
Montgomery, Ala., March 6.—The recent memorial presented to the United States Senate by Spencer was printed this morning, and chosen for its statements.
Mr. Harris, a white Republican Senator, rose in his seat, on a question of privilege, and denounced the memorial. He said he never signed it, and had never seen it till this morning, and had voted for nearly all the letters which the memorial denounces, and concluded by the statement that his name was forged.
Wray, a colored Senator, said that J. B. Hingham brought a paper to him and asked his signature. He did not read it, but understood the paper to be a petition to make Arthur Hingham postmaster of Montgomery. He said he never would have signed it knowingly.
Another negro Senator said he thought he was signing a protest against "patent" appointments to the United States judgeship.
Several other Republican Senators repudiated a knowledge of it.
The Senate appointed a committee to find out who were the parties guilty of fraud.

THE BLACK HILLS.
Omaha, Neb., March 6.—Gen. Ord has instructed Col. Bradley, commandant at Fort Laramie, to send out a force to bring in the remainder of the Sioux City Black Hills party, who are reported to be in a suffering condition. If the two men who came in from the hills will guide the command. Orders have been issued to prevent any one else going into that country, and any one trying to do so will be followed and driven out by the military.

NOT A CANDIDATE.
Dubuque, March 6.—The Times, of this city, and the Illinois Register, to-morrow will publish a long letter from George O. Wright, U. S. Senator from this State, announcing that he is not a candidate for re-election. His reasons are ill health, occasioned by too arduous labors during the term of office, and business relations which he has for some time been contemplating. He will resume the practice of law in Des Moines at the expiration of his term.

REPEALS DENIED.
Council Bluffs, Ia., March 6.—The Springville Grange, of Pottawatomie County, today declared themselves free and independent from all authority of National and State Granges, and that their connection therewith is dissolved. The grievance alleged was that officers of these granges had furnished all confidence, mismanaged finances, and otherwise wronged them.

ADVANCE ON PASSENGER RATES.
New York, March 6.—An advance of 50 cents on their storage passage rates will be made on Monday by all English steamship lines, as the result of the conference between their representatives. The advance will affect those taking storage passage from either side. The fast lines will charge 25 cents and the slow lines 50 cents.
