Monroe, manager for the State Highway Department for this district, that the contract struction company of Eastland to resurface Highway No. 7. This resurfacing will be of asphalt on the graveled portion. This, when completed, will make one of the best highways to be found in West Texas. This road will run from county line to county line and is the road that is now known as our highway. The State Highway Commission has designated the road from Roby through the county to connect with the Borden county line, State Highway No. 83. The Commission will regrade this road and build all necessary drainage structures to put the road up in first class shape.
