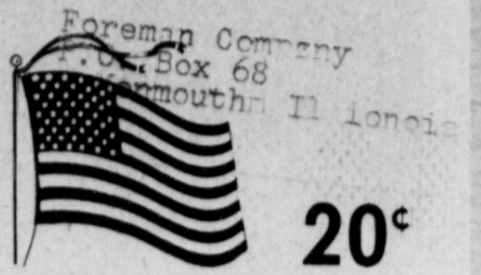

## City Finances 'Solid' Says Auditor's Report

### No Financial Woes For City Officials

In recent months, area news media has been focusing on the financial plight of at least two towns in this area. This is not the case in Muleshoe, as Creston Faver, auditor for the city of Muleshoe reported to the city council Tuesday morning that the city is in good financial condition.

Faver reported to the council on results of the audit done to close out the books on September 30, 1979 and said the firm of Williams, Adair, Faver, Sudduth and Co., could give the city a "clean opinion" on the operations of the city's finances.

The auditor was emphatic in stating that the City of Muleshoe maintains good records, and that all the city employees have again proven to be easy to work with and any requested information has been provided quickly and easily.

According to the audit report, the city has a total asset picture nearing \$4 million, as it is set at \$3,982,037.

Total revenue for the city during the six months covered in the audit was \$249,458, which was some \$41,164 above and budget estimate. Most of the increase came through the payment of taxes, revenue sharing, charges for services and through fines received through the municipal judge.

It was explained that much of the fine money credited to the city had come through the payment of fines received from an intensive drive by the city police officers to halt a "hot check" problem in Muleshoe.

Faver explained to the city council that it would be extremely hard to get a true picture of the city's operation as the revenues received and taxes received for a year, since the audit completed was for a six months period of time.

Tax collections have varied during the past ten years, according to the audit report. Collections have ranged from 92.66 percent in 1970 to 92.05 in 1979, with the lowest percentage collected being in 1975 when 88.79 percent of taxes were collected.

In 1977, with an estimated population of 4,450 persons, the bonded debt of the city was \$583,000 and this had been reduced in 1979 to a total of \$415,000, with an estimated population of 5,025 citizens.

The ratio of net bonded debt to assessed value was reduced from 5.2 percent in 1970, to the current ratio of .8 percent.

### Jury Trial Underway This Week

District Judge Pat Boone heard several pleas of guilty to various criminal charges Monday morning, and assessed probation for all persons who decided to plead guilty to their charges they were facing.

Given probation were Juan Vega and Lalo Torres, who faced four counts of criminal mischief; Vincente Lujan, who was charged with one count of burglary and Charles Robert Canfield, who had been charged with one count of forgery.

Tuesday morning, the trial of Michael Lee Dalton, who had been charged with theft was expected to get underway in district court and Thursday morning the trial of Chris Eady, on charges of burglary of a habitation was scheduled.

A total of 72 prospective jurors were summoned to appear for possible service on Tuesday morning, with an additional panel asked to report for possible service on Thursday morning.

Several persons who had been slated for trial were notified their trials had been passed for this session of court, and in some instances, persons scheduled to go to the trial have not been apprehended.

### Junior Livestock Judges Chosen

Last Thursday night, the members of the Bailey County Junior Livestock Show board of directors met to decide the times and dates for the 1980 livestock show, and to choose judges and name superintendents for the show.

Name as beef cattle judge for the January 23-25 show was Dr. John McNeil, who is beef cattle specialist from Amarillo. He will also judge the sheep.

Swine judge will be Bob Robinson, County Extension Agent from Randall Canyon.

Steers and lambs will be alternated in the showing which will begin on Thursday, January 24 at 6 p.m.

The swine show is expected to get underway at 9 a.m. on Friday, January 25.

Bailey County Extension Agent Spencer Tanksley said general superintendent of the livestock show will be Ted Harrison.

Wayne Tunnell is superintendent of the beef show; and he will be assisted by Travis Bessire and Eugene Shaw.

Lewis Scoggin is superintendent of the swine show, and will be assisted by Donald Harrison, Kearney Scoggin and Ronnie Holt.

Superintendent of the sheep show is Dan Throckmorton, and he will be assisted by Bill Harmon, Odell Rasco and Burl Cooley.

Members of the grievance committee will include the show superintendent, along with Lionel Lane, Jeff Smith and Wayne Crittenden.

Like last year, the 4-H adult leaders and FFA Boosters will conduct a full line of food at the concession stand at the Bailey County Exhibition Center and Coliseum.

