## Barracks Woman is Wounded When Stray Bullets Go Wild

A Sunday morning drinking party in a Spanish-American barracks house at a Goodland gin left a south Texas woman in a Morton hospital with two bullet holes in her leg and put a Latin-American man in Muleshoe jail.

He will be there throughout the winter months.

Deputy Sheriff Bob Henderson said the sheriff's office received a call from the Goodland barracks at 3:57 Sunday morning telling of a free-for-all fight that was in progress. When he arrived, two men were holding 20-year-old Adelfino Alenez Rayna who had been brandishing a rifle freely about the room. Henderson arrested Rayna and started back to Muleshoe.

Glen Williams and pleaded guilty to a charge of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

Mrs. Rosa who was asleep in a room near the drinking party apparently was hit twice by Rayna's stray bullets. One bullet entered the leg just above the knee and the other penetrated the leg just below the knee. No evidence of "intent" was shown in the trial.

Judge Williams sentenced Rayna to four months in jail and assessed a 50-and-costs fine.

## Officers Seeking 'Very Young Lad' For Auto Theft

Officers here are looking for "a very young lad," probably not more than 14 years old, Police Chief Carl Neely said Wednesday.

He's wanted for questioning in connection with a short-lived automobile theft when he went astray quickly last Saturday night.

"We don't know who the boy is," the chief said, "but we have a pretty good idea. Anyway, we know he is very young and probably not more than 14 years old."

The abortive car theft try was made Saturday night from in front of the Masonic Hall in downtown Muleshoe. A Falcon Station wagon owned by David Cunningham was driven away by a young thief.

City policeman Harold White gave chase, and a game of cops and robbers followed. He lost the young thief a time or two, but finally came face to face with the stolen automobile on a Muleshoe street. The driver stopped the car and fled on foot.

Cunningham's car apparently was none the worse for its short chase through downtown Muleshoe streets.

Mrs. Cunningham and her children were attending a Christmas party in Masonic hall. The young thief evidently "ceased" the area before making the attempted robbery. A youth believed to be the one who stole the car, visited with men outside the hall before making the attempt. He complained of having injured his foot in getting out of an automobile.

## Jaycees Seeking City's Backing For New Center

Muleshoe Jaycees presented their proposed community center project to two groups this week — the city council and the Muleshoe Rotary club.

Several of the Jaycees met with the council at that group's Monday session, and were told that the City of Muleshoe has some \$15,000 available for such a project. Then on Tuesday, the Jaycee President Kenneth Henry met with the Muleshoe Rotary club and again explained the proposal.

Henry said the club is studying a number of different community center plans, including center. He said the Jaycees had found "a very strong backing for our proposed community center," adding: "Many people feel this is the No. 1 need of Muleshoe right at this time."

The Jaycees endorsed the proposed community center program early this past summer after a survey which the organization had conducted pointed to a strong need for such a building.

Henry said many plans will be studied before any decision is reached. He pointed out that Hereford's center, for example, "from small to large, providing meeting places for a number of meetings all at the same time."

### Farmers Home Is Reorganized

### Christmas Time Home Safety Check Urged

Will you have small children visiting you this Christmas? Better check and see if your home is safe for them, advises Mrs. Patsy R. Yates, Texas A&M University Extension specialist in family life education.

For example, have you put matches and household poisons out of reach? Are the aerosol spray cans safely stashed away — in a locked container out of reach of the small fry? What about aspirins and other medicines? These, too, should be kept away from small children.

Paints, detergents, alcohol and household bleaches are potential hazards for small children who are exploring a strange house. Store these where little

hands can't find them. Scissors, pins and plastic bags should be added to the list of hazards that flame attract small children. An adult should supervise a child playing around a tree, or the room should be closed so small children cannot enter when adults are not there to supervise.

If older people will be among your house guests this holiday season, consider safety features for their rooms. You may save them a nasty fall if you arrange the rooms so that they can reach a light from the bed. Keep a night light on in the bathroom or hallway.

Plan your holiday baking, shopping and gift wrapping so that you won't be hurried at the last minute. Falls, cuts and burns are the most frequent injuries received at home. All of these are more apt to occur if you are tired or in a hurry. Mrs. Yates recommends that you allow ample time for each task you are doing — in order to have an accident-free holiday.

### Quickie Meals Speed Christmas Cooking Routine

You can add more time for needed holiday shopping and other activities by including more quick-to-fix and convenience foods in your pre-Christmas menus, says Mrs. Gwendolyn Clyatt, Texas A&M University Extension consumer marketing specialist.

