Happy Day seeking donations for wind-breaking fence

The dogs and cats at Happy Day Humane Society are anticipating the completion of a wind-breaking fence that will block the cold winds that rattle through their kennels.

"The fence is projected to cost in upwards of \$2,500 for the cost of materials and labor," Humane Society

Board Trustee Ronda Doe said. "We've made great improvements at Happy Day with the construction of a new facility, but we continue to use dozens of outside kennels because of the pet overpopulation in Howard County. I remember it getting so cold some winters that we would literally have to go out and break the ice in their

water bowls."

According to Doe, the winds at the Humane Society can be brutal on some days because of where it's situated, particularly to a dog who is in a 12x12 kennel. It also can break their spirits.

"Each dog has a place inside their kennels to get

Lucille Roybal-Allard, D-Calif., who leads the House Appropriations Committee's homeland security subcommittee, said in an interview that some Democrats were asking leaders, "What is our plan?"

The aide spoke on condition of anonymity because he wasn't authorized to discuss the details publicly.

In a video posted on his Twitter feed late Friday, Trump said both sides should "take the politics out of it" and "get to work" to "make a deal."



I know of only a handful of radio broadcasters who had as much fun and promoted their community as much as Jim Baum, The Voice of Mitchell County.

The trail leads them to a brilliant billionaire in the alternative energy field. The NUMA crew discovers that the oil fields are

infected with bacteria that are consuming the oil before it can be pumped out of the earth, a bacteria originally lost decades ago when two submarines vanished in the Mediterranean. HOUSTON (AP) — Houston-area federal workers who've been furloughed due to the partial government shutdown got some free barbecue thanks to a popular local restaurant.

Killen's Barbecue served free family packs of brisket, sausage, potato salad and beans to hundreds of federal workers who lined up at the suburban Houston restaurant on Friday.

The restaurant ran out of food to give away in less than two hours.

Owner Ronnie Killen told KHOU-TV that "it hurts my heart to see that there are that many people affected by what's going on."

Killen said he'll continue giving away food on Fridays until the shutdown ends.

Gerald Steward, who works for NASA, told the television station he supports what President Donald Trump is doing and the free food means he "won't go hungry today."

2 men dead after shooting in parking lot of Fort Worth store

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — Police say two men have died after being shot while in the parking lot of a North Texas home improvement store.

Fort Worth police on Friday tweeted that officers were searching for at least one person who was inside a vehicle that drove away following the

Police didn't immediately say who was believed to have opened fire or a possible motive for Thursday's night's gunfire in the parking lot of a Home Depot. Police say the two men who were shot had approached a parked vehicle, then gunfire broke out and the vehicle drove off.

Further details weren't immediately available.

Pentagon IDs US Army Ranger killed in Afghanistan as Texas resident

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Pentagon says a U.S. Army Ranger has died as a result of gunshot wounds suffered during combat in Afghanistan on

Sgt. Cameron A. Meddock, 26, of Spearman, Texas, died Thursday in Landstuhl, Germany. The attack was in the Jawand District in northwestern Afghanistan.

Meddock was in the 2nd Battalion of the Army's 75th Ranger Regiment. Meddock, who enlisted in the Army in 2014, was based at Joint Base Lewis-McChord in Washington state. He served as a machine gunner, automatic rifleman, gun team leader and most recently as a fire team leader.

His battalion commander, Lt. Col. Rob McChrystal, says Meddock's selfless service represents the best of the United States.

Meddock was on his second deployment to Afghanistan.

Suspect found dead after fatal shooting outside Texas church

CYPRESS, Texas (AP) — A man suspected of shooting two women in a suburban Houston church parking lot, killing one of them, and then fleeing to a hotel has been found dead inside a room there.

The body of 62-year-old Arthur Edigin was found by Harris County sheriff's deputies early Friday, several hours after he was tracked to the room by investigators and a standoff ensued.

Sheriff's authorities said in social media posts that Edigin is suspected of firing several rounds Thursday evening into a vehicle carrying the two women outside Christ the Redeemer Catholic Church in Cypress.

A sheriff's spokesman said the dead woman is believed to be the suspect's 66-year-old estranged wife, the wounded woman is his daughter and the shooting was the outgrowth of a domestic dispute.

Total lunar eclipse meets supermoon Sunday night

CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Here comes a total lunar eclipse and supermoon, all wrapped into one.

The moon, Earth and sun will line up this weekend for the only total lunar eclipse this year and next. At the same time, the moon will be ever so closer to Earth and appear slightly bigger and brighter than usual — a supermoon.

"This one is particularly good," said Rice University astrophysicist Patrick Hartigan. "It not only is a supermoon and it's a total eclipse, but the total eclipse also lasts pretty long. It's about an hour."

The whole eclipse starts Sunday night or early Monday, depending on location, and will take about three hours.

It begins with the partial phase around 10:34 p.m. EST Sunday. That's when Earth's shadow will begin to nip at the moon. Totality — when Earth's shadow completely blankets the moon —

will last 62 minutes, beginning at 11:41 p.m. EST Sunday.

If the skies are clear, the entire eclipse will be visible in North and South America, as well as Greenland, Iceland, Ireland, Great Britain, Norway, Sweden, Portugal and the French and Spanish coasts. The rest of Europe, as well as Africa, will have partial viewing before the moon sets. Some places will be livestreaming it, including the Griffith Observatory in Los Angeles.

During totality, the moon will look red because of sunlight scattering off Earth's atmosphere. That's why an eclipsed moon is sometimes known as a blood moon. In January, the full moon is also sometimes known as the wolf moon or great spirit moon.

So informally speaking, the upcoming lunar eclipse will be a super blood wolf — or great spirit — moon.

In the U.S., the eclipse will begin relatively early Sunday evening, making it easier for children to stay up and enjoy the show. Plus

the next day is a federal holiday, with most schools closed. But the weather forecast for much of the U.S. doesn't look good.

Parents "can keep their kids up maybe a little bit later," said, Hartigan, who will catch the lunar extravaganza from Houston. "It's just a wonderful thing for the whole family to see because it's fairly rare to have all these things kind of come together at the same time."

"The good thing about this is that you don't need any special equipment," he added.

Asia, Australia and New Zealand are out of luck. But they had prime viewing last year, when two total lunar eclipses occurred.

The next total lunar eclipse won't be until May 2021.

As for full-moon supermoons, this will be the first of three this year. The upcoming supermoon will be about 222,000 miles (357,300 kilometers) away. The Feb. 19 supermoon will be a bit closer and the one on March 20 will be the farthest.

