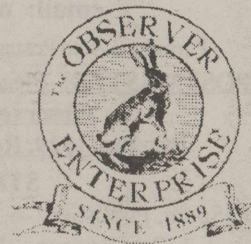

Regular filing deadline passes in local elections

Monday, March 8, 2010, was the last day to file for a place on a number of local entity ballots. These local entities include the cities of Robert Lee and Bronte, Bronte ISD, Robert Lee ISD, West Coke County Hospital District and East Coke County Hospital District. The elections are slated for Saturday, May 8, 2010.

City of Bronte

The Mayor and three councilmembers for two-year terms to the Bronte City Council will be determined in this election. The terms of Mayor Gerald Sandusky, Councilmember Jim Guthrie, Councilmember Buzz Gohman and Councilmember Jennifer Stango will expire.

Mayor Sandusky, and Councilmembers Guthrie, Gohman and Stango have filed for re-election.

City of Robert Lee

Candidate applications are available for Mayor and two places on the Robert Lee City Council.

Council member John Jacobs has filed to run for the office of Mayor. Also filing for the Mayor's office is Manual Abalos. Bill Torres, Richard Johnson, Sid Burns, and Jeanette Meeks have filed for council member seats.

West Coke County Hospital District

Three two-year terms are expiring for West Coke County Hospital District's Board of Trustees. These are the terms of Mike Lomas, Marilyn White, and Pat Stephens. Mr. Lomas, Mrs. Stephens and Mrs. White have filed for re-election.

East Coke County Hospital District

East Coke County Hospital District residents will need to elect three board members for two-year terms. The term of Ronald Mark Duncan, and unexpired terms for Beverly Sims and Nancy Cooper are open. All three incumbent trustees have filed for re-election.

Bronte Independent School District

The Board of Trustees for Bronte Independent School District will have two three-year terms on the ballot. The terms of Quinda Feil-Duncan and Shane Kelton are expiring. Mr. Kelton and Mrs. Duncan have filed for re-election. Fred Thomas, Jeanna Lee, and Kay Styles have also filed.

Robert Lee Independent School District

Robert Lee ISD will need to elect two trustees. The 3 year terms of Kevin Roe and Tod Reed are expiring. Tod Reed has filed for re-election. Beverly Sinclair has filed for the election.

