WJ Mangold Hospital Offers Local Physical Therapy

The WJ. Mangold Memorial Hospital, together with the WJ. Mangold Memorial Hospital Fitness Center can fill your needs for doctor-prescribed physical therapy as well as any fitness goals you may want to achieve.

The Physical Therapy Department provides services at the hospital for patients, but also provides out-patient physical therapy to all ages and to a broad spectrum of diagnosis.

"We definitely work with people on their individual goals. If they need to walk up steps so they can go watch their grandchild graduate, that is what we focus on," said Delgado. "Whether is farming, and they need to be able to climb up on a tractor, or the have to be able to stand and curl hair all day, we will put together an individualized treatment."

Physical Therapist, Krys-

tal Delgado, expounded on the services the Center offers to individuals. "Post-surgical, chronic pain, low back pain, balance disorders, neurologic issues, post-CVA (post-stroke), wound care, vertigo and also sports rehab," she stated. "We've worked with infants to re-acquire lost muscle function, or to help them catch up to age appropriate development." With the younger patients, the work combines training, especially for the family. Playful exercises that encourage the use of motor skills are also utilized.

"My oldest patient was 104," shared Delgado. In most cases, minute muscle-movement repetitions are most effective. "Playing catch develops control of deceleration in the arm muscles and builds shoulder stability," added Delgado. "Or, simply picking up pennies builds accuracy in motor-skills."

Although physical therapy is most often prescribed post-

injury, the team at Mangold Memorial Hospital provides services that go beyond the surgery. "An athlete that comes to us after knee surgery may need to learn how to jump and land properly. It's not just

LOCKNEY- The haunting notes of TAPS filled the Floyd County Killed In Action (KIA) Memorial Park as attendees of this year's Memorial Day tribute looked on.

Members of the American Legion Post 141 led the ceremonies. Three wreaths were carried by individual members-one for Veterans lost in action, one for Police Officers lost in action, and one for Firefighters/First Responders lost in action. With the live-fire salute, the wreaths were placed in memory.

Four new memorials were recently added honoring fallen soldiers Cpl. Clinton W. Mitchell, Cpl. Timothy James Hartman, PFC George W. McGhee, and Tec5 Milton D. Zimmerman. Each of the memorials were dedicated by a reading of the serviceman's divisional information and the accounts of their deaths.

The names of all the KIAs from this area were read out loud. First those lost in WWI,

and then those killed in WWII. With each name, a somber 'bong' of the tolled bell could be heard throughout the community.

Brent Barker took the stand, reading a passage made famous by Virginia Taylor, "I am an American." Pastor Ricky Carstensen closed the memorial with a prayer.

Hannah Griffin Et Taylor Kirk - A Love Story Wedding

The magnificent stage was set, the majestic live music was playing, the lovely auditorium was filled to capacity with delightful guests - these, together with the presence of God's love, were the perfect components for the charming and unique love story of Hannah Rhea Griffin and Taylor Clay Kirk to officially embark on the second chapter of their lives. On Saturday, May 5, 2018, this new chapter began in the dreamy setting of the Floydada First Baptist Church sanctuary which offered a wondrous backdrop for the spectacular 6:00 p.m. wedding ceremony uniting the children of Dr. and Mrs. Randall Griffin of Floydada and Mr. and Mrs. Terry Kirk of Crosbyton. Honored to officiate the epic and fanciful event was uncle of the bride, Tim Burnham, of Shreveport, Louisiana.

The couple's vision for their early May ceremony was classic elegance with modern elements. This was achieved using the singular color of white, featuring clear décor and ornamentation accentuated with fresh greenery. Situated center stage was a towering 14' tall arch adorned with plush green vines, white floral sprays of hydrangeas and cascading wisteria. The arch held a large clear acrylic sign etched with the couple's initials that hung high above them to appear as if floating in air. Flanking the stunning arch were walls of sweeping white sheer draperies holding panels of abundant assorted white flowers overflowing from top to bottom. Flickering votive candles placed inside small orb terrariums were suspended in space using clear filament in front of the arch and side panels. A luxurious carpet of faux green turf was laid on stage for an added flora effect. White urns filled with voluminous matching white flowers and giant Boston ferns were sitting atop large white square columns of varying heights. These substantial columns were lovingly handmade by the bride's maternal grandfather, Dr. Ray Burnham. Lining the center aisle were handmade white crates filled with tall split-leafed palms and light pink hydrangeas bursting in full bloom. Inside each crate were white up-lights to emphasize each plant and help create a radiant path for the anticipated bride and her attendants.