Tanksley said they will be planning food for families, who can eat then enjoy the livestock show.

## Tax Rebate Check Shows Slight Increase Over '78

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Thursday said the local option one-percent sales tax provided more

than \$467 million in revenue to Texas cities in 1979.

Bullock also announced the December city sales tax allocation to more than 900 Texas cities totaling \$76.6 million, boosting tax payments for this year \$42.2 million more than 1978.

"From that standpoint, there was reasonable, but not recession-proof growth in city sales tax rebates," Bullock added.

"In a blizzard of bad economic news, these totals show municipal treasurers fared moderately well. While overall inflation -- which is now close to about 13 percent annually -- has softened some of the cities' economic gains, adjustments for inflation point a better picture," he said.

Bullock also concluded that inflation for items and merchandise on which the sales tax is collected is estimated from six to seven percent a year.

Muleshoe's share of the December rebates totaled

\$25,611.82, compared to the \$22,413.01 received for the same period last year.

This brought the total for Muleshoe to date for the year to \$150,201.68, and the total was \$140,566.62 through November last year, for and overall increase of six percent for the year.

At Morton, the increase for the year was three percent, with a rebate check of \$7,349.53, compared to the \$8,968.88 received for the December check a year ago. At the same time, the overall picture for the year showed a slight increase.

Receipts for this first eleven months of this year were \$47,156.47, compared to the \$45,677.82 received through November last year.

Littlefield had a five percent increase for the

year. Receipts from Littlefield indicate the December payment last year was \$34,606.25, and the December tax rebate check for this year was \$36,349.06. For 1979, the payments to date total \$209,516.95, compared to \$197,672.12, denoting a five percent increase for the year.

This week the 8th grade Mules traveled to Littlefield, where they were defeated by the score of Mules 19 and Littlefield 26.

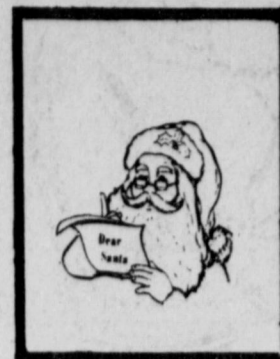

For homeowners with peach trees, fall is the best time to treat for one of the most destructive peach tree pests, the peach tree borer. A sure sign of the pest is gum oozing down the tree's trunk or branches, explains Spencer Tanksley, county agent with the Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. This pest primarily attacks peach trees but can infest plum, cherry and apricot trees, says Tanksley. Sooner or later, your trees stand a good chance of being infested.

Actually, two borers attack peach trees. The larval stage of the peach tree borer feeds within the tree's cambium layer in an area about six inches above the soil line to six inches below. The lesser peach tree borer attacks the cambium layer of the upper portion of the tree's trunk and larger branches.

The approach to controlling these pests is basically the same, but the method of application differs. The best time for treatment is now until about Nov. 15, points out Tanksley.

Two fumigants generally used for peach tree borer control are paradichlorobenzene (PDB) crystals or ethylene dichloride in both liquid and crystal forms.

PDB also is the active ingredient in some kinds of mothball crystals sold in "five-and-dime" or discount stores. You can save considerable money by using mothballs as a source of PDB for borer control. However, some mothballs are made from naphthalene instead of PDB crystals and must not be used against borers.

Using fumigants around peach trees is a delicate operation, so apply them with great care and precision, emphasizes Tanksley. Over-treatment can damage trees. The crystals, when applied to warm soil quickly volatilize into a heavy gas which penetrates through soil crevices into burrows of overwintering borers and kills them. Apply crystals only when soil is dry and the temperature is 55 degrees or above.

When using PDB for peach tree borer control, remove weeds from around the tree's base and level soil one foot from the trunk. Place PDB crystals in a narrow groove encircling the tree about two inches from the trunk. Be careful to keep crystals from directly contacting the tree, cautions Tanksley.

Place clean soil over the crystals to form a cone-shaped pile about six inches high around the tree's base. Remove this soil from the base of the tree in late March or early April.

The amount of PDB to use is determined by age and size of tree. In general, use one-half ounce of crystals for two- to three-year-old trees, three-fourths ounce for four- to five-year-old trees, and one ounce for mature trees.

Both PDB and ethylene dichloride can also be used to treat peach trees infested by the lesser peach tree borer. Treat affected areas, recognized by masses of gum mixed with sawdust running down the surface of the trunk and branches, after leaves fall from the peach trees.

