

REVIVING THE FUGITIVE SLAVE

Houston Chronicle:

More and more amazing reports come from Lawrence, Mass., concerning the methods pursued by local and state officials at the behest of wool trust bosses who are trying to force an army of women and children mill workers to accept further reduction of starvation wages.

We are told that these Russianized public officials declare their pur pose not only to prevent forcibly, the sending of children from Lawrence to other cities where they are guar anteed food and shelter, but have further declared their purpose to go into Vermont, New York and Pennsylvania and bring back several hun dred children who have been sent away by their parents for such protection against starvation.