The prelude music was performed by organist, Atha Sue, pianist, Penny Giesecke, both friends of the bride, and keyboardist, Gayla Griffin, Mother of the Bride. The trio presented a stupendous 40-minute overture of mostly classical pieces by composers such as Bach, Chopin, Beethoven, Schubert and Handel with a slight mix of modern composers including David Lanz, Jim Brickman, Yiruma, and Christina Perri. With a poignant musical contribution to her daughter's wedding, Gayla offered a solo keyboard performance of "Somewhere Out There" using soothing tones of solo piano with string orchestration. During the impressive prelude, a multitude of guests were seated by ushers Jonathan Burnham, Drew Burnham and Joshua Oden, all cousins of the bride, and also Cobey Robertson, Austin Marshall, both friends of the groom and Kirk Little, cousin of the groom. Kylee Smith, friend of the bride, welcomed guests at the gracefully decorated registration table which also displayed heirlooms

from the bride's parent's wedding back in 1982.

The reverent service began with the groom escorting his mother, Martha Kirk, into the sanctuary followed by the groom's father, Terry Kirk. Thereafter, the Mother of the Bride, Gayla Griffin, was escorted by her father, the bride's grandfather, Dr. Ray Burnham, to the song, "Heartsounds". Taylor's entourage included two Best Men: brother, Jordan Kirk of Idalou, and life-long friend, Keenan Henn of Crosbyton. Groomsmen were friend, Brent Turner of Canyon, and cousin Grant Little of Hallsville. All the men attendants looked debonair outfitted in tailored black suits, white shirts and black ties. Each attendant and the groom wore a boutonniere of fresh white roses with touches of eucalyptus and baby's breath. The handsome and stylish groom also sported a custom tailored black suit, black shirt and black tie. In addition to his polished style, Taylor also wore a very special black wooden watch engraved with a tender message, "Don't be late" and "5-5-18", gifted to him from his bride and delivered to him moments before the ceremony.

Hannah's devoted sisters, Rachel Griffin Brown of Wichita Falls, and Emily Griffin Howard of Huntersville, North Carolina, attended Hannah as her Matrons of Honor. Serving Hannah as bridesmaids were her life-long best friend, Avery Miller Pinkerton of Canyon, and good friend, Brittany Hall Marshall of Lubbock. All of her attendants wore a white halter style, form fitting short dress with an attached floor length sheer overskirt. An open back and wide delicate lace straps were gorgeous features to the attendants' dresses. Handmade lace drop earrings tipped with a single clear crystal were given to and worn by Hannah's bridal party.

"Prelude No. 1" by Bach with "Ave Maria" softly played as the bride's attendants, carrying full bouquets of white baby's breath with eucalyptus, processed into the lavish sanctuary. Accompanied to the song, "Return to the Heart" and on the arm of her father, Hannah was escorted down the softly lit aisle to her awaiting and loving groom. The stunning bride looked ravishing in her floor length, strapless sweetheart neckline gown. Purchased from her best friend's bridal boutique, Hannah's exquisite slim fitting gown was fabricated entirely of ivory lace that presented a slight trumpet style flair flowing into a wispy "eye lash" lace hem. Layered over the bodice of her figuresque dress was a matching and alluring lace topper with ¾ sleeves that transformed into lofty elegant sheer plumes. This visionary topper was fashioned with white pearl buttons along the back. The bride also wore a "borrowed" sheer fingertip length veil from her sister, Rachel, and it served as a flawless enhancement to Hannah's timeless and glamorous updo hairstyle. A bountiful collection of white roses, baby's breath and eucalyptus was the romantic composition of Hannah's exquisite bridal bouquet.

During the ceremony the couple delivered personal words of love and commitment to each other and also recited traditional vows followed by exchanging of rings. The inspiring wedding message was highlighted with a symbolic and profound candlelight service. After Hannah and

Taylor lit their individual candles from a pearl jeweled unity candle, they each turned to light the candle of their Best Man and Matron of Honor. They in turn shared their flame with the next attendant. All attendants exited the stage and proceeded to the aisle to light the candles of the guests while Hannah and Taylor stood center stage, hand in hand, in amazement as the auditorium steadily filled with hundreds of "love lights". The house lights were lowered adding to the splendor and holiness of the occasion. The officiant signaled for everyone to raise their candle and the bride and groom were genuinely touched at the captivating scene of the many friends and family who were there to witness and support their love story union. Adding to the enchanting candlelight service were the lovely vocal harmonies of Sydney Rieff and Andra Shugart, both friends of the bride, to the song, "Shine on Us". After scripture, prayers, the pronouncement, the Kiss, and the introduction of the couple, Hannah and Taylor began their recession. As they were exiting to the spirited song, "Celebration Fanfare", Taylor swept his beloved bride off her feet and while holding her in his arms gave her an adoring bonus kiss to end the precious and unforgettable ceremony. The classical piece "Rondeau" was played as guests departed the auditorium.