Officer who killed teen used racial slur, excessive force

CHICAGO (AP) — Several black motorists testified Friday that the white officer who fatally shot Laguan McDonald used a racial slur and excessive force during traffic stops in the years before the 2014 killing that was captured on a shocking dashcam video.

Jason Van Dyke was in court to be sentenced for second-degree murder and 16 counts of aggravated battery

— one for each bullet he fired. He faces at least several years in prison, if not decades, after being convicted in Octo-

One of the witnesses, Vidale Joy, said Van Dyke used a racial slur after pulling him over in 2005 and at one point put a gun to Joy's head. He said Van Dyke "looked infuriated" and seemed "out of his mind." Under cross examination, Joy acknowledged that he did not allege Van Dyke used a slur in his first accounts of the stop.

Another witness, Ed Nance, struggled maintain his composure as he looked across the room to identify Van Dyke. Testifying about a 2007 traffic stop, he said the officer cursed and slammed him on the

California officer slain weeks into job was 'perfect cop'

DAVIS, Calif. (AP) — A 22-year-old California officer killed weeks into the job was a dedicated daughter and sister who represented the best of the police community, family and fellow officers said Friday at a packed memorial service.

Loved ones and officers from across the country packed about 8,000 seats at an indoor arena at the University of California, Davis, to pay tribute to Natalie Corona, who had dreamed from a young age of going into law enforcement like her father.

"It was truly in her blood," Davis Police Chief Darren Pytel said. "I placed a bet that one day she'd be the police chief. I know what it takes, and she

He apologized to her parents, Merced and Lupe Corona, for the shooting death of their daughter last week as she responded to a car crash.

"You delivered to us the perfect cop. Our commitment to you was to get her home," he said. "I'm so sorry that we didn't get her back home to

Corona's slaying has shocked Davis, which prides itself as a safe, family-friendly community anchored by one of the state's top universities. The last time a police officer died in the line of duty in Davis was in 1959.

Officers lined walkways on the campus and saluted as family members followed Corona's casket into the 90-minute service. Uniformed officers took their seats, holding their hats, as a slideshow on

giant screens displayed family pictures Corona's brief professional life.

Family, colleagues others who knew Corona have recalled her vibrant smile, compassion, dedication and lifelong dream of joining law enforcement in footsteps of her father, who spent 26 years as a Colusa County sheriff's deputy.

Merced Corona said he tried to get his daughter "Nat" to join the county force, but she told him that she had "found the perfect department in the perfect city" and couldn't picture herself anywhere else.

"Today we lay to rest our beloved sister cop,"

he said.

A rising star in the Davis department, Corona graduated from the Sacramento Police Academy in July and had completed her field training in December. She was assigned to patrol on her own just weeks ago.

On the evening of Jan. 10, there was no apparent danger when Corona responded solo to a threecar crash in downtown Davis, near the university campus. But as Corona talked to the drivers, gunfire erupted. Police say gunman Kevin Douglas Limbaugh,

48, was not involved in the crash but rode up on a

bicycle and opened fire on Corona without warning. He hit her in the neck and fired more shots as she lay on the ground, reloading at least twice as he fired at passing vehicles, narrowly avoiding wounding others before he casually walked home. Police are still investigating the motive and

say Limbaugh did not appear to know Corona or specifically target her. It is also not yet clear if Limbaugh had planned the attack or acted spontaneously, Davis police Lt. Paul Doroshov

Limbaugh dropped a backpack that led officers to identify him and trace him to his house, where he had a brief standoff with police, went back inside and killed himself, the Davis police chief said.

Police found two unregistered semiautomatic handguns at the house and a handwritten note on the bed that claimed police had been bombarding him for years with ultrasonic waves and he "can't live this way anymore."

Limbaugh was charged and convicted in a battery case last fall after assaulting a colleague at a casino where he worked. He was ordered then to surrender a semiautomatic rifle he owned. It is not clear how he obtained the two handguns.

After the memorial service, a funeral procession is planned from Davis to the town of Arbuckle about 40 miles (65 kilometers) north, where the Corona family lives. The slain officer is survived by her mother, her father and three younger sisters.

car's hood, grabbed him by the arms and pulled him to the squad car.

Hours later, Van Dyke's relatives tried to defend and humanize him, saying he's a good father and husband who goes out of his way to help and who is not racist.

The issue of race has loomed over the case for more than four years, although it was rarely raised at trial. One of the only instances was during opening statements, when special prosecutor Joseph McMahon told jurors that Van Dyke saw "a black boy walking down the street" who had "the audacity to ignore the police.'

Friday's testimony came a day after a different judge acquitted three officers accused of trying to conceal what happened to protect Van Dyke, who was the first Chicago officer found guilty in an on-duty shooting in a half century and probably the first ever in the shooting of an African-American. At the sentencing, McDonald's uncle

read a letter written from the slain teen's perspective, telling the court that Van Dyke killed him without

"I am a 17-year-old boy, and I am a victim of murder," Marvin Hunter said. "I am unable to speak in my own voice" because an officer "thought he would become judge, jury and

In asking for a long sentence, Hunter added: "Why should this person who ended my life forever ... who has never asked for forgiveness ... be free when I am dead for forever?"

Van Dyke's wife said her life has been "a nightmare" since her husband was charged. She said she was denied a job and her daughter was not accepted into a dance group because of their last name.

If Van Dyke goes to prison, she said, her biggest fear is that "somebody will kill my husband for something he did as a police officer, something he was trained to do."

She looked up over her shoulder and addressed the judge directly: "His life is over. Please, please. He has paid the price already ... I beg for the least amount of time."

During her testimony, Van Dyke wiped his nose and eyes with a tissue while seated at the defense table in a yellow jail jumpsuit.

One of his daughters blamed the media for shaming police officers "for doing their jobs."

Kaylee Van Dyke, also 17, said the media "twists events, making people create negative thoughts." She said police officers don't care about people's color, "they care about your safety." She also said she regrets all the times she didn't hug her father.

Keith Thompson described his brother-in-law as a "gentle giant" and not a "monster." Thompson, who is black and whose wife is the sister of Van Dyke's wife, said he has never

seen anything to indicate that Van Dyke is racist in the 13 years they've been acquainted.

