...NEW BOOK RELEASE! Dobson Uncovers New Sources of Scottish Ancestry. David Dobson, compiler of the ORIGINAL SCOTS COLONISTS OF EARLY

AMERICA, 1612-1783, has produced a new work which sheds additional light on our Scottish ancestors, SCOTTISH AMERICAN HEIRS, 1683-1883.

Mr. Dobson's latest book is based on a thorough investigation of a group of records known as the Services of Heirs, now housed at the Scottish Record Office. The Services of Heirs are records associated with an inquest held upon the death of a landowner in Scotland, and they provide reliable evidence of the relationship between deceased persons and their heirs. After combing through the entire Service of Heirs, Mr. Dobson has found 2,657 irrefutable relationships between deceased persons in Scotland and their heirs in America over the period of 1683-1883. For anyone still hoping to bridge the Atlantic to Scottish Ancestry, the links discovered in this little known source may be a godsend.

As a rule, the abstracts in SCOTTISH AMERICAN HEIRS, give, for the deceased, his name, occupation, residence in Scotland, date of inquest and relationship to heirs; for the heirs, name, occupation, place of residence in America, and relationship to deceased. The abstracts are arranged alphabetically by the name of the deceased, while all other names mentioned in the abstracts are listed in the index.

## Pecan Tree Spraying Time

It is time to gear up and get prepared to control the pecan nutcasebearer says Eastland County Extension Agent DeMarquis Gordon. Commercial pecan producers and homeowners with yard trees should begin checking trees closely for the insect egg deposits and nutlet damage by newly emerged larvae and begin a spray program if necessary.

Pecan nut casebearers are the small worms that eats into the small pecans, destroying entire clusters before they get started. If uncontrolled, they can destroy the entire crop.

Adult moths of the casebearers deposit eggs on the tips of the small pecans. The white eggs are not much larger than a pin point, says Gordon. Just before hatching the eggs turn pink or light red. After hatching the small worms feed on buds for two or three days before eating its way into the pecan.

Growers should spray five days after observing the first eggs or when 1% or 2% entries are found in the pecans. The agent says that effective pecan nut casebearer control depends on proper timing and application of insecticides.

The proper timing may vary throughout the county. Gordon predicts May 30 to June

4, as the probable effective spray dates in Eastland County. This is a few days later than the usual spray dates. Cool nighttime temperatures experienced during the last three weeks have delayed egg laying by the moths. Early maturing varieties may need spraying a few days earlier than the late maturing pecans.

Effective insecticides for commercial growers include Lorsban, Thiodan, Zolone, Malathion, Diazinon, Guthion, Ammo, Cymbush and Asana. Insecticides recommended for homeowners include Malathion, Diazinon, Zolone or Dursban. Zolone is no longer being made, but left over Zolone is still recommended.

Zinc should be added to the pecan spray. Due to the good soil moisture most pecan trees are making very nice luxuriant growth. In order to insure proper leaf development, the trees should receive timely application of zinc. In the yard, homeowners will need to use one of the liquid zinc products in order to prevent burn to other plants in the landscape. Commercial growers can use zinc sulfate or one of the many other products available.

## Thieves Face Danger When Looting Electric Substations

TU Electric has reported numerous thefts of copper ground wire from its substations and switching stations during the last several months. Thefts have been reported

in Archer, Young, Wise, Parker and Stephens Counties.

The thieves may not realize the dangers they face when they steal copper ground wire from the utility's facilities. "Any time ground wires are removed, and extremely dangerous situation can develop that can cause injury or death to anyone coming in contact with transformers or other ungrounded equipment," said John Berry, manager of TU Electric's Eastland district.

They not only risk injury to themselves and others, but they could also cause electrical interruptions, which is an inconvenience no customer

appreciates, he said.

Stealing from substations and switching stations, which could result in a third degree felony offense, is a widespread problem affecting not only TU Electric but other utilities as well.