A wedding reception was hosted by the bride's parents in the expansive Fellowship Center at FBC and was generously filled with 8' tables lined end to end around the perimeter of the room with an inner rectangle in the same configuration to hold 420 seated guests. All the guest tables were dressed with white linen tablecloths and held hundreds of stemmed glassware vases with live evergreen cuttings that lined the table centers throughout the room. Small white votive candles placed between each evergreen-filled vase shed illumination to the clear acrylic ice crystals sprinkled about the tables creating a delicate touch of sparkle. White square lace placemats, precisely

placed silverware, drinkware and a welcome note on a clear acrylic card from the newlyweds were placed at every setting. Overflow seating for 52 additional guests were in nearby hallways and were decorated in like manner. Upon a raised and skirted stage in the center of the room, clear "ghost" chairs were used to ensure the spectacular tables for attendants and their spouses were none other than sensational. White lighted luminaries surrounded the stage and white columns holding large white topiary balls on green wreaths were stationed at each corner. The bridal party tables held large crystal candelabras and clear scripted carved acrylic name cards for each guest. A buffet of Baked Ziti and Chicken Alfredo, garlic bread, salad, and chocolate strawberries were served to all the guests. The bride's wedding cake was a four-layer masterpiece arranged upon a lighted glass block base with a mirrored platform. The high sheen white design was classic with lace accents and was flavored with traditional white vanilla and chocolate layers. A tall white lace tree embellished with clear crystal beads around a clear base was the perfect distinctive motif to complete the impeccable cake. Small accent lights were positioned to emphasize the intricate tree form, and as a reminder of their special day, the cake topper will be placed in a shadow box and displayed in the couple's home. Serving at the bridal table were Hannah's aunt, Beth Burnham, and two cousins, Katelyn Oden and Abbie Burnham.

The groom's table was decorated in "farm" themed décor and displayed multi-tiers of Taylor's favorite delicious dessert of a 4-layered pudding delight in small mason jars. Specialty coffees and flavorings were served at a nearby table which were massively popular as well. The coffee cups were decked with custom paper koozie bands with "Hannah & Taylor", "Sip, Sip Hooray", and "A Perfect Blend".

The wedding party was introduced and each made memorable dance move entrances into the joy-

ful room from under a 12' white billowy archway over the doorway which was home to dozens of white roses. The DJ rallied the guests to stand and clap to welcome Mr. and Mrs. Kirk. As the exuberant couple sashayed around the entire room they greeted and thanked their guests along the way to the song, "Shut Up and Dance with Me". They made their way to the dance area where they performed a delightful choreographed dance to the song, "All Around You" by Sturgill Simpson. The couple thoroughly entertained their guests with an engaging and brilliantly prepared performance, full of lifts and spins gamishing and worthy of much applause from the guest spectators.

The two Best Men gave heartwarming speeches that touched on many memories and funny events in the life of Taylor and his interminable love and affection for Hannah. Then, having written modified personalized lyrics to the tune of Taylor Swift's song, "22", two-thirds of the "Griffin Girls" (Matrons of Honor) stood to sing/perform their version to the very surprised remaining one-third baby sister and her new husband. Quite the loving and witty performance! Shortly after the cake was cut and enjoyed, the tradition of bouquet and garter tosses were made, the large crowd was directed to grab a ribbon bell wand and/or a lighted foam stick and form an exit path for the couple's departure. Gathered on the front steps, sidewalks and street of the church, the jubilant crowd was enthralled when the newlyweds made their way from the church toward a descending helicopter that hovered and gently

landed in the cordoned street. Continuing to showcase her sheer lace wedding topper worn during the ceremony, Hannah changed into a white ankle length, spaghetti strap jumper to wear underneath. And, in keeping with the "clear" elements, she toted a small translucent acrylic suitcase that exposed pretty white quilted organizational bags inside. Seizing last kisses, hugs and well-wishes from their nearby mothers, Hannah and Taylor proceeded to their get-away "vehicle". 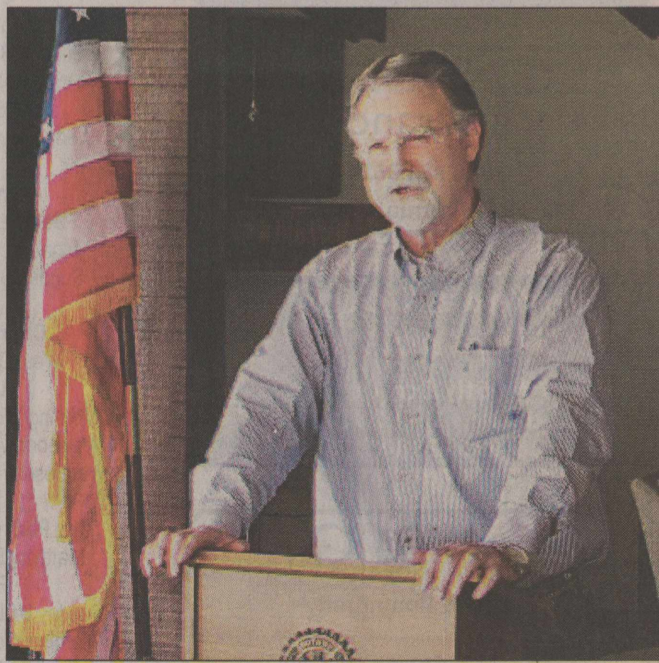

