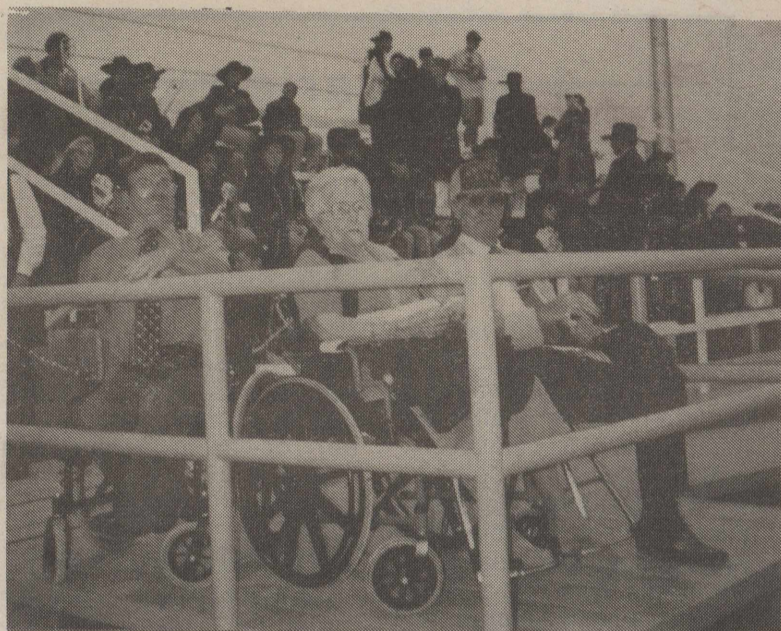

Shannon schedules PA recruiter

Shannon Health System invites anyone interested in becoming a physician assistant to a meeting Tuesday, October 21, at Shannon Women's & Children's Center, 201 East Harris, San Angelo, (downtown campus).

Gene Jones, Ph.D., director of the Dallas-based University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center's physician assistant program, will make presentations from 1 to 2 pm and 4 to 5 pm in the first floor auditorium. He will be available for individual consultation from 2 to 4 pm. The public is invited to attend.

Shannon and UT Southwestern signed an agreement in 1995 to support the physician assistant program and to encourage an affiliation with Shannon which depends heavily on physician assistants to staff its rural health clinics. Dr. Jones said the upcoming program will give UT Southwestern the opportunity to get more students into rural areas and prepare them for that kind of practice.

Currently, Shannon employs physician assistants in Ballinger, Brady, Bronte, Eldorado, Menard, Ozona, Robert Lee and Sterling City. The Shannon/UT Southwestern agreement helps recruit more West Texas students who are attracted by opportunities to study close to home and who will want to return after graduation. As part of the agreement, US Southwestern will "strongly consider" applications from qualified prospective students living within Shannon's service area of greater West Texas. The competition is notably rigorous: in a recent semester, 45 students were selected from 852 applicants.

Deadline for admission to the UTSW program is November 15. Classes begin in May 1998.

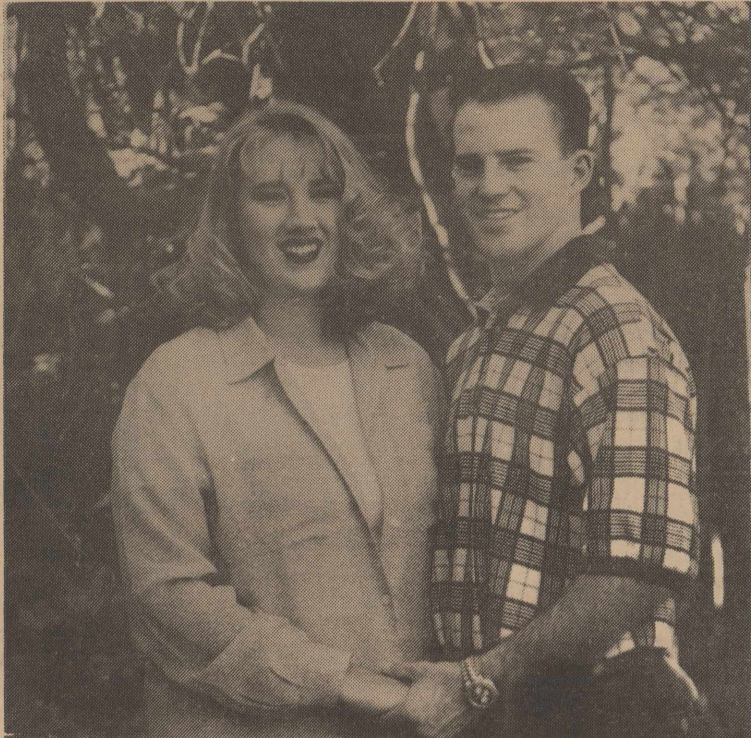

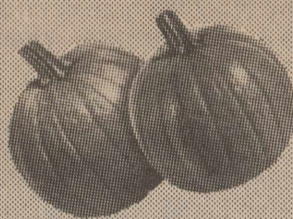
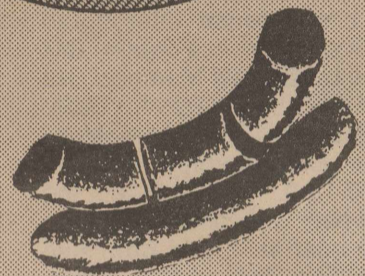

The Bronte Longhorns battled the Water Valley Wildcats in Bronte's 1997 Homecoming game. This was a big win for the Horns, tying their district record at 1-1.

