CATTLE

A very moderate Tuesday supply of cattle was reported in slight this morning. South St. Joseph had around 1,500 head, all told, and five leading points totaled only 18,000, yet, with a big sale stock in Chicago, held over from the Monday glut at that point, the number of cattle actually on sale at the five markets was much larger than morning bulletins indicated. Of the small supply here there was a fair proportion of steers that were mostly of common to medium beef style, only a few loads of passable good beefs being seen. The demand was of a slack and indifferent character with prices not better than a very weak on the Monday level or a shade lower than the close last week. The best steers here were of the fairly fat, medium weight style that sell around \$4.75-\$5.00 with the bulk of ordinary to fair light to medium weight steers going at \$3.80-\$4.00; common light killers were slow sale except where quality was good enough to attract competition from the feeder trade.

COVS, BULLS AND MIXED.

In the butcher line the proportion of attractive cows and heifers was very small and there was rather better show of life than was noted in the steer trade. Buyers were looking the field over at a reasonably early hour and sellers were able to establish and sustain a fairly active trade on a steady level of prices. A good clearance of useful stock was made at a range of \$2.50-\$3.00 for the bulk of useful killers, with strictly good to choice lots quotable at \$3.25-\$4.00 and some very prime, fat, corn-fed types quotable at around \$4.25. In the canner line there was not much show of life but prices were unchanged at a range of about \$1.40-\$2.40 for fat old heifers up to good strong extras. Bulls steady and in fair inquiry. Calf supply light and prices steady with strictly top veals quotable up to \$6.35.

MONEY IS NOT A CURIOSITY

SKIPS AND CULLS.

Normal beef prices have not changed much in the last two years, says the National Provisioner, if prices have moved up and down it is because the grade of the meat has gone up and down. No one expects to get all prime beef at such prices as are paid for what the trade knows as short-fed stuff. And no one expects to buy blue ribbon show beef, upon which science has expended its best energy, at the price paid for the best quality of commercial corn-fed native carcasses. Taking ordinary stuff as a proper level of beef prices, a careful search among the market quotations will show that the packer has not sensibly departed from this level, whatever swing there has been in the run and prices of cattle. This is a curious fact, but it is true.

Another man talking of this unequal distribution of receipts said: "The total Monday showing of cattle was not too large for a good market had the number been more equally distributed. It was piling up most of the cattle in Chicago that caused the break in prices."

Some days ago a local cattle trader remarked to the Journal that he thought the market would see very few good fat cattle during the first two or three months of the new year. Of course the receipts of one day cannot be taken as a criterion but the first market day of the new year saw the poorest lot of cattle that has been here for several weeks.

The National Provisioner looks for a more active trade in hog products in the near future.

British cables yesterday reported a sharp break in the London and Liverpool markets for American hives that will perhaps be reflected in the market for export cattle of the immediate future.

Fort Collins, Colo. Courier. The snar factory has been compelled to turn away 25,000 head of sheep and 2,500 head of cattle, because this year's supply of pulp had all been contracted and is now being fed out and near the factory grounds. There are now on a pulp and alfalfa ration on the factory grounds and in pens near by, 17,000 sheep and lambs and 2,500 head of cattle. Several shipments of sheep and cattle, fattened on pulp and alfalfa, have been made from the factory feeding pens within the past few days, on which the returns were very satisfactory.

"While those Chicago fellows are about for a 'five day' cattle market," said a South St. Joseph live stock man, "it would not hurt the country to see and ponder a little on the policy of putting three-fourths of its cattle on the Chicago market and striking one-fourth out along the river."

Mr. L. D. Padgett, of Beloit, Kan., was on today's sheep market with two carloads of 34-pound fed-Mexican lambs which sold for 70¢ per pound, which is the extreme top obtained for lambs here this season. Mr. Padgett expressed himself as well pleased with the price obtained on the South St. Joseph market.