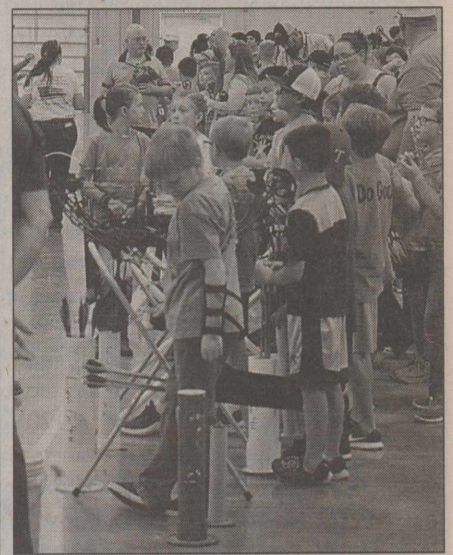

The Heath Rexrode Family — "It's a family thing!"

I got all of that and more. Heath Rexrode invited me to 'come to the house' for the interview. That he and his son, Austen, could take a little time and visit with me there. Arriving at the house, I met Audrey as she was wiping down the glass door at the entrance. The family was finishing preparations for Austen's graduation party later that night. UNT (University of North Texas) for a year. And then we moved back."

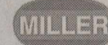
Jeri smiles and adds, "Literally, for one year. And he decided farming was... Well, I think that's what God built him to do."

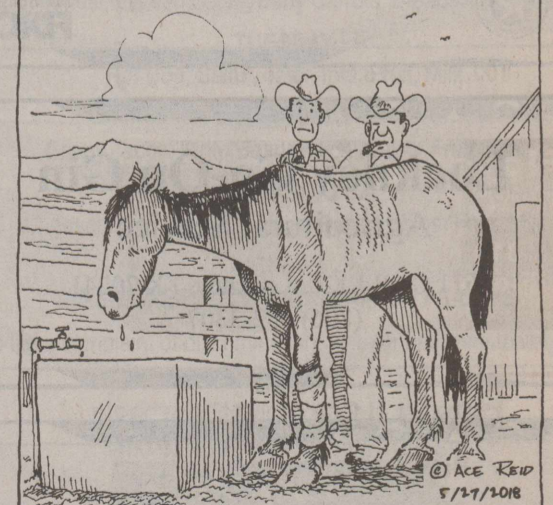

Altus-Lugert: Elevation below normal, water 70 and clear. Crappie and walleye are fair on grubs, hair jigs, jerk bait, jigs and minnows along dam, docks, main lake, riprap and rocks. Channel catfish are fair on punch bait along flats and river mouth. White bass are fair on bill baits, crankbaits, hair jigs, jerk bait and jigs in the main lake, along riprap and rocks.

Ellsworth: Elevation normal, water murky. Crappie are good on minnows and jigs around brush structure, docks and shorelines. Saugeye are fair on small lures and sassy shad around docks and rocks. Lawtonka: Elevation normal, water clear. Saugeye are fair on minnows, sassy shad and small lures in the main lake and rocks.

Tom Steed: Elevation normal, water 65. Crappie and saugeye are fair on minnows and jigs around brush structure and rocks. Striped bass hybrids, white bass and saugeye are good on crankbaits and jigs in the main lake, around points and rocks. Blue and channel catfish are good on cut bait, minnows, punch bait and stinkbait around points and rocks.

Waurika: Elevation normal, water murky. Crappie are fair on minnows and jigs around brush structure, docks, riprap and standing timber. Blue and channel catfish are fair on cut bait around points and shorelines. White bass are fair on crankbaits, flukes and minnows around points, riprap and shallows.

Alan Henry: Water clear main lake, stained up the river; 71 degrees main lake, 75 up the creeks; 7.78 ft. low. Black bass are fair on topwaters, weightless flukes, shakysheads with trick worms, Senkos and chatterbaits. Crappie are slow on minnows. Catfish are slow on live perch and live worms.

Arrowhead: Water fairly clear; 71-79 degrees; 1.66 ft. low. Black bass are fair on Senkos, Texas rigs and chrome Rat-L-Traps. Crappie are fair on live minnows. Catfish are fair to good on cut bait and

nightcrawlers.

Coleman: Water stained; 77-81 degrees; 3.05 ft. low. Black bass are fair on soft plastic lizards, crankbaits, jerkbaits and electric blue worms. Hybrid striped, crappie and channel and yellow catfish are slow.

Colorado City: 16.77 ft. low. After a period of drought, this lake caught water and boating is now allowed. However, it is not currently recommended for fishing due to severe golden alga blooms.

Ft. Phantom Hill: Water off color; 73-79 degrees; 3.04 ft. low. Black bass are fair to good on topwaters, Texas rigs and jigs. Crappie are fair on live minnows. Catfish are good on live and cut bait.

Greenbelt: Water off color; 74-78 degrees; 33.38 ft. low. Black bass are fair on pearl shallow running crankbaits, Texas rigs and shakysheads. Crappie are fair on live minnows and jigs. Catfish are fair to good on live and cut bait.