TU Electric requests that you call Eastland Crime Stoppers, (817) 629-TIPS, if you see anyone other than an employee at any of its substations. "A reward will be given for information leading to the arrest and indictment of anyone who steals copper ground wire from our facilities," said Berry.

# County Commissioners Approve Annexation of Carbon School

Eastland County Commissioners Monday, May 21 approved the request of the Carbon Independent School District to be annexed into the Eastland School District.

The annexation is expected to take effect July 1, ending more than a hundred years of public school in Carbon. The first school in Carbon was established July 29, 1884.

At Monday's called meeting Billy Bacon, Commissioner of Pct. 4, made the motion to approve the request for annexation. L.T. Owen, Comm. of Pct. 3, gave a Second to the motion. Comms. Robinson, Pct. 1, and Christian, Pct. 2 also approved the request, making the vote 4-0.

This action followed about thirty minutes of discussion between the Commissioners, representatives of the Carbon school district, the Eastland School, Rising Star, and others present.

From Austin was Dr. Pat Pringle, a monitor from the Texas Education Agency, and Attorney Cuddy Caputo, who represented Carbon ISD.

Pringle reviewed problems found in the Carbon system, which he said had caused him to be appointed to seek solutions for the school. He listed declining enrollment as a main problem, but said he had also been concerned about student performance, curriculum development, and teacher certification is advanced math and science.

On April 19 the Carbon School Board voted to keep the grade school but to contract students in grades 7-12 to Eastland and Gorman. Two more surveys of enrollment caused the Board - with four new members - to reconsider the April decision, Pringle said.

On May 15 the School Board voted 4-1 to rescind the April 19 action and annex all grades in to the Eastland District.

The legality of the annexation was discussed by the Attorney for the Carbon School, with comments by District Attorney Emory Walton and Judge Scott Bailey. Carbon School Superintendent reported that 109 students were enrolled this year.

Attorney Caputo said that all property of the Carbon School District would become part of the Eastland District. He said that Carbon School has no indebtedness - that in fact, by State standards, it is considered a "rich" District. The District has a large area and tax base.

The Commissioners and other spoke of "fond memories" of Carbon School. Ray Kanady of Carbon asked about trophies, personal property and things of sentimental value.

Superintendent Keith Watkins of Eastland told the Court that the trophies and other mementoes would stay at the school for the community. He also said plans are being considered to use the buildings in some way involved with education.

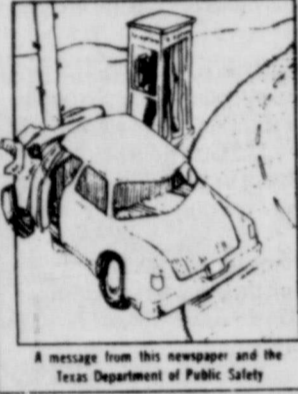

3. Start planning for your retirement now. If you don't have a company pension plan—and even if you do—you might want to think about starting an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). You can put in up to \$2,000 a year and if you don't have a company pension plan, it's tax-deductible.

