The disease, a rare form of amebic meningoencephatitis, is caused by
amoeba, organisms which are found in lakes, ponds, the air and soil. The microbes are ubicuitous, occurring throughout the world, but the
infections are exceedingly rare, said Dr. G. Alexander Carden, a medical