Hubbard Creek: Water off color; 73-78 degrees; 3.95 ft. low. Black bass are fair on chatterbaits, Texas rigs and flukes. Crappie are fair to good on live minnows and jigs. Catfish are good on live and cut bait.

Mackenzie: Water stained; 73-79 degrees; 75.55 ft. low. Black bass are fair on Texas rigs and split shot rigged flukes. Crappie are fair on minnows and jigs around structure. Catfish are fair to good on nightcrawlers and live baitfish.

Meredith: Water fairly clear; 72-78 degrees; 48.48 ft. low. No reports on black bass. No reports of smallmouth bass or walleye. Bream and channel catfish are being caught in limited numbers.

Nasworthy: 72-80 degrees; 1.18 ft. low. Black bass are good on Texas rigs, pearl shallow running crankbaits and chrome Rat-L-Traps. No reports on crappie. Catfish are fair to good on live bait and nightcrawlers.

O.H. Ivie: Water stained; 73-81 degrees; 39.93 ft. low. Black bass are fair on Texas rigs, jigs and Senkos. Crappie are fair to good on live minnows. Catfish are good on cut and live bait.

Oak Creek: Water stained; 75-83 degrees; 11.76 ft. low. Black bass

are fair to good on Texas rigs, split shot rigged flukes and chrome Rat-L-Traps. Crappie are fair on jigs and live minnows. Catfish are fair to good on live and cut bait.

Possum Kingdom: Water fairly clear; 74-82 degrees; 1.17 ft. low. Black bass are fair to good on jigs, drop shot rigs, Texas rigs and crankbaits. Crappie are fair on live minnow. White bass are fair to good on slabs. Striped bass are fair on live shad. Catfish are good on live and cut bait.

Spence: 52.7 ft. low. No report on black bass or crappie. Catfish are fair on live bait, cut bait and nightcrawlers.

Stamford: Water stained to muddy; 72-77 degrees; 1.71 ft. low. Black bass are fair to good on small swimbaits, Senkos and shad pattern crankbaits. Crappie are fair on jigs and live minnows. White bass are fair on slabs and tail spinners. Blue catfish are good on cut and live bait.

Sweetwater: Water off color; 73-79 degrees; 25.4 ft. low. This lake is currently experiencing a fish kill due to golden alga. Biologists are monitoring the situation and will post updates as they become available.

White River: Water stained; 72-78 degrees; 23.35 ft. low. Black bass are fair to good on Texas rigs and squarebill crankbaits. No reports on crappie. Catfish are good on live bait.

Petty Officer David Lee Sanchez-Lockney, TX

David Sanchez hails from Clarendon but lives in Lockney these days. Graduating with the class of 1999, Sanchez had already committed to the Navy between his junior and senior years in high school. I asked him what made him go into the service.

He replied, "My dad and my grandpa. Actually, someone in my family has been in the service since before the Civil War. It's just always been there." He said that he had decided to become a soldier when he was 5 years old.

His grandmother's family settled in the Clarendon area several generations ago. "They stayed there...together. They've been there forever," adds Sanchez as we talked of his family that had settled in the north Texas area in the middle 1800s. "One was an officer for the Republic of Texas."

His mom is ready for the family line to say, "We're staying out of the service for a while." That military history is 170 consecutive years strong. "The only war we've missed was Vietnam." His grandpa's brother fought in WWII, his grandpa was in Korea, and his brother served in Iraq in 2008.

Sanchez has seen a lot of action in his years with the Navy. "I was in when the USS Coal got hit...when the Twin Towers were attacked...and my deployment in Afghanistan in 2004."



I asked David about his family. "My wife knew that it [the military service] was a part of me when we met." It's in the family's blood. Speaking about his kids, he added, "One has the mind-set, but she is only three years old.

If I have any say, I want them to go to college first, then they can go in as officers."

After Afghanistan, David took a break, but it was short. He enlisted in the Reserves, giving his service when called. He attends Drill

in Amarillo at this time.

I asked him how the military benefitted his character? He responded immediately, "You have to grow up real fast. You are doing more stuff at 19 [years old] than most people are doing at 40!"

"When this term ends, will you retire for good? Or, will you re-up?" I questioned.

"A lot of us are ready to hand the reins over to someone else. You train up. You mentor others to take your spot. One thing that all of us knows is that the military goes on without you. You gotta train people to take your place." He quieted, then softly stated, "If I could go back and do it again, I would in a heartbeat... My dad would be excited, but my mother wouldn't be very happy about it."

"If there was anything that you could say to the younger kids coming up in the ranks, or the ones that are undecided about making the commitment, what would that be?" I asked.

"If you are gonna go, go all in. Have an open mind." David paused, then added, "The Military will only give you what you put into it. It's not gonna hand you anything. That's what I was told by a gentleman when I first went in. You gotta earn what you get!"

