## 21 killed, 35 injured in nursing home blaze

MISSISSAUGA, Ontario (AP) -
Twenty-one people were killed and 35

housed, police said. Initial reports indicated a careless smoter

died of smoke inhalation and extreme heat . "The smoke was very heave