Van Dyke's sister, Heidi Kauffunger, told the court that her brother has been abandoned by family and friends since he was charged. She begged the court for mercy and said if her brother goes to prison the family "will lose everything." She says Van Dyke's two daughters have been bullied and that the older one even had the words "16 shots" written on her

Because Illinois judges are typically required to sentence defendants for the most serious crime of which they are convicted, attorneys made arguments about the severity of the offenses, as governed by the state's complex guidelines. Judge Vincent Gaughan's decision on that point will help determine the sentence. The defense wants Van Dyke, 40, to

be sentenced primarily for the second-degree murder charge, partly because it carries a shorter mandatory minimum prison term of four years. Prosecutors want the judge to focus on the 16 aggravated battery counts because each one carries a mandatory minimum prison term of six years, and sentences for each count may have to be served consecutively instead of at the same time.

On Thursday, Cook County Judge Domenica Stephenson cleared former officer Joseph Walsh, former detective David March and officer Thomas Gaffney on charges of obstruction of justice, official misconduct and con-

Stephenson accepted the argument that jurors in the Van Dyke case rejected: that the video that sparked protests and a federal investigation of the police force was just one perspective of the events that unfolded on the South Side.

The judge said the video showed only one viewpoint of the confrontation between Van Dyke and the teen armed with a small knife. She found no indication the officers tried to hide evidence or made little effort to talk to witnesses.

"The evidence shows just the opposite," she said. She singled out how they preserved the graphic video at the heart of the case.

The judge in her ruling rejected prosecution arguments that the video demonstrated officers were lying when they described McDonald as moving even after he was shot.

"An officer could have reasonably believed an attack was imminent,' she said. "It was borne out in the video that McDonald continued to move after he fell to the ground" and refused to relinquish a knife.

The video appeared to show the teen collapsing in a heap after the first few shots and moving in large part because bullets kept striking his body for 10 more seconds. The footage showed Van Dyke open-

ing fire within seconds of getting out of his police SUV and continuing to shoot the teen while he was lying on

the street. Police were responding to a report of a male who was breaking into trucks and stealing radios on the city's South Side.

Linehan out as Cowboys offensive coordinator after 5 seasons



Scott Linehan is out as offensive coordinator of the Dallas Cowboys only days after coach Jason Garrett sent mixed messages about the oft-criticized assistant's future. Garrett said in a statement released by the team Friday, Jan. 18, 2019, that he and Linehan had some open discussions this week and mutually agreed that a change was needed after five seasons.

The question of Linehan's replacement will revolve around finding the right fit for quarterback Dak Prescott. The 2016 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year regressed in the season and a half following that honor before his efficiency improved after the addition of Cooper.

The Cowboys also have one of the NFL's best running backs in Ezekiel Elliott, who was a first-year sensation alongside Prescott for a 13-3 team that had the top seed in 2016 before losing to Green Bay in the divisional round. Elliott has won two rushing titles in his three seasons.

One intriguing consideration is whether to utilize Prescott's mobility more. One of his strengths is throwing on the run, and he's already within two touchdowns rushing of Hall of Famer Roger Staubach's franchise record of 20.

"I think we can get better schematically," execu-

tive vice president of personnel Stephen Jones said on his radio show a day before the decision on Linehan was announced. "I think we can improve on our scheme, on our design, and I think we can throw the ball efficiently and effectively with the personnel we have." Linehan was Nick Saban's offensive coordinator

with the Miami Dolphins in 2005, when Garrett was in charge of the quarterbacks in his first year as an NFL assistant. St. Louis hired Linehan as head coach, and he was fired during his third season in

The 55-year-old Linehan was offensive coordinator in Detroit for Matthew Stafford's first five seasons with the Lions before joining the Cowboys when Tony Romo was the starter in 2014. Prescott replaced an injured Romo two years later.

DALLAS — Scott Linehan is out as offensive coordinator of the Dallas Cowboys, less than a week after coach Jason Garrett sent mixed messages about the future for the oft-criticized assistant.

Garrett, in a statement released by the team Friday, described the move as a mutual decision after he and Linehan had some open and positive discussions this week. Linehan, who just completed his fifth season in Dallas, had one more season left on

"This was very much a mutual decision, and there was a great deal of common ground and shared understanding between both of us during our meetings," Garrett said. "Scott has had an incredibly positive impact on our football team. He has been instrumental in the development and success of a significant number of our veteran and younger

The Cowboys rebounded after a 3-5 start to win the NFC East. They beat the Seattle Seahawks in a home wild-card game before a 30-22 loss at the Los Angeles Rams last weekend.

Garrett said on his radio show Monday he thought icant changes to his staff. But at a news conference later in the day, Garrett was far from definitive and said discussions about a coaching staff hadn't hap-

Linehan said in a statement issued by the team that he and Garrett agreed after "a good, direct talk" that "a fresh start was probably best for both of us."

"I'll always respect Jason as a coach, and I consider him a good friend," Linehan said. "I'll miss my fellow coaches and my players a great deal. But life is about change and growth, and I very much look forward to my next challenge."

Dallas' slow start this season was largely blamed on a misfiring offense. There were questions about creativity, including from Hall of Fame quarterback-turned-analyst Troy Aikman, who won three Super Bowls with the Cowboys in the 1990s.

The Cowboys were much better offensively in the second half of the season after sending their firstround pick in this year's draft to Oakland for receiver Amari Cooper. But the Cowboys were one of just four teams to convert fewer than half their trips inside the 20-yard line into touchdowns.

During the regular season, the Cowboys averaged 344 total yards and 21.2 points a game to rank 22nd in the NFL in both categories. Their only loss the last half of the regular season was 23-0 at Indianapolis on Dec. 16, the first time in 15 years they were





Under coach Gregg Popovich, the San Antonio Spurs have been consistent winners. That includes when they go on the road — and anywhere they play the Minnesota Timberwolves.

LaMarcus Aldridge scored 25 points, Rudy Gay added 22 and the Spurs held on to give Popovich another milestone victory in a 116-113 win against the Timberwolves on Friday night.

Popovich earned his 520th career win on the road, tying Pat Riley for the most in NBA his-

"We got through some stuff and it's always good to win on the road," Popovich said. "It's always difficult to do, but when you do it feels pretty good."

The win also continued San Antonio's mastery of Minnesota. The Spurs have won 16 of the past 18 games between the teams. San Antonio is 59-25 in the series since Popovich took over as coach for the 1996-97 season.

Marco Belinelli added 19 points off the bench for San Antonio, which played without leading scorer DeMar DeRozan because of left ankle sore-

"Coach Pop said don't think about it and play basketball, and we've got to win the game no matter what," forward Davis Bertans said.