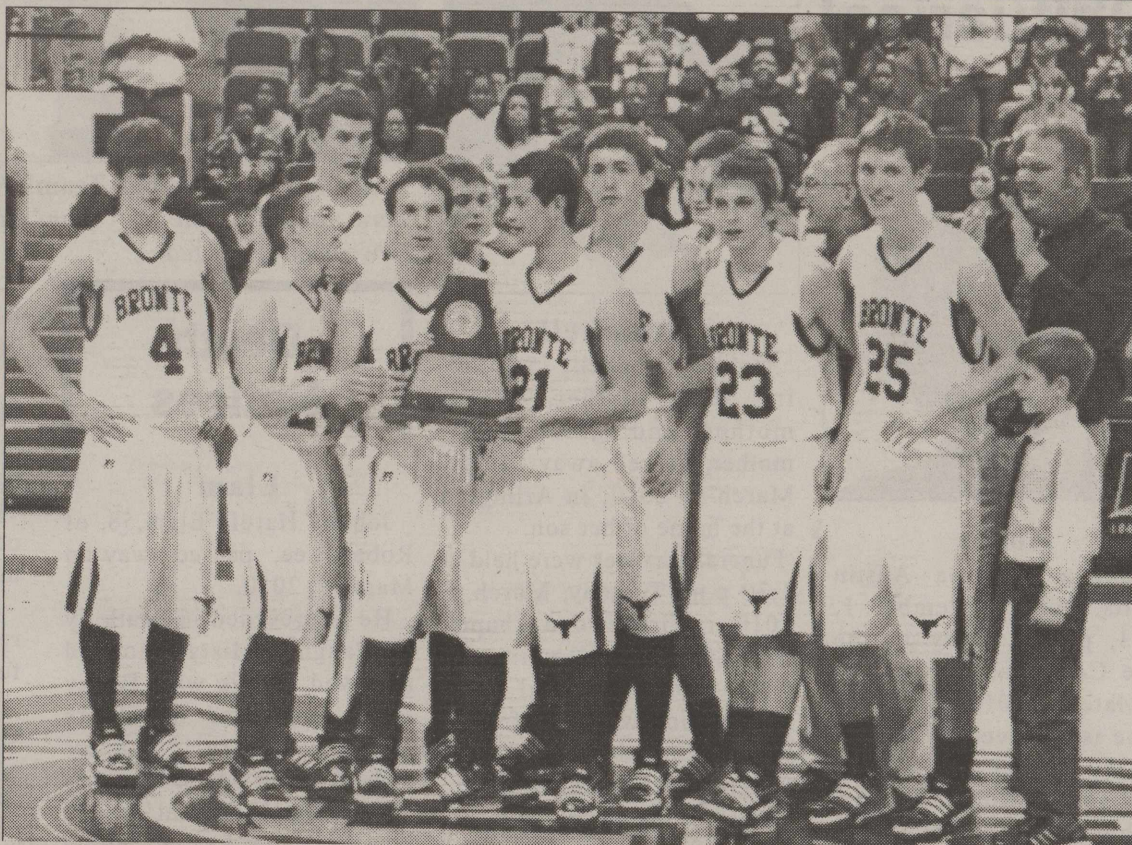
Coke County Roping Club meeting set

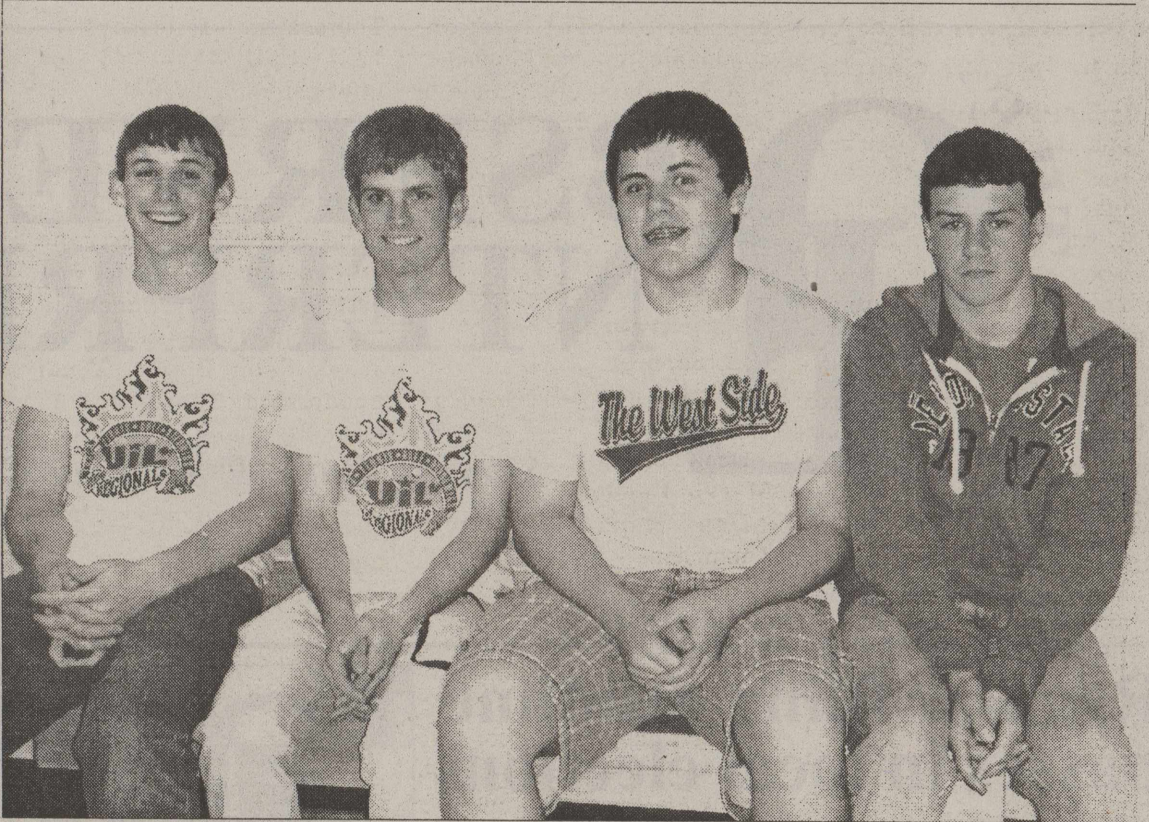

Census representative to be in Coke County for applicant testing

The U.S. Census 2010 representative will be in Coke County on Thursday, March 18, at the Coke County Library at 10 am and again at 6 pm to accept job applications. Also, on Tuesday, March 23 job applications will be accepted at the Bronte City Hall at 10 am and again at 6 pm. A third opportunity will be available on Thursday, March 25, at 6 pm at the Coke County Library.

This part-time job pays \$10-plus an hour for training and canvassing. Applicants can test more than once if a passing score is not reached on the first try. Practice tests are available at the Library.