Thanks go to your family for the endless decades of service to our country. It is an honor for me to introduce you to the readers of the Hesperian-Beacon and all of Floyd County. Petty Officer David Lee Sanchez, we salute you.

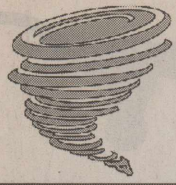

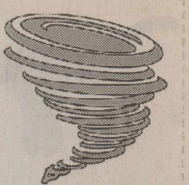

ACE Kicks-Off for Summer

Plains College, and the ever-popular Science Spectrum in Lubbock.

The program also schedules "Family Events" which typically involve both parents and their children. Family Night activities could be a movie night, or a workshop event. For example, the Lubbock Fire Rescue personnel took parents and students through a "hands-on" fire safety event. Everyone in the class got to 'experience' the proper and safe usage of a fire extinguisher.

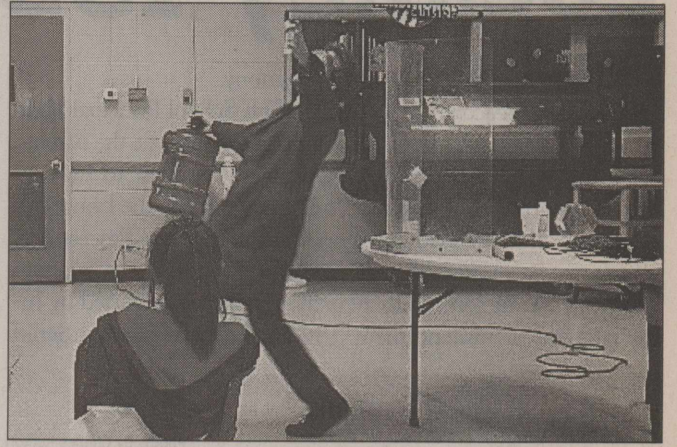

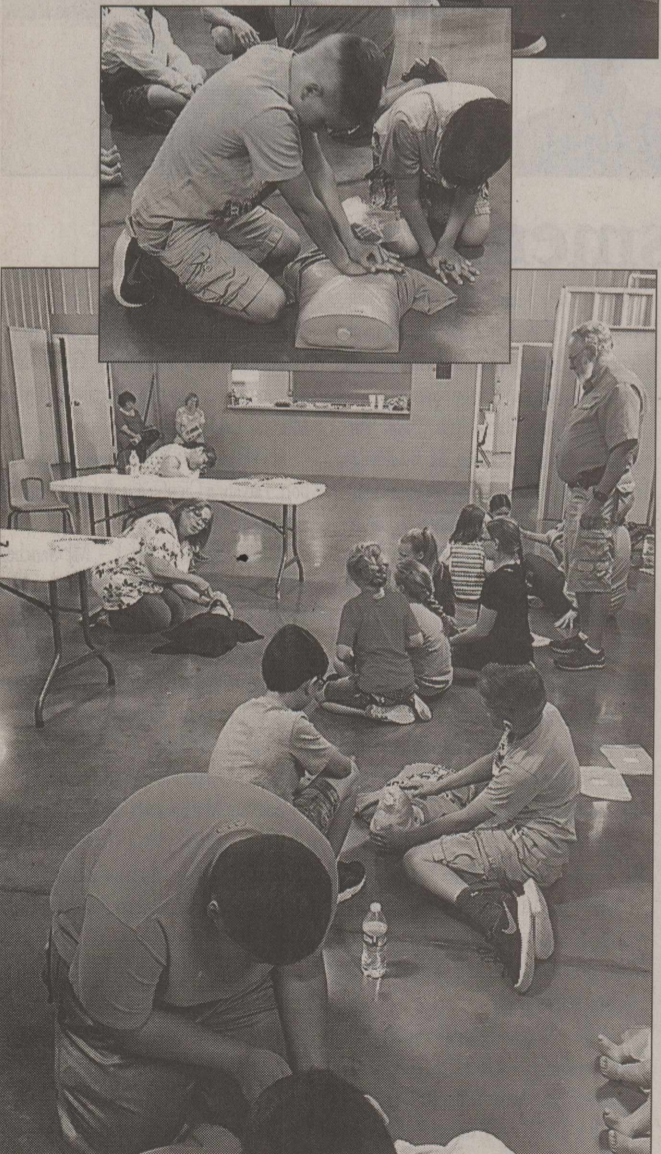

School Board President Mike Lass presented the diplomas to the graduates as they were introduced by High School Counselor Shana Hallmark.