Karl-Anthony Towns had 23 points for the Timberwolves but fouled out after only 21 minutes. Derrick Rose chipped in 23 points and Taj Gibson added 14 points and 11 rebounds for

Another matchup between the familiar foes was tight throughout, with 27 lead changes and 17 ties. It also featured a heavy dose of fouls on

big man was back Friday night after being sidelined for nearly a year. He scored 14 points in his Warriors debut, a 112-94 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers.

"I felt like a kid on Christmas," Cousins said. "This was probably one of the best days of my life being back on the floor playing the game that I love."

His new teammates were glad to have him, too, even if he lasted just 15 minutes before fouling out.

gave him a They standing ovation when he got whistled for his sixth foul at 8:51 of the fourth. Cousins smiled and high-fived his way to the bench. Stephen Curry and Kevin Durant cracked up.

"Probably the fakest love I ever received in my life," Cousins said.

Durant said: "Hopefully that's the last time we give him a standing ovation when he fouls out."

Curry led the Warriors with 28 points, Durant added 24 and Golden State won its seventh in a row and sixth straight on the road.

The Warriors shot just 9 of 37 on 3-pointers on a night when Curry made only three from long range. Fellow Splash Brother Klay Thompson missed all four of his 3-point attempts.

The hours leading up to his first game since Jan. 26, 2018, were the worst for Cousins. He texted friends and talked to his brother and sister who reminded him that he's been playing basket- made two consecutive ball for years.

Still, it wasn't until the ball tipped that the butterflies went away.

"My teammates made it as smooth and easy possible," Cousins said. "It's a great group of guys. Nothing but love in the room."

Cousins shot 5 for 11 from the floor and finished with six rebounds and three assists.

After rupturing his left Achilles tendon in a game for New Orleans he missed the rest of last season, including nine playoff games for the Pelicans. The Warriors signed him last July.

With Cousins finally in the lineup, Golden State became the first team in 42 years to start five All-Stars from the previous

"We haven't really practiced together," Cousins said. "We can get a whole lot better. We've got a lot of potential."

Cousins missed his first shot but came right back with a one-handed slam off Durant's bounce pass for the Warriors' first basket. Cousins was called for two fouls in the first three minutes and sat down.

"I'm just glad to know I can still dunk," he said. "That felt good."

Cousins picked up his third foul 32 seconds into the second quarter. Then he hit a 3-pointer for the Warriors' first basket of the period, bringing loud cheers from their many fans at Staples Center.

Curry scored 14 of Golden State's 29 points in the third, including their final eight for an 81-72 lead.

Cousins went out with a bang. He got his fifth foul just 30 seconds into the fourth and then

3-pointers — throwing up three fingers — that extended the Warriors' lead to 87-72.

"He looked good. He looked strong and quick," Golden State Steve coach said. "I was really impressed."

Tobias Harris led the short-handed Clippers with 28 points in their season-worst fifth straight loss. Rookie guard Shai Gilgeous-Alexander tied his career high with 24.

Los Angeles played without injured Lou Williams, and Danilo Gallinari left with lower back spasms.

"The change of the game was in the third quarter. Them scoring off our turnovers changed the momentum of the game for us," Harris said.



The Low Down on the King

~Interesting Facts about MLK~

Martin Luther King Jr. was a Baptist minister, leader in the civil rights movement, peace protester, all in all he was just a great guy. While facts about King such as giving his "I have a Dream Speech," and being the voungest Noble Prize winner are taught in school, there are some interesting tidbits about Dr. King that you won't find in the history books. Some that are interesting and some are what I would call "a head scratcher."

What's in a name?

First, did you know his birth name was actually Michael King Jr? His father was named Michael King and changed his first name to Martin Luther when he became a minister.

But MLK almost didn't become a minister!

After King graduated from college, he still had serious reluctance about Christianity and the Bible and told his father (who was a Baptist minister, as his grandfather had also been) that he didn't want to be a minister and instead was considering becoming a doctor or a lawyer. It was later he decided that the Bible had "many profound truths which one cannot escape" and chose to become a minister, entering seminary at Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania. He graduated with his PhD at the age of 25.

King learned lessons from Gandhi...sort of

While at Crozer Theological Seminary, Dr. King was introduced, and was quickly enthralled in the teachings and philosophies of Mohandas Gandhi. King entered Crozer in the fall

sinated in January 1948 in India. Later in an interview, King said he attended a lecture from the president of Howard University given in Philadelphia about Gandhi, and he immediately became "deeply influenced" by the philosophy of nonviolence.

C in Public Speaking

King got a C in public speaking at seminary school. King's father, a preacher in Atlanta, thought his son was the best speaker he'd ever seen, before he went away to seminary school. But in his first year of seminary school in Chester, Pennsylvania, one of King's professors gave him a C in a public speaking course! In his third and final year, King was valedictorian with straight A's.

Honeymooning at a Funeral. Because no honeymoon suites were available for African-Amer-

icans, King and his wife Coretta spent their wedding night at a friend's funeral parlor.

"Live Long and Prosper"

King convinced "Uhura" on Star Trek, Nichelle Nichols (who actually later went on to work for NASA), to continue on with the role after the first season. Nichols stated he told her not to leave the show because she was not only playing a black person as a main character on TV, but she was also playing a character that didn't conform to the stereotypical black person of the day, usually portrayed. Rather, Uhura was portrayed as an intelligent member of the crew and an equal to those around her. Once again, such a MLK move.

Astronaut Ronald McNair, the second black person in space (who also died in the Challenger explosion), was inspired to become an astronaut because of the character of Uhura.

Book Signing Assassination Attempt!

In 1958, while at a book signing, he was stabbed by a mentally ill woman. Martin Luther King Jr. was nearly assassinated a decade earlier than his ultimate death. While on a book tour, signing copies of his book "Stride Toward Freedom," on Sept. 20, 1958, King was approached by Izola Ware Curry who asked him if he was Martin Luther King Jr., which he of course replied affirmatively. When he said he was, she said "I've been looking for you for five years." She then pulled out a letter opener and stabbed him in the chest.


It took three full hours to remove the blade. The reason? The sharp point end of the blade was pressing against his aorta and the doctors had to be extremely careful while removing it because of this. The doctor, Dr. Maynard, told him after, "If you had sneezed during all those hours of waiting, your aorta would have been punctured and you would have drowned in your own blood." King didn't press any charges against the woman. So very King like.

King's Heart

King's autopsy revealed that though he was only 39 when he died, he had the heart of a 60-year-old man, assumedly stress-related.

King on the Road



West Texas town of Stamford reopens local movie theater

STAMFORD, Texas (AP) — The balcony is finally open in the West Texas town of Stamford.