The U.S. Census helps determine representation, funding, state and federal office openings (and closings). The numbers also determine the services that represent the best in U.S. government. Conservation, crop insurance, Medicare, school lunches, CHIP, state certification of health workers, child support enforcement, postal operations and the military are just a few of the not-for-profit programs that serve ordinary people.

Youth Leadership Conference entry deadline April 30

The United States has the best economic structure and best form of government in the world. The legacy of the Texas Farm Bureau Youth Leadership Conference is teaching young people how they can become involved in the system.

Farm Bureau is once again looking for young men and women to attend the 2010 Youth Leadership Conference, scheduled for June 14-18 at Angelo State University in San Angelo.

Eligible students, who will be entering the 11th or 12th grade in August 2010, are selected by their county Farm Bureaus. Those students must possess good character and the desire to enhance their leadership skills. They should be in the upper 30 percent of their class scholastically. Students who have attended previous Youth Leadership Conferences are not eligible unless they have been selected as a junior counselor.

The topic of free enterprise, constitutional government, leadership, goal setting, family and self-awareness will be explored during the week-long seminar.

A student does not have to be a Farm Bureau member to attend the conference, but must become a member to compete in the Free Enterprise Speech Contest. The contest begins with giving five local speeches on free enterprise. This enables the entrant to be eligible for the district competition. The Free Enterprise Speech contest scholarships at the state level include \$4,000 for the winner, \$2,500 for the runner-up, \$1,500 each for the four finalists and \$1,000 each for the remaining seven district winners.

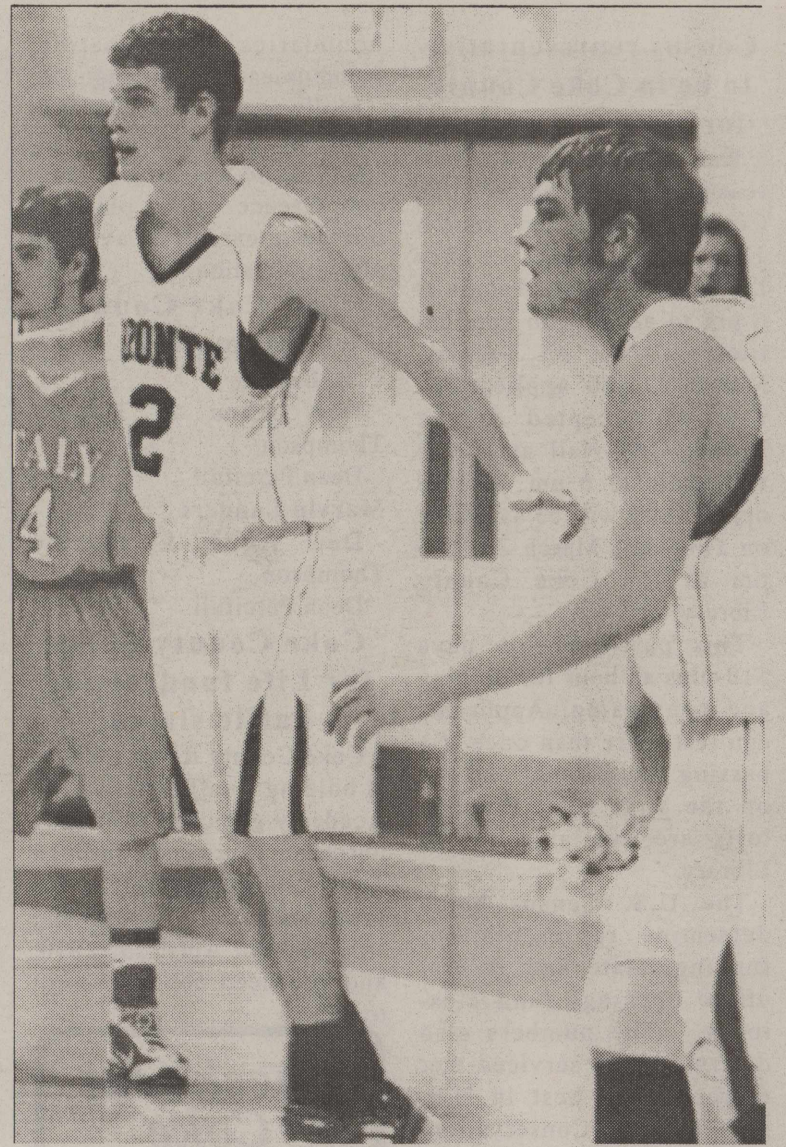

BISD Board meets in regular session

On February 15, 2010, the Bronte ISD Board of Trustees met at 7:09 pm for its regularly scheduled meeting.

