The Express has taken such a deep interest in the Centeraial of American Independence, and especially in the success of the representation of Texas in that Grand World's Exposition, that we are very glad to receive a printed letter from one of our Commissioners, Capt. J. C. Chew, 29 Broadway, New York, addressed "To the Press of Texas," Capt. Chew is one of our old personal friends, and was a brother journalist in Houston for several years after the war. We omit the first part of the letter, which is principally personal and humorous, and reproduce only that part of it which contains the information needed in Texas in relation

to the Centennial. Capt. Chew says that he was appointed more than two years ago, having been nominated by Gov. E. J. Davis, and appointed by President Grant.

Davis tendered me the nomination to the President of the United States, as a representative Democrat, irom Texas, stating explicitly, and in a manner that did him credit, that he wished to harmonize both parties in the Centennial Festival of 1876. Son Antonio National Bank.

Some 'days since we published a dispatch from Washington, copied from the Galveston News, in reference to the action of this prosperous institution. We now publish the facts more fully, as we have epelved them from the polite and officlept officers of the Bank.

The San Autonio National Bank was organized with a capital of \$125,000. They purchased \$125,000 in U. S. Bonds, for which they paid \$142,500, a premium of \$17,500. They deposited this \$125,000 in U. S. Bonds with the Treasurer of the United States and received for the same 90 per cent., or \$112,500 in currency for

They last month deposited with the U. S. Legal Tenders, for the purpose of ever known here by any citizen. retiring that amount of their circulation. And they have withdrawn \$75,000 of the \$125,000 in U. S. Bonds.

Their circulation now is \$45,000, and in the hands of the Treasurer of the United States, to secure the redemption of the same they have in \$50,000 United States onds. And they have on deposit with the Tresenrer \$2,250 in Legal Tenders, which amount they are required to keep on deposit for the redemption of their mutilated circulation.

National Banks are now depositing legal tenders, withdrawing their bonds and retiring their circulation, because they can ose their capital to better advantage than by taking circulation for the same at 90 cents on the dollar, having to deposit for their capital U. & bonds at par, and forced to keep, in addition, five per cent. of their circulation in U. S. Currency. National Banks baving to pay on their circulation a tax of 1 per cont, and the government resping all the advantages of circulation destroyed by water or fire, or in any other

FROM INDIANOLA We are destitute. The town is gone.

One tenth of the population is gone. Dead bodies are strewn for swenty miles along the bay. Nine touths of the houses are destroyed. Soud as help for God's W. H. CHAIN, sake. (signed) District Attorney.

The following was received by business houses from their correspondents on Wadreeday, 15th:

Wind from eastward, veering to north. On Thursday morning it became more steady, increasing to a gale. Tile water was a foot deep here.

Men, women and children were seeking places of safety. The wind blew fearfully. Night came on and the situation was awful. Berestne from women and children could be heard in every direction. The water was six foot deep in the streets.

About 2 o'clock Friday morning the vind vecred to North-West. The wares then became chopped, and rule and deatruction came. Houses were washed away or tainbiled to pieces. "The wind, toward morning, began to full a little, but the water was getting lower nutil the wind vorced North; then came hope.

Daylight began to bingk. Then did we behold the awful destruction ground us, and thanked our God that we had been saved, and that our perilous position was as nothing compared with the sufferings of our neighbors and citizens along the bay. Broad day-light revealed a seene that was terrible to behold. The town could not be discerned so the Lodianola of the day previous. Buts, total rain every where. 
