





PRESS STATEMENT OF SENATOR TOM CONNALLY

Last July we approved the ratification of the United Nations Chartes by the overwhelming vote of 29-2. By that act we gave our solemn pledge to cooperate whole-heartedly with the United Nations in the difficult job of maintaining world peace. The legislation now before the Senate and the House constitutes the first important step in making possible the close coltaboration of our government with the new organization.

It is my hope that the Senate will act speedily and decisively. In this turbulent and war-torn world it is imperative that we in the United States demonstrate beyond any shadow of doubt our willingness to cooperate in every possible way to keep the peace.

The most important section of the new bill would give the President the power to make available to the Security Council our quota of armed forces—a quota to be agreed upon later by the Congress—ressary for the President to refereach such case to Congress for approval.

This is exactly as it should be. The Security Council must have

Bitter experience has shown that there is one place where we dare not temporize. The Security Council is one agency which we cannot afford to hamper. The bill would also bestow upon the President the power to join with the other United Nations in applying enforcement measures of armed force. Here again the Security Council must be in a position to act quickly and decisively. By taking prompt action in the application of diplomatic and economic sanctions we may be able to frighten alw-breakers into the paths of peace and thus avoid more drastic enforcement measures.