The Abilene Reporter-News reports the Grand Theatre is living up to its name. The 1930s-era movie palace, shuttered since 2011, is once again showing films.

Like the Tower Drive-In in nearby Rule, the Grand had to close its doors because of changes in the motion picture industry. The conversion to digital rippled the landscape for small-town theaters across the nation. Stamford has a population of nearly 3,000. Back in 2002, the Grand received movies in large

film cans, shipped from another theater. Once the movie ran for its designated period, it would be packed and shipped to the next theater. But as cameras went digital, the projectors soon

followed. Movie companies realized they could save quite a bit of money by convincing theaters to switch to digital projection. The argument for the switch was not only easier access to movies, but better sound as well. The only hiccup in this plan is cost, of course. Lo-

cally-owned movie houses found themselves going out of business or scrambling to create community partnerships to save their theaters. An early local example is Eastland's Majestic

Theatre, a restored beauty from the same era as the Grand. The M3 Palace Theater in Colorado City also successfully upgraded. The Grand reopened Nov. 23 with "The Grinch."

Jessica Decker, a marketing professional in Stamford volunteering for the theater project, said it's been a community effort. "About two and a half years ago, the Economic

Development Corporation put together a committee of people to fund raise and start the renovation process," she said. That committee raised more than \$100,000 for

the effort through donations and loans. Volunteers were enlisted for the demolition and restoration

"Just a lot of people in general spend a lot of time

and money over the past two and a half years to put this thing back together,' Decker said.

Why was this a priority for the community?

"People just realized that it was too important to the town to lose. Not only because of the history, it's a key landmark on the square," she said. "But for having a place kids can go for entertainment."

That's true in any small town. And at this time of year, not many want to drive 80 miles round-trip to see a movie.

"Having something to do in the winter that's constructive and beneficial is too valuable to lose," Decker said. The Grand shows movies at 7 p.m.

Friday through Monday, with Sunday's showing a matinee at 3 p.m. They're family-friendly movies, PG-13 and under. Upcoming current features are listed on their Facebook page, but classic movies might be coming.

"That has definitely been discussed," Decker said, and laughed. "I know if it were up to my dad, we'd have a whole John Wayne series."

The auditorium features 350 modern seats. She said they still are taking donations to complete finishing touches. Phil Swenson remembered visiting

the Grand as a child. His favorite movies were seen there with his grandfather Saturday afternoons. "Pat Boone had a famous one back then, I think it was 'April Love'''," he said. "But

I remember the 'Ten Commandments,' especially in color." He's hoping to see Steve McQueen's "Bullitt" in the Grand, but will settle for a

"I'm just thankful that everybody is not afraid to volunteer," he said of the theater. "That's the main thing, if they're here, they volunteered to help out."

In 2000, M. Night Shyamalan directed the movie "Unbreakable," in which an unassuming security guard survives a horrific train crash, discovers he's got super powers, and slowly transitions from a bleak, depressing existence to a bleak, depressing existence in which he fights evil.

In 2016, he made the movie "Split," in which a man with dissociative identity disorder (and 23...well, 24...personalities) kidnaps some girls before his superhuman "Beast" identity tries to eat them. We knew the two movies were linked because David Dunn (Bruce Willis), the security guard from "Unbreakable," has a cameo in the end sequence of "Split."

Now, Shyamalan has released the capstone third installment in his superhero trilogy, "Glass," named for Samuel L. Jackson's character Elijah Price's villainous alter ego "First name 'Mister,' last name 'Glass.'

"Glass" starts off with Dunn – now the owner of a small security company and the subject of an urban legend as "The Overseer" – patrolling the streets in his iconic green rain poncho. He witnesses some young men beating up random strangers with their "Superman Punch" attack, follows them back to their home, and teaches them a lesson in manners.

We learn that he's working with his son Joseph (Spencer Treat Clark – remember him from "Unbreakable"? Same actor, now all grown up) to track down "The Horde" (McAvoy), who has just kidnapped four more teenage girls to feed The Beast.

Using his evil touch sense thingy that he developed in "Unbreakable," Dunn senses The Horde in his "Hedwig" personality – a nine-year-old boy - and that he's got the girls chained up in a nearby brick factory. After saving the girls and fighting The Beast, both Horde and Overseer arrested by the cops and taken to Raven Hill mental institution, where Price is also being held under strong sedation.

All three of the men are kept in special facilities to disable their powers - Dunn is kept in a room with a massive sprinkler system which will

cut in if he misbehaves (remember? Water is his Kryptonite). The Horde is kept in a room with a special light system which causes his personality to change uncontrollably (it's never explained what would happen if he simply closed his eyes or didn't look at the light - perhaps backing up to the light and destroying it). And Price is simply kept zonked out of his mind on medication.

The three are examined and psychoanalyzed by Dr. Ellie Staple (Sarah Paulson), a psychiatrist specializing in delusions of grandeur in which the patient believes he or she is a superhero. Staple tries to convince the three men that their "powers" are nothing more than normal human skills and abilities combined with de-

I'll stop the narration there. Oth-

er characters include Casey Cooke (Anya Taylor-Joy), the teen who survived being kidnapped by The Horde in "Split"; Mrs. Price (Charlayne Woodard), Elijah's mother; and Shyamalan himself makes his usual cameo, though I won't spoil it for you. I don't think "Glass" goes quite the

way I would have taken it. Shyamalan is known for his twist endings, and, in my opinion, "Glass"'s twist is a little bit of a let-down. The majority of the movie is great,

showing off Elijah's super power (genius intellect and villainous mastermindery, if you've forgotten) to great effect. The movie is well-acted and well-paced – a great successor to the films that have come before...but the ending is a bit hard to swallow.

I'll get off it – I don't want to spoil anything. I'm going to give "Glass" a slightly puzzled seven and a half stars.

I will say this - if we do get more (and I believe I remember Shyamalan saying he doesn't want to make another sequel) my opinion of this movie could improve significantly. Not that it was bad - but the ending is too wide open for the ending of a story, in my opinion.

Powerful Symbol of the West

One of the most memorable scenes in the epic motion picture "How the West Was Won" is when the Native American Indians send a massive herd of buffalo stampeding over the settlers invading their land. Although these majestic animals are commonly called buffalo the correct name is American Bison. While roaming the American prairie by

tens of millions the breed was hunted almost to extinction in the late 1800's. Once reaching estimates of 30 to 100 million in number roaming the Great Plains, it is recorded that when the federal government passed strict game laws in 1889 the population of bison had declined with 300 to 500 animals remaining in the United States.