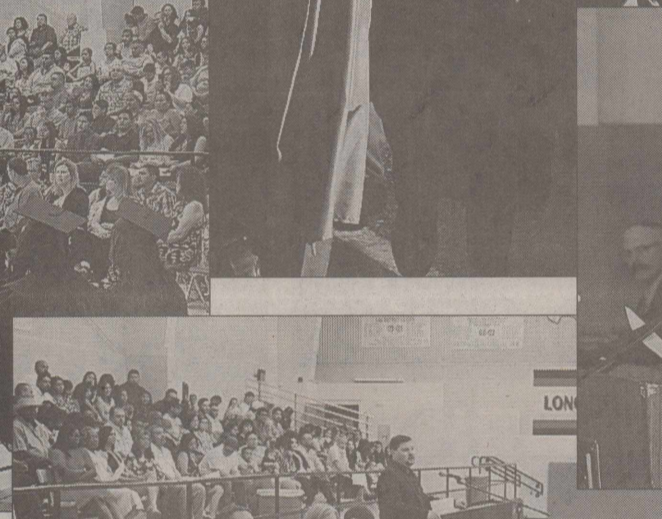
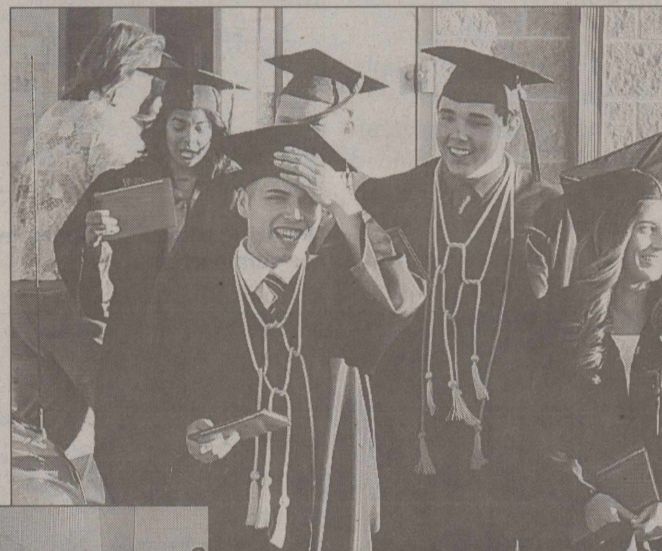
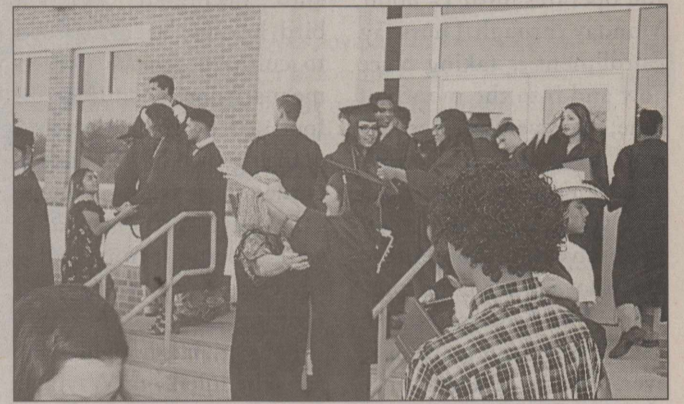
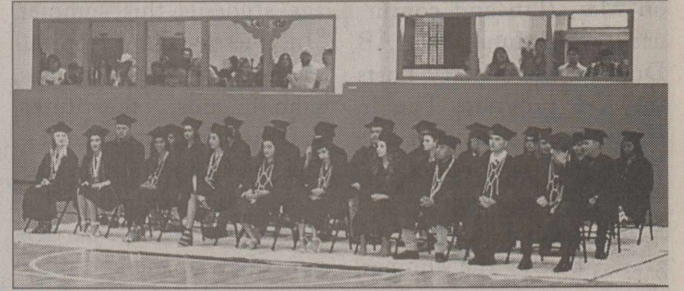

