Editor Express: The following table will set forth the character of our present city tax ordinance, showing the difference between the tax levied and the tax that should be levied in order to make taxation equal:

The question of a tax on the product of the result of ignorance or the product of favoritism? The City Council must either correct their figures or bear one or the other imputation. Poor men have rights in this city which rich men and office-holders must respect, and one of those rights, guaranteed them by the supreme law of the land, is that they shall not bear a burden of tax that is not theirs.

There is a disposition to place responsibility on this question, but the entire responsibility lies with the City Council, who are responsible for this unjust and illegal tax ordinance as long as the public demand is made.

Conclude by warning the City Council that the tax on the result of ignorance and favoritism will be collected and will be collected.