At one-time, American Bison herds could be found from Alaska to northern Mexico with most grazing in the grasslands and prairies of the United States. Bison were essential to the ecology of the Great Plains creating habitat for other animals and plants by grazing and disturbing the soil. Most of us know of the strong bond with the Native Americans who relied on the bison for food, shelter, clothing and as a powerful spiritual symbol.

At maturity the Bison can reach six feet high at their shoulders and 7 to 12 feet in length. They weigh between 1,800 to 2,400 pounds thus making them the largest terrestrial animals in North America. They have a characteristic hump over the front shoulder and then a slimmer hindquarter. Both male and females have short horns that curve outward and up from the sides of their massive head. The head, neck, front legs, and front part of their body have a thick coat of long, dark hair. The males also have a black beard that is about a

foot long. This thick hair helps the bison to survive

long tough winters and they endure blizzards by standing facing the cold winds. These heavy coats are shed each spring and the bison help to loosen their hair by rolling around on the ground to get it to fall off in large patches.

Bison graze year-round feeding primarily on grasses. They find grass in the winter by sweeping their heads from side to side to clear snow. Bison are usually found in bands and communicate with each other through snorts and bellows. They have excellent hearing and smell, but their poor eyesight is what causes a herd to stampede so easily. Living for 15 to 20 years, adult Bison are relatively safe from natural predators though weak or young bison can be prey upon by mountain lions, bears or wolves. A single calf is born to a female bison and after only a few days it can keep up with the herd. When bison travel they form a line and are good swimmers and cross rivers and streams without difficulty.

With the efforts of the government and conservation groups the American Bison is no longer in danger of extinction however that does not mean they are totally safe in our modern world. Living mainly in controlled national parks lands or under the protection of private commercial conservationists, bison is still threatened by habitat loss, hybridization in managed populations and low genetic diversity among the herds. Exposure to livestock diseases has become a noted threat to their existence.

In 2016, President Obama signed the National Bison Legacy Act which designated the bison as the

Stocks keep climbing as hopes for US-China trade deal rise

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks in the U.S. and Europe jumped Friday as renewed hopes for progress in trade talks between the U.S. and China helped the markets finish the week with another strong gain.

Indexes jumped after Bloomberg News reported that China's government offered to buy more goods and services from the U.S., potentially eliminating its trade deficit by 2024. For investors, the encouraging news on trade builds on recent positive signs for the U.S. economy and indications from the Federal Reserve that it will be patient

when considering future interest

rate hikes.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average is up 5.9 percent and the S&P 500 index has risen 6.5 percent so far this year, a surprisingly strong showing coming off a punishing end to 2018.

Technology and industrial companies made some of the top gains, while banks rose after around round of solid fourth-quarter earnings reports. Oil and copper prices rose, while gold and bond prices fell. Those are all signs traders felt more optimistic about global economic growth.

Over the last few days investors grew steadily more hopeful the U.S. and China are narrowing their differences over trade. On Wednesday the Chinese government said the top trade envoys from both countries will

meet at the end of January.

"What you can see that is significant is that both sides are trying," said Tom Martin, senior portfolio manager of Globalt Investments. "Everybody feels like they've now made their point" after the two nations spent most of 2018 staking out positions and occasionally making threats.

Martin said the Federal Reserve has also made a big contribution to the rally.

The S&P 500 climbed 34.75 points, or 1.3 percent, to 2,670.71. The Dow jumped 336.25 points, or 1.4 percent, to 24,706.35. The Nasdaq composite added 72.76 points, or 1 percent, to 7,157.23.

Stock indexes have surged since reaching a low point on

America's busiest airport, Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson International. is a blur of activity on the best of days. But an extra layer of anxiety gripped the airport Friday, the eve of a three-day holiday weekend. The partial government shutdown — the longest ever — has thinned the ranks of federal workers who staff airport had braced for the worst.

"I have a 3 o'clock flight, and I arrived at 10:15 a.m.," Beth Lambert said while waiting to check in at a Delta Air Lines counter as her 5-yearold, Michael, rode around on his wheeled bag like a scooter. "We're going to be hanging out for a while."

The scene at most of the nation's airports has so far been marked more by concerned passengers showing up

Christmas Eve, as the S&P 500 has risen for four weeks in a row. It climbed 2.9 percent this week. It's risen at least 1.9 percent every week during that rally. The last time the index rose at least 1.5 percent for four weeks in a row was in early 2009, in the wake of the financial crisis, according to LPL Financial Senior Market Strategist Ryan Detrick.

The U.S. trade imbalance with China has been a source of constant complaints from President Donald Trump. That deficit grew to a record \$323.3 billion in 2018, and eliminating it could mean hundreds of billions of dollars in increased sales for U.S. companies. The two countries have raised taxes on billions of dollars of each other's goods in the spat over the trade deficit, Beijing's manufacturing plans, and U.S. complaints that China steals technology from foreign companies.

Stocks sank in late 2018 as investors worried that global economic growth, and U.S. growth in particular, would slow significantly. Threats including the U.S.-China trade dispute, rising interest rates in the U.S., slowing growth in China

and Europe, and unstable political situations like Brexit all made it seem like 2019 could be a disappointing year and some investors felt a recession was a possibility.

But now they're starting to think it won't get that bad. There are signs trade talks are progressing. The U.S. economy doesn't appear to have slowed much and China is working to perk up its economy. Resolving the trade dispute would also resolve an obstacle to growth for the global economy and corporate profits. The S&P 500, the main benchmark for U.S. stocks, fell 19.8 percent from late September to late December and has recovered more than half of those losses.

Trucking and logistics company J.B. Hunt Transportation jumped 6.2 percent to \$106.11 and railroad company Kansas City Southern climbed 6.1 percent to \$110.52 after their fourth-quarter reports.

European stocks jumped. Germany's DAX climbed 2.6 percent and the FTSE 100 in Britain rose 2 percent. The French CAC 40 gained 1.7 percent.