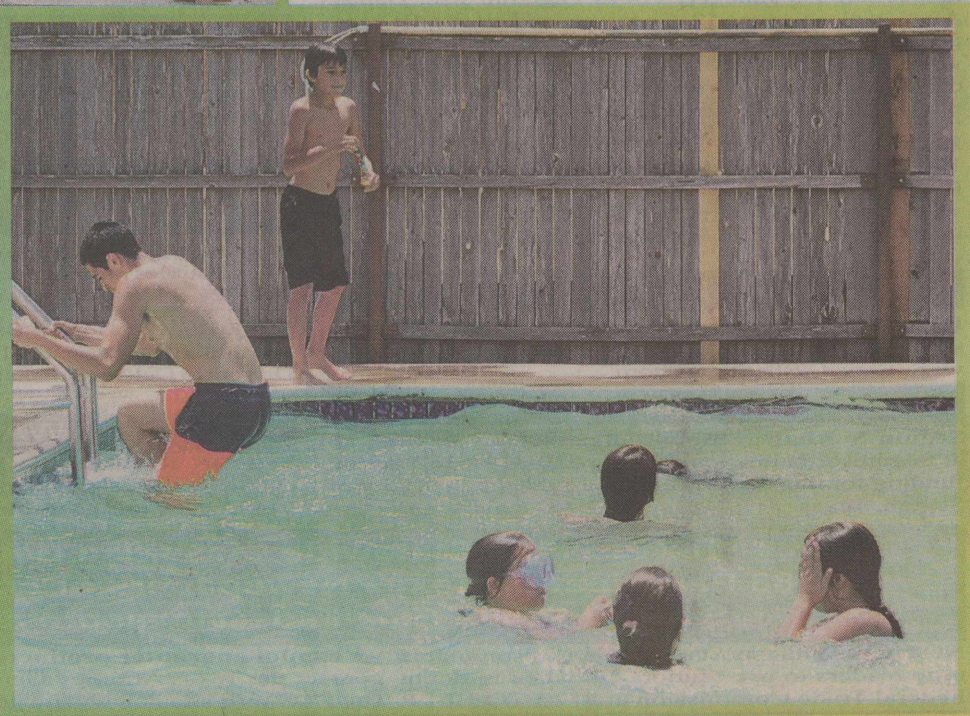

Petty was a member of the Lady Horn athletic program all four years in high school, playing softball. She was in One-Act Play, Literary Criticism and Current Issues and

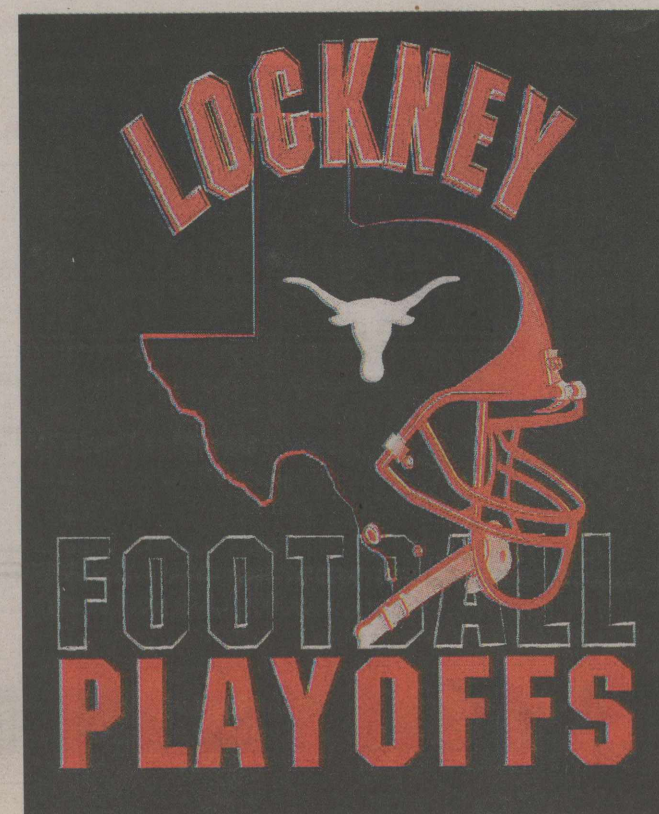
Events. She also was a member of NHS and the Longhorn Band.

Gutierrez plans to attend the Texas State University and major in Business Administration and Accounting in order to become a CPA.

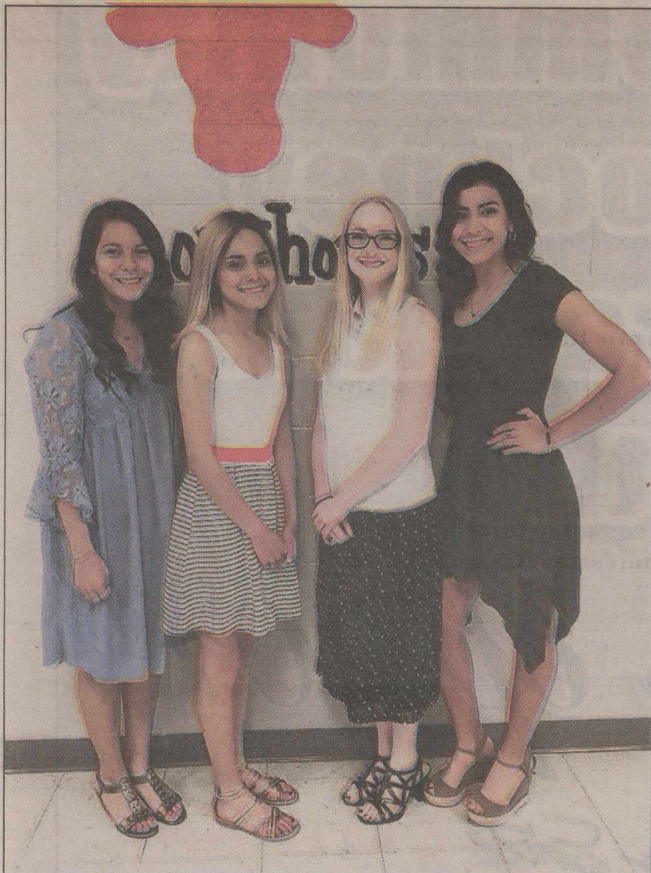