Plan ahead, follow food supply information and shop wisely to get the most for your food dollars, she advises.

Canned ham is a real convenience for entertaining during the holiday season. Some of the small hams — under three pounds — are sterilized and usually can be stored at room temperatures. Check the label to determine whether or not they need refrigeration.

Dairy-ride eggnog and boiled custard have made their appearance on the market. There's a new low-calories eggnog made of skim milk. This may be just the thing for the weight-conscious. Provided, of course that you don't add extra calories one way or another, emphasizes Mrs. Clyatt.

A line of specialty spice blends is now available. The spices are combinations of flavorings necessary to season foods for which they are indicated. Blends include steak, beef, fish, Italian and French dressings. The back panel of each container has suggestions for use and recipes.

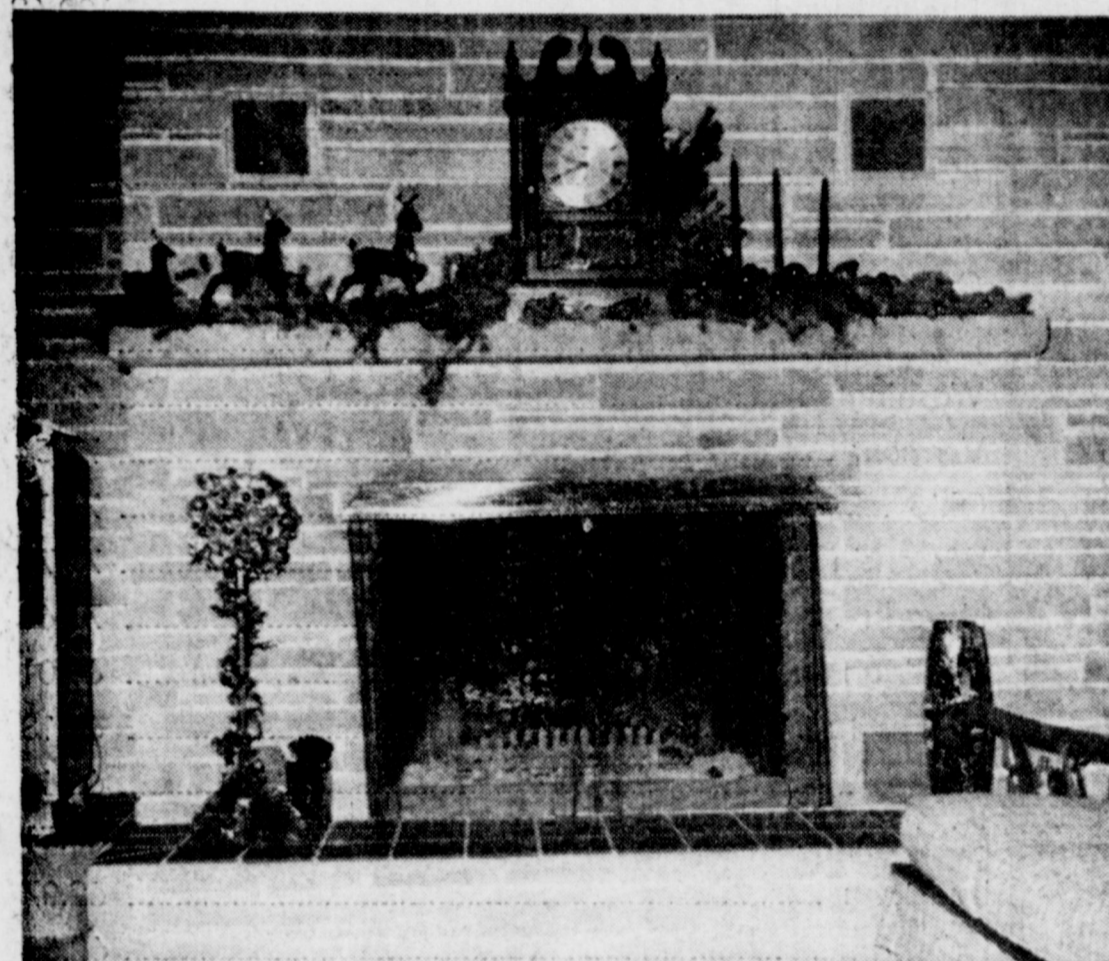

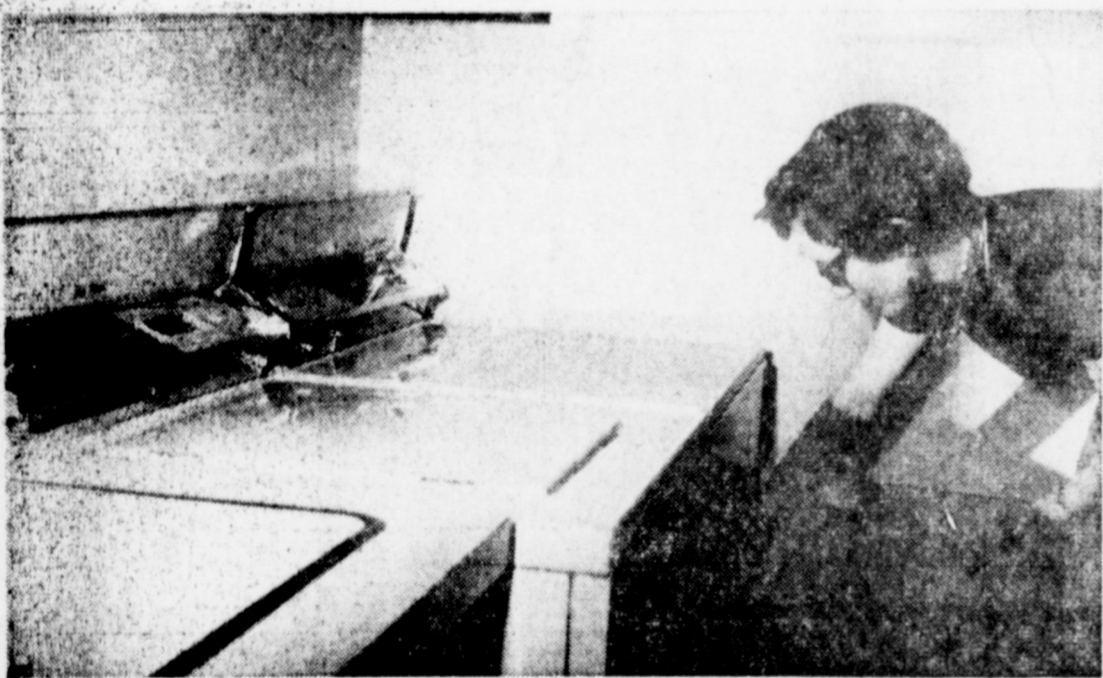

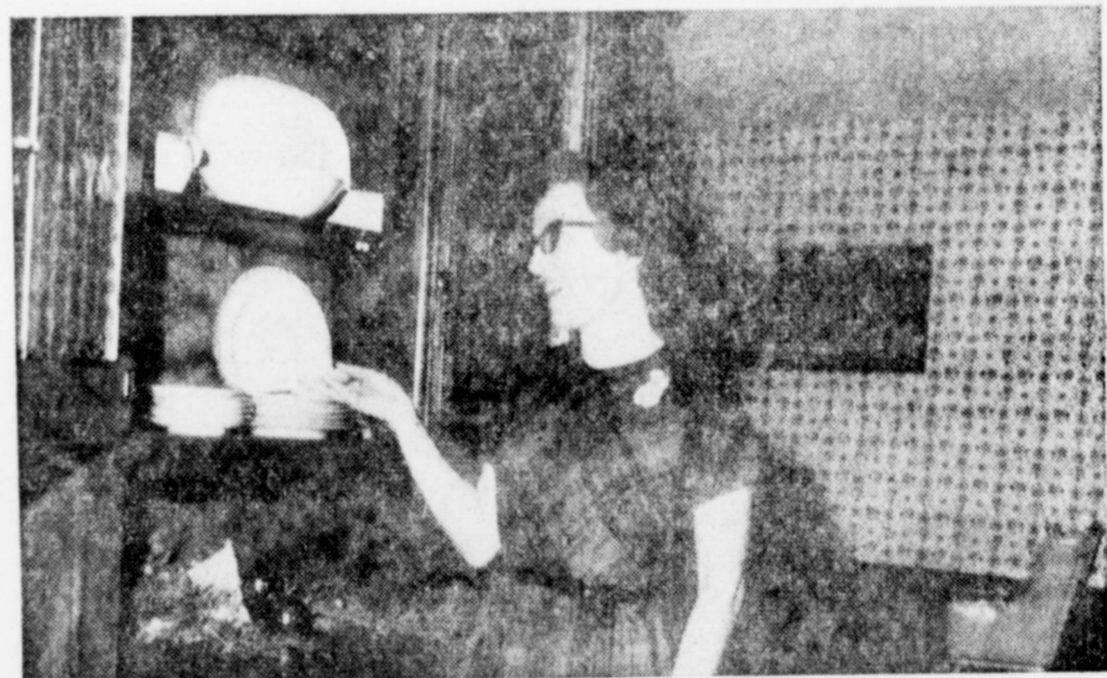

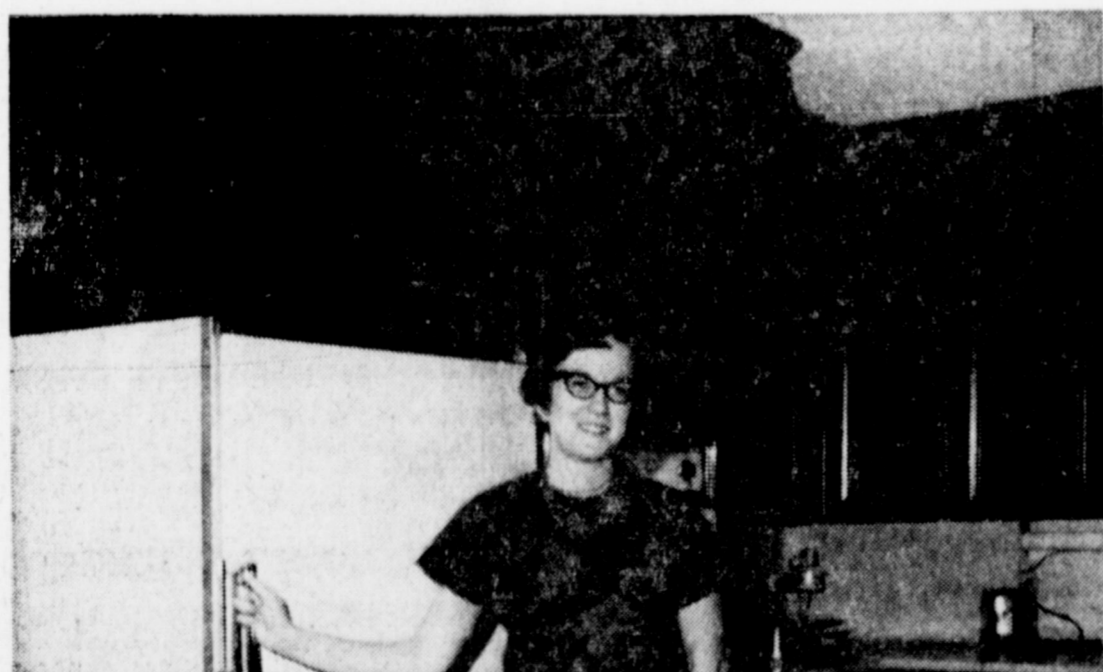

# Yarborough Reviews The Farm Program

By Se. Ralph Yarborough  