Faster economic growth would mean more demand for oil, and prices climbed. U.S. crude rose 3.3 percent to \$53.80 in New York. Brent crude, used to price international oils, added 2.5 percent to \$62.70 a barrel in London. Bond prices fell. The yield on the 10-year Treasury

note rose to 2.79 percent from 2.74 percent. Highdividend stocks like utilities lagged the rest of the market. They tend to rise when investors are worried about the economy. Tesla fell 13 percent to \$302.26 after the company

said it would cut 7 percent of its jobs. CEO Elon Musk said the cuts are meant to reduce costs as the company lowers the price for its cars. He said in a note to staff that the road ahead is "very difficult." Asian stocks also finished higher. Hong Kong's Hang Seng gained 1.2 percent and the Nikkei 225

in Japan rose 1.3 percent. Seoul's Kospi added 0.8 percent. In other commodities trading, wholesale gasoline rose 1.6 percent to \$1.45 a gallon and heating oil added 1.6 percent to \$1.92 a gallon. Natural gas

jumped 2 percent to \$3.48 per 1,000 cubic feet. Gold dropped 0.8 percent to \$1,282.70 an ounce and silver fell 0.9 percent to \$15.40 an ounce. Copper rose 1.5 percent to \$2.72 a pound.

The dollar rose to 109.79 yen from 109.23 yen. The euro fell to \$1.1370 from \$1.1390.



Property owners have certain rights that may reduce their property tax burden.

HOMEOWNERS Persons who own their resid-

ence on January 1, 2019,

may claim their home as a residential homestead. The filing of this document is only necessary if the homeowner has changed homesteads since January 1, 2018, or has become eligible for additional exemptions since last year. Homeowners mav also defer the portion of the tax on their residence homestead if the value of the home was raised more than 5% above the previous year. Although the tax collection is deferred, interest continues to run on the unpaid portion of tax at a rate of 8% per annum and the deferred tax remains a lien on the property. To apply for the deferral, the owner should contact the appraisal district

Persons who are disabled under Social Security law are entitled to additional exemptions on their residential homestead. Disabled applicants must apply with the appraisal district and furnish a determination letter from Social Security.

PERSONS WHO ARE OVER 65 YEARS OF AGE

Persons who are over 65

years of age or disabled persons may file for additional exemptions and a ceiling on school taxes for their residential homestead if they become 65 during 2019. Over-65 persons should apply for this exemption at the appraisal district office in their area. Over-65 persons are also eligible to defer paying the tax on their residential homestead is they wish. The taxes continue to accrue during the deferral along with an interest rate of 8% annually,

DISABLED VETERANS

but no attempt will be made

to force payment during the

deferral.

The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by disabled veterans or surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. Another partial exemption is for homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to the disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to the percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent homestead exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and surviving

spouses of U.S. armed ser-

vice members killed in action.

FIRST RESPONDERS

The eligible surviving spouse of a first responder killed in the line of duty is allowed a 100 percent homestead exemption if the homestead was in effect before the first responder's death and the surviving spouse has not remarried since the death of the first responder.

FARM AND RANCH OWNERS

Farmers and ranchers may be entitled to receive an alternate method of appraisal determined by the farm income to the property. This method is available to farms and ranches commercially raising crops or livestock or which are used as a wildlife habitat under State guidelines. An application for agricultural use value and additional information is available from your appraisal district. Re-filing is only necessary if requested to do so by the Chief Appraiser or if ownership has changed.

EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS

Exemption applications for all property tax exemptions including total exemptions for charitable, religious, and other total exemptions may be obtained from the appraisal district in your county or through the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts.

BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNERS

State law now requires the filing of a rendition declaring what types of business personal property that a person or company owns. Failure to file the rendition will result in a 10% penalty. If a fraudulent rendition is filed, a 50% penalty is mandated. A rendition can be obtained from the appraisal district office where the property is located. A 30-day filing extension is available by written request.

VEHICLE INVENTORY DECLARATION

DEALER'S MOTOR

State law requires the filing of a Declaration of a Dealer's Motor Vehicle Inventory with the appraisal district office and county tax assessor-collector's office. Form 50-244 and all supporting documentation must be filed no later than Feb. 1st. A dealer who fails to file a Declaration will be imposed a penalty. Information regarding penalties can be obtained from the appraisal office or Comptroller's website.

Updated Property Tax Information Now Available for Glasscock County **Taxpayers**

Garden City, Texas — New and updated property tax information has just been compiled by Glasscock County Appraisal District and is available now to assist taxpayers. This property tax information is current and covers a wide range of topics, such as taxpayer remedies, exemptions

and appraisals, and is of value to select groups, such as disabled veterans and persons who are age 65 or older.

"Whether you are a homeowner, business owner, disabled veteran or a taxpayer, it's important you know your rights concerning the property tax laws." said Priscilla A. Ginnetti, Chief Appraiser of the Glasscock County Appraisal District. 'You can contact us about any property tax issues with full confidence that we will provide you the most complete, accurate and up-todate available information to assist you."

This includes information about the following programs.

- Property Tax Exemptions for Disabled Veterans - The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by veterans who are disabled, surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. This includes homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to the disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and for surviving spouses of U.S. armed service members
- killed in action. Property Tax Exemptions Non-profit organizations that meet statutory requirements may seek property tax exemptions and must apply to their county appraisal district by a specific date. Busi-

nesses that receive tax abatements granted by taxing units; ship inventory out of Texas that may be eligible for the "freeport" exemption; store certain goods in transit in warehouses that are moved within 175 days; construct, install or acquire pollution control property; own and operate energy storage systems; convert landfill-generated gas; or store offshore drilling equipment while not in use may also be eligible for statutory exemptions

- Rendering Taxable Property - If a business owns tangible personal property that is used to produce income, the business must file a rendition with its local county appraisal district by a specified date. Personal property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming
- Appraisal Notices Normally, taxpayers receive a notice of appraised value from the appropriate local county appraisal district. The city, county, school districts and other local taxing units will use the appraisal district's value to set property taxes for the coming year.
- · Property Taxpayer Remedies - This Comptroller publication explains in detail how to protest a property appraisal, what issues the county appraisal review board (ARB) can consider and what to expect during a protest hearing. The publication also discusses the option of taking a taxpayer's case to district court, the State Office of Administrative Hearings or binding arbitration if the taxpayer is dissatisfied with the outcome of the

ARB hearing Homestead Exemptions – A homestead is generally defined as the home and land used as the owner's principal residence on Jan. 1 of the tax year. A homestead exemption reduces the appraised value of the home and, as a result, lowers property taxes. Applications are submitted to the appropriate local county appraisal district.

 Productivity Appraisal – Property owners who use land for timber land production, agricultural purposes or wildlife management can be granted property tax relief on their land. They may apply to their local county appraisal district for an agricultural appraisal which may result in a lower appraisal of the land based on how much the taxpayer produces, versus what the land would sell for in the open market.