Use a mixture of four ounces PDB in one pint of miscible (easily mixed) oil diluted in two pints of water or a smaller amount at the same proportions. Paint the mixture on wounds and damaged area without encircling the trunk or limb.

Proper rates and application instructions for using ethylene dichloride for either peach tree borer control will be found on the product label.

For the homeowner with peach trees infested with either peach tree borers or lesser peach tree borers, control measures can greatly lengthen the life of the trees, says Tanksley. Further information on control of peach tree borers is available at the county Extension office, in the Bailey County Courthouse.

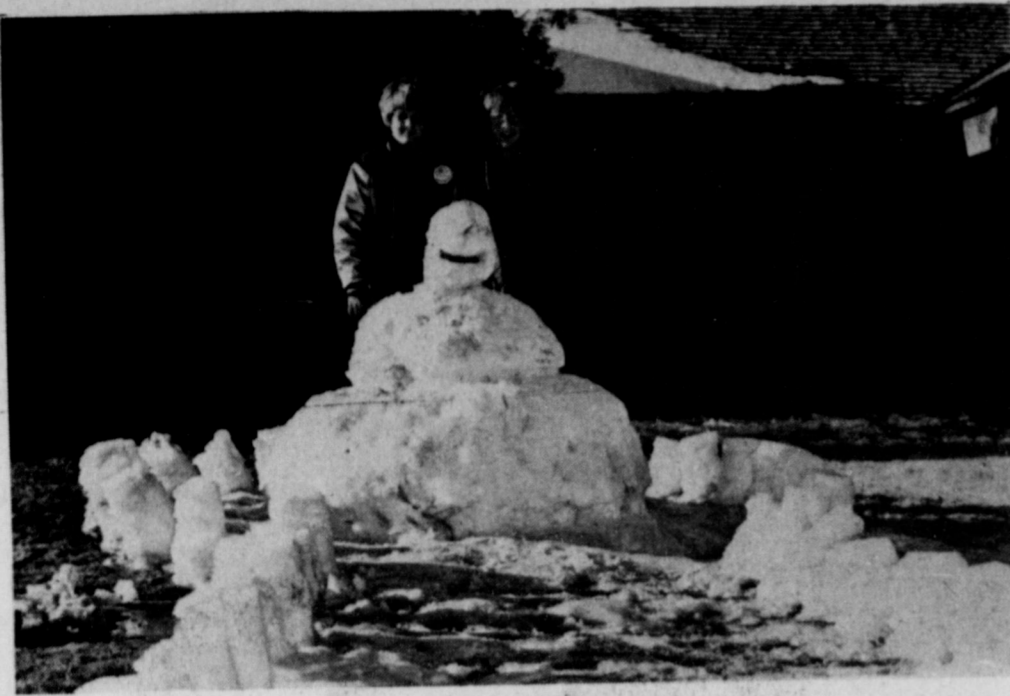

Friona showed an eight percent increase for this year with a tax rebate check of \$11,569.22 for December of this year, compared to last year's December check of \$9,910.63. The December rebate raised the city's toll to \$71,828.13 for the year to date, and a total of \$66,302.38 for the same time last year.

Houston's check this reporting period was \$15.8 million raising the city's total for the year to \$97.2 million, up nine percent over 1978.

The city of Dallas received \$8.6 million, raising the city's total for the year to \$55.3 million, up 10 percent over the 1978 total.

cal portion of the audit report, the city was incorporated in 1926 and voted the home rule charter on July 5, 1960.

Muleshoe is five square miles, with 25 linear miles of paved streets and four linear miles of unpaved streets.

There is one mile of storm sewer in the city, along with 29 linear miles of sewers.

The one fire station in Muleshoe has 35 volunteer firemen and nine city police officers operate from the police station. Muleshoe also has four city parks which are developed, with 130 acres encompassed in the parks.

There is one golf course and one public and one private swimming pool.

In 1974-75, a total of 22 Building permits were issued and for the first six months of 1979, 39 building permits were issued.

In the last general election (1979) 1,573 votes were cast and in the 1979 city election, 273 voters went to the polls.

In other action, the city council approved a resolution to continue taxing automobiles. However, the former eight year taxation was reduced, and only automobiles four years old and newer will be taxed in the future.

The December city allocations of the local option sales tax don't reflect purchases by Christmas or holiday shoppers since returns covering these periods are not due until after the first of the year.