The Longhorns started out with a big defensive play when Jerrod McClure intercepted the Wildcat pass. This set the tempo for the Horns. With 7:34 left in the 1st, Dustin Scott scored on an 18 yard run. The score was 7-0 after Blake McKee kicked the extra point. On the next Wildcat possession, Bronte's dynamite defense intercepted Vick's pass once again, this time by Michael Martinez. He ran it back 65 yards for Bronte's second TD. After McKee's extra point, the score read 14-0. The Horns got the ball back one more time in the 1st quarter. The offensive line, Trey Holland, Billy Arthur, Blake McKee, Jake Graves, and Chris Keller, opened up a big hole, allowing Martinez to scramble outside and score another TD.

Bronte began the 2nd quarter with a 20-0 lead. The Wildcats' defense put up a heart-felt fight, holding the Horns until the end of the quarter. With 46 seconds left, Michael Sallee rushed 2 yards for the only touchdown in the 2nd. The PAT failed leaving the

score 26-0.

With 9:41 left in the 3rd, Sallee ran 33 yards to score the 5th TD for the Longhorns. The 2 point conversion attempted by Daniel DeLaCerde failed. The Wildcats came back and scored their first and only TD with 5:38 on the clock. The 11 yard pass from M. Vick scored the points, but their conversion attempt failed. With a little over 2 minutes left in the 3rd, the Horns managed to break through and victoriously score again. Scott ran the ball 27 yards across the goal. The kick by McKee was successful. Bronte's defense held the Cats back to end the score for the 3rd: Longhorns 39 - Wildcats 6.

In the 4th quarter, the Longhorns continued to pummel the Wildcats. To top off the win, Rodney Adams snatched an interception. Jerrod McClure scored the only TD of the quarter on a 20 yard quarterback keeper. Bronte's defense played well throughout the game, and thus held the Wildcats scoreless in the 4th quarter. Final score 46-6.

This game was a good recovery for the Longhorns after a disappointing loss to Sterling City. We encourage everyone to come out and support the Horns in this week's game against the Miles Bulldogs. Hopefully, the successful Homecoming game was the beginning of a winning streak that will continue throughout the season.

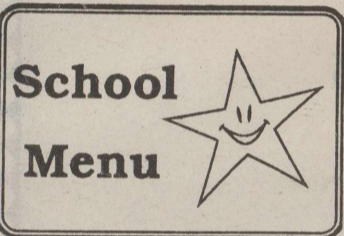

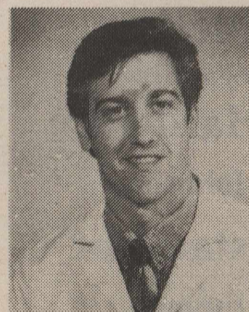

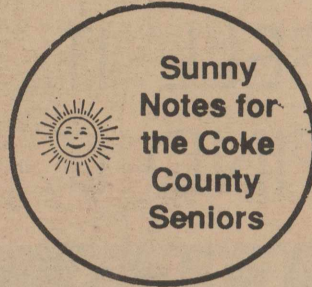

How To Stop An Angina Attack

Take short-acting nitroglycerin tablets or spray for fast angina relief. One spray equals one under-the-tongue tablet. Always keep a fresh supply of tablets with you and avoid exposing them to heat or light. Follow these steps:

1. Sit down before you take the nitroglycerin. The medicine may make you feel dizzy.
2. Place a tablet under your tongue or spray once inside your cheek. Let the tablet dissolve completely. (If you swallow the tablet it won't work.)
3. Wait 5 minutes. If you still have angina, take a second tablet or spray.
4. Wait another 5 minutes. If the angina still has not gone away, take a third tablet or spray.
5. If your angina lasts longer than 15 minutes, and 3 doses of nitroglycerin offer no relief, call for emergency medical help. You may be having a heart attack.

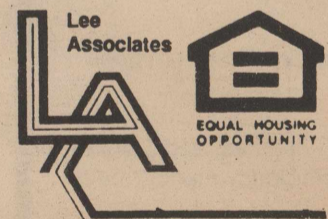

Stopping winter weed and grasses

Most annual winter grasses and weeds that plague lawns in late winter and early spring are ready to germinate now. The best way to stop them in the lawn is to apply a pre-emergence herbicide promptly, before their seeds germinate.

One of the worst pest plants that needs to be targeted now is henbit - a common lawn invader that brightens up the lawn with blue, but seldom appreciated blossoms in late winter and early spring. Winter grasses, including winter rye, also germinate now. Most of our most beautiful spring wildflowers also sprout in the fall and need to be targeted now if they are considered to be "weeds" in a well manicured lawn.

Pre-emergence herbicides are chemicals that kill weed seedlings as they germinate. They are ineffective against weeds and grasses once they grow beyond the seedling stage. Apply a pre-emergent herbicide as a uniform, broadcast treatment to problem areas of the lawn. At least 1/2 inch of water - irrigation or rain - is needed after application to move the herbicide into the soil where it is activated.

Labeled pre-emergence herbicides for lawns include XL, Betasan, Balan, and Princep. All of these materials will do a reasonably good job of stopping winter weeds and grasses if applied accurately and in time.

All of these herbicides are available in granular formulations while Betasan, Princep and other pre-emergence herbicides labeled for lawn use also are formulated for spray application. Most home gardeners can do a more accurate job by using a granular formulation and broadcasting it as they would fertilizer. Spray application of a pre-emergence herbicide should be attempted only if you have a sprayer that is capable of applying a uniform, blanket

The sprayer also must be accurately calibrated.

Read and follow herbicide label directions carefully. Under application can result in no weed control while over application may risk damage to the lawn.

Remember that pre-emergence herbicides cannot distinguish "good seed" from "bad seed". Do not use them in a lawn or garden where herbicide breakdown varies. Balan deteriorates rapidly and seed can be planted within two months after application, while XL deteriorates slowly and can prevent seed germination as long as a year after application.