Recently, I reported to you on the major provisions of the new Farm Bill which is designed to provide more farm income in America. In addition to the parts of the bill covering the major crops of Texas, we were successful in having money appropriated for several projects in Texas that will improve life on our farms and ranches. Texas has the largest number of farms in the Nation with 224,000.

Great progress was made in Congress this year concerning the eradication of the screw-worm, a long-time plague to Texas cattlemen. The program of eradication, financed with 50-50 matching funds between the State and Federal government, will be continued. However, we were able to appropriate \$2,806,000 of Federal money for the maintenance of a "barrier zone" to protect those areas which have already eliminated George Mahon of Lubbock of the House Appropriations Committee was a vital factor in securing this fund. This money does not have to be matched

by State funds, and will minimize the eradication which will have to be continued in T. xas.

We also were successful in securing \$25,000 for planning the completion of the construction of the \$350,000 Southwest Great Plains Research Center in Bushland, near Amarillo. This center will do research in water and soil conservation.

Of great importance to the future of Texas' cotton crop was the appropriation of \$664,000 to build a cotton disease research laboratory at College Station, Texas. We also appropriated the money for a \$2,990,000 research laboratory at College Station to study the effects of pesticides.

The Great Plains conservation program, which includes 96 Texas counties, received approximately \$17,432,000. This program is of great benefit to those farming and ranching people who live in the 96 Great Plains Texas counties and must practice conservation to survive.

We also voted \$365 million for the Rural Electrification Administration, to continue the great programs of providing electricity to rural America, and an additional \$15 million to continue REA telephone loans.

The Farmers Home Administration loan programs were also continued. By the end of 1965 over 200 rural water systems in Texas had been granted construction loans — more than one-fourth of the 770 systems developed nation-wide.

All of these programs will bring major rewards to rural America in the future. Although the new Farm Bill we hope will help farm families' income immediately, the conservation, research, electricity and telephone programs are geared to improve the future of rural life so that it will occupy a favorable position in the Great Society.
