## Muleshoe investigates another homicide

For the second time in a six-week period, local law enforcement officers have responded to the scene of a homicide.

On the morning of Friday, Aug. 13, at 6:40 a.m., Muleshoe Patrolman Jared King responded to a 911 report of an assault at 1802 W. American Blvd., and discovered the body of Muleshoe resident Benny Martinez Sr., 42, inside the house.


### Gridiron ballet...

Morton fell to ninth place in the monthly totals, with a drop of 6.32 percent, and Olton's 7.38 percent placing it last.

In actual sales of the communities for 2010, while Muleshoe has received \$353,763.24, a decrease of \$17,953.54.

August sales tax allocations represent sales taxes collected in Iune by businesses that file sales taxes monthly, and sales taxes collected in April, May and June by quarterly filers, and reported to the state in July.

According to the state comptroller's office, state sales tax revenue in July was \$1.69 billion, up 2.2 percent compared to one year ago.

The comptroller's office will send \$556.3 million in August sales tax allocations to local governments, up 2.3 percent compared to August 2009. So far this calendar year, sales tax allocations to local governments are down 2.5 percent compared to this time last year, according to information received from the comptroller's office.

Sales tax payments of \$375.5 million were sent to Texas cities, up 2.2 percent compared to last August. Calendar year-to-date, city sales tax revenues trail 2009 by 2.2 percent. Sales tax payments of \$33.7 million will go to Texas counties, 0.2 percent below last August. So far in calendar year 2010, county sales tax allocations are down 5.6 percent compared to last year.

## Research shows drip irrigation a good fit in some areas

By Kay Ledbetter

Interest in drip irrigation is growing throughout the High Plains as regions within it run short on water supplies and producers look for economical ways to continue efficient production.

"We want everyone to find out where drip fits, because where it fits, it fits very well," said Nich Kenny, Texas AgriLife Extension Service irrigation specialist, speaking at a field day on the Durwood Dunlap farm near Pampa. "In some cases, it lets you do a lot more with a lot less."

Kenny is the first to say the pressurized irrigation method that is situated below the soil surface may not fit everywhere.

But the series of filters, valves, tubing, emitters and pipelines can deliver water, nutrients and chemicals throughout a field with several advantages over pivot irrigation.