Paul Williams opened the meeting with a prayer.

At 7:09 pm, the Board commenced its regular meeting. Those present were David McWright - President; Ericka Knight; Doug Tounget; Shane Kelton; and Paul Williams. Wayne Coalson and Quinda Feilduncan were absent. Also present were Alan Richey - Superintendent; Donna Poehls - Principal; and David Bedford - Principal.

The minutes of the January meeting were read and accepted. Shane Kelton made the motion to accept the January minutes. Ericka Knight seconded the motion. All voted for.

There were no audience items.

Donna Poehls informed the Board that the attendance for the Elementary School had dropped to 161, down 23 from the beginning of the school year. When asked why the enrollment had decreased, she stated that the lack of daycare and the lack of local jobs as contributing factors. David Bedford informed the Board that both the boys and girls had made the basketball playoffs and the One Act play was in progress. He also announced that John Dannheim had performed in the All State Symphony. Bedford also stated that the High School attendance was 101 and the

Junior High attendance was 49.

David McWright made the motion to approve the textbook adoptions per state regulations. Shane Kelton seconded the motion. All voted for.

The Orange team will compete in the San Angelo Classic this weekend (March 12 & 13) to be held at Bentwood & Riverside courses in San Angelo.

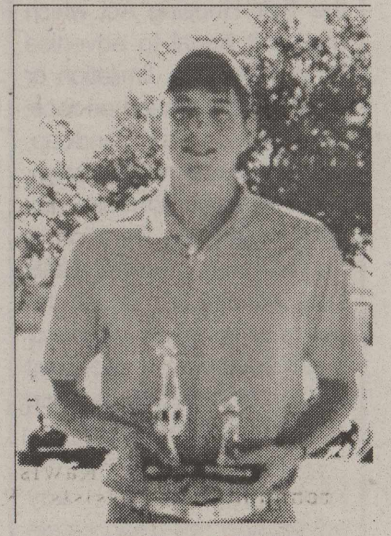

Ballot Proposition #2. Passed with nearly 92% of the vote, statewide.

Ballot Proposition #3. In addition to aggressively eliminating irresponsible federal spending, Congress should empower American citizens to stimulate the economy by Congress cutting federal income taxes for all federal taxpayers, rather than spending hundreds of billions of dollars on so-called "federal economic stimulus". Passed with over 93% of the vote, statewide.

Preventing grass tetany (Cow-Calf Nutrition)

Cows on pasture could be cows in trouble. As grass grows, it picks up many nutrients from the soil and can pass on many problems to cattle that eat it. One problem grazing cattle can pick up from pastures is grass tetany. Cattle affected are usually grazing cool-season grasses in cool, wet weather on soils with high levels of potassium and nitrogen.

Grass tetany usually appears in cows with nursing calves and also can occur when cows are just consuming new pasture growth. Grass tetany is a disease caused by low levels of magnesium in the blood of cattle. Characteristics of the disease include a stiff gait, paddling,

falling down, convulsions and death.

It occurs rapidly in cattle that appeared fine shortly before its onset. Treatment must be done quickly and includes giving magnesium and calcium intravenously to the affected cow.

You can prevent grass tetany by avoiding grazing in the types of pastures listed above and by supplementing magnesium. A magnesium level of 20 grams per day is recommended to avoid grass tetany.

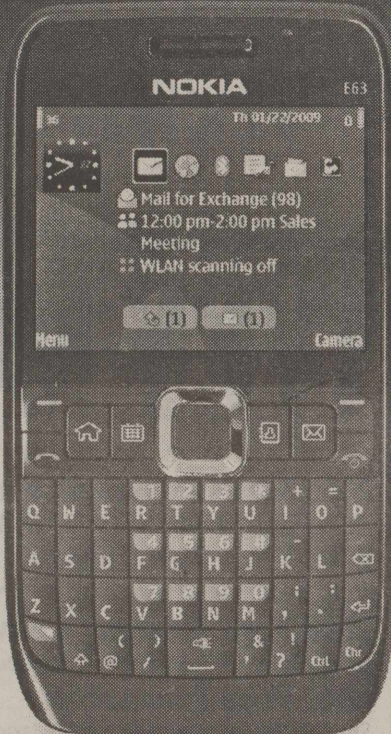

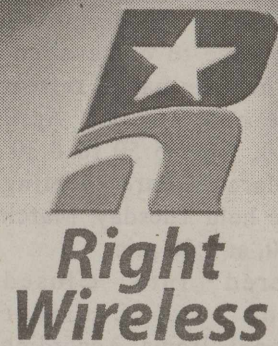