### Protection Pointers

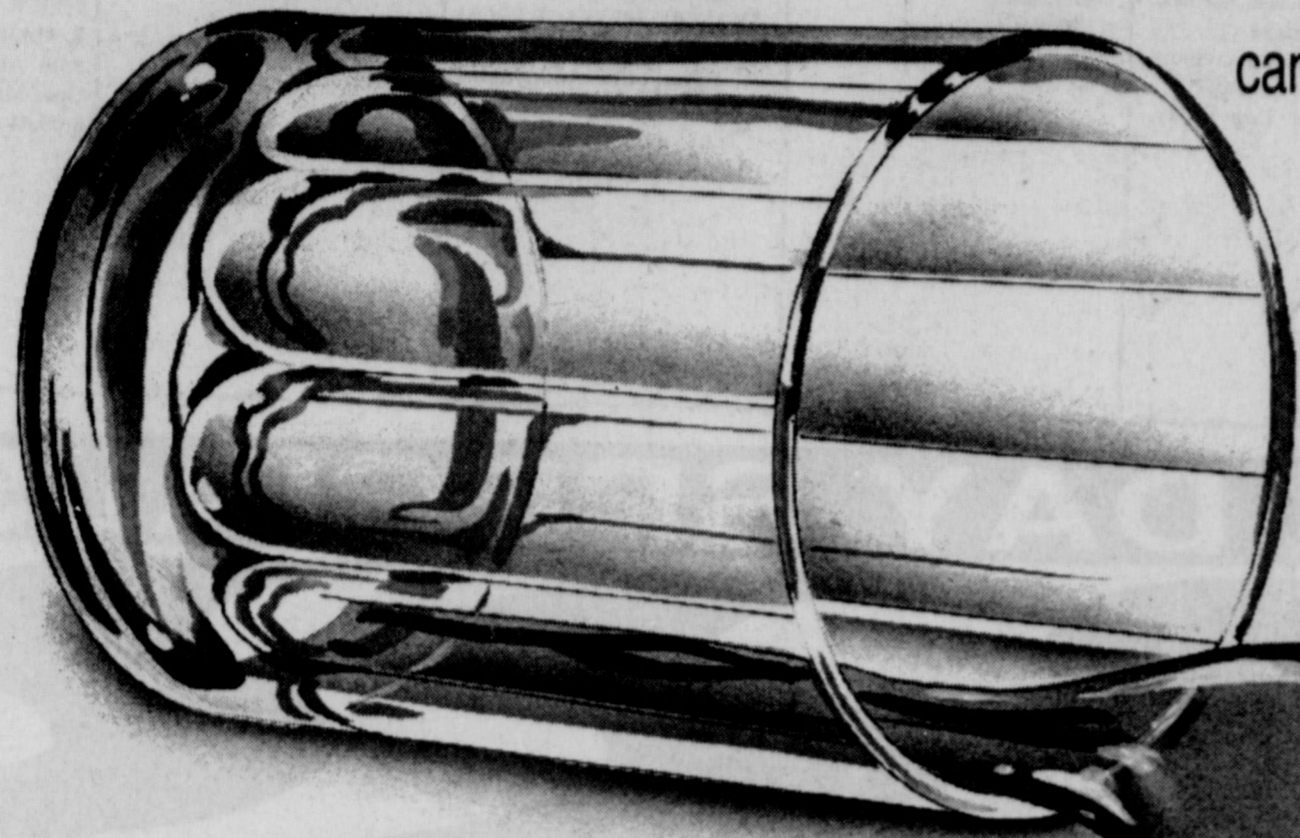
Q. What can I do to protect my teeth from injury?

A. The most important protection you can provide for your teeth is to refrain from using them as a "tool". Don't open bobby pins with your teeth. Don't bite thread from the spool, use scissors. Never crack nuts between your teeth, or bite down on hard candy. Avoid holding items such as nails, straight pins, pens or pencils with your teeth. Use dental floss as a toothpick with a rounded end to remove food stuck between your teeth; never use a pin or other sharp object! Any of these "do's" can result in chipped or fractured teeth or fillings, and that means a visit to your dentist and a repair bill.

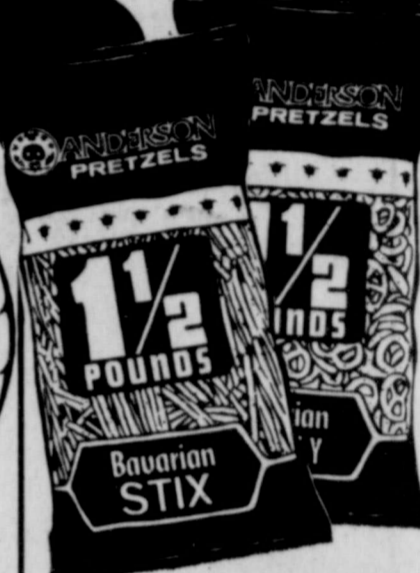
