Mrs. D. C. Duck was taken to Central Plains Hospital in Plainview Friday, where it was determined she was suffering from a viral infection.

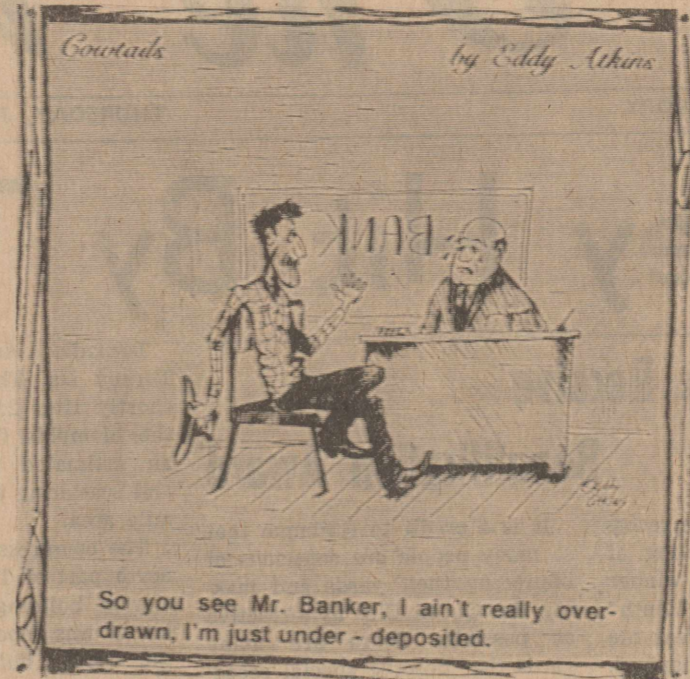

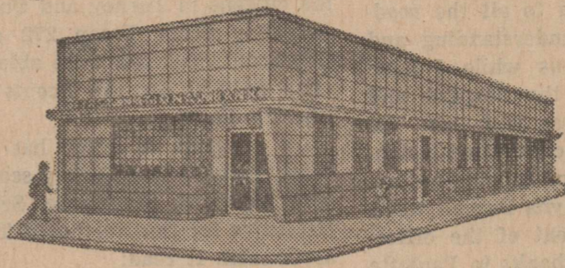