 Residence Homestead **Tax Deferral** - Texas homeowners may postpone paying the currently delinquent property taxes due on the appreciating value of their homes by filing a tax deferral affidavit at their local county appraisal district. This tax relief allows homeowners to pay the property taxes on 105 percent of the preceding year's appraised value of their homestead, plus the taxes on any new improvements to the homestead. The remaining taxes are postponed, but not cancelled, with interest accruing at 8

percent per year. Property Tax Deferral for Persons Age 65 or Older or **Disabled Homeowners -**Texans who are age 65 or older or disabled, as defined by law, may postpone paying current and delinquent property taxes on their homes by signing a tax deferral affidavit. Once the affidavit is on

file, taxes are deferred, but not cancelled, as long as the owner continues to own and live in the home. Interest continues to accrue on unpaid taxes. You may obtain a deferral affidavit at the appraisal district.

 Notice of Availability of **Electronic Communication**

 In appraisal districts located in counties with a population of more than 200,000 or that have authorized electronic communications, and that have implemented a system that allows such communications, chief appraisers and ARBs may communicate electronically through email or other media with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically instead of mailing

 Protesting Property Appraisal Values - Property owners who disagree with the appraisal district's appraisal of their property for local taxes or for any other action that adversely affects them may protest their property value to the appraisal district's ARB.

a global economic slowdown, would endure another blow.

The travel and tourism industries generate about \$1.6 trillion in U.S. economic activity — one-twelfth of the economy — and one in 20 jobs, according to the Commerce Department. Macroeconomic Advisers says it now expects the economy to expand at just a 1.4 percent annual rate in the first three months of this year, down from its previous forecast of 1.6 percent, because of reduced government spending during the shutdown.

America's air-travel system will face its sternest this weekend, which coincides with Martin Luther King Jr. Day on Monday, a federal holiday. The Transportation Security Administration predicts it will screen over 8 million passengers between Friday and Monday, up 10.8 percent from last year's MLK weekend. And it will do so with fewer screeners. On Thursday, the TSA said 6.4 percent of screeners missed work — nearly double the 3.8 percent rate on the same day in 2018.

A TSA spokesman said the agency was offering overtime to screeners for this weekend, though those workers wouldn't be paid — for their regular pay or for overtime— until the shutdown eventually ends.

On top of potentially longer airport security lines this weekend, a blast of winter weather could snarl travel this weekend in the Midwest and Northeast.

Hartsfield-Jackson International, home to Delta Air Lines, has likely been the hardest hit airport. Delta said this week that the shutdown will cost it \$25 million in January because fewer federal employees and contractors will be flying. By contrast, United Airlines, which has a substantial presence around Washington, D.C., said it hasn't felt much impact yet.

But the airlines fear that if the shutdown doesn't end soon, more TSA agents will call in sick or quit. A shortage of screeners would cause security lines to swell. Air traffic controllers, who are also working without pay, say they, too, are short-staffed. If the controller shortage became severe enough, the government could restrict the number of flights, though some analysts think that's unlikely.

"Luckily this is the low season — January is one of the weakest months of the year," said Savanthi Syth, an airline analyst for Raymond James. "This spilling into February is a real concern. The risk is that the longer this drags out, it might cause some passengers to say, 'I don't want to deal with all the hassle, maybe I won't take

Consumers are, in fact, taking a dimmer view of the economy, in part because of the shutdown. A measure of consumer confidence fell this month by the most in more than six years, according to the University of Michigan, which conducts the survey. If Americans were to cut back on travel and other discretionary

spending, it would weaken consumer spending, the U.S. company's primary

Laura Mandala, who runs a travel and tourism research firm, said shutdown might discourage international travelers, too.

"These uncertainties will result in fewer conferences being booked," Mandala said, leading to "convention and hotel staff layoffs, reduced schedules, resulting in less income for workers to spend in the local

Hotels are starting to feel the impact, particularly in the Washington, D.C., region but also in other cities with substantial federal workforces, such as San Diego, which has a large naval

In the Washington area, including its nearby suburbs in Maryland and Virginia, hotel revenue plunged 26 percent in the second week of January compared with the same period last year, according to STR, a travel research firm. That's much steeper than the 8 percent decline that occurred nationwide.

Michael Bellisario, an analyst for investment bank R.W. Baird, suggested that other factors accounted for the most of the nationwide drop but said the shutdown almost certainly played a role.

"In no way is the government shutdown a positive for hotel demand and travel," Bellisario said.

If the shutdown lingers and people see more reports of long TSA lines on television news, "they will say, 'Oh wow, traveling is hard,' and that impacts the hotel industry," said Jan Freitag, a senior vice president at

For now, though, the most visible impact has been at airports. One of the seven checkpoints at Houston's main airport has been closed all week and will remain so indefinitely, a spokesman said. Miami closed one concourse during the afternoons and evenings last weekend. On the other hand, officials at airports in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago and Miami said they weren't experiencing any problems.

The problems would emerge if the shutdown persists, and the damage would extend to the private companies that operate airport shops and restaurants.

Mike Boyd, an airport consultant in Colorado, noted that a pullback in travel would be felt most in airports that are heavily dependent on government employees such as Reagan National Airport outside Washington, Manhattan Regional Airport in Kansas, near the Army's Fort Riley, and Watertown International Airport in upstate New York, near Fort Drum.

Federal employees going without pay — there are about 800,000 of them, including 420,000 who are still working — are already suffering, of course.

"We still have to make sure our kids eat, make sure to have a roof over their head," said Shalique Caraballo, whose wife is a TSA worker in Atlanta. "We sweat in private and don't let the kids see the struggle."







In discussing the storylines for Season 3 of his HBO comedy "Crashing," Pete Holmes quotes advice he received from fellow stand-up comic Mike Birbiglia when he created the half-hour series.

"He said, 'If you're not telling secrets, who cares?' "says Holmes, a veteran stand-up whose fictionalized alter ego returns for the first of eight episodes Sunday, Jan. 20. "Which I think is really interesting. So we're talking about comedy, which obviously is well-traversed terrain, so we always want to try and tell some sort of secret about comedy. Obviously in Season 1, we talked about warm-ups; in Season 2, we talked about the alt scene and the college scene; and Season 3, we're starting to talk about the niche markets that you can work in."

And in these, says Holmes, one can find substantial work. There is the Jewish circuit, typically in-temple performances where Jewish humor is prevalent. There is also the Christian circuit and the "clean" circuit, which offers family-oriented fare. It's just a matter of which way a comic wants to steer their career.

"You sort of see them like exits on the highway when you're starting," Holmes explains, "and it's an interesting choice every performer needs to make, like, 'Should I take this exit or should I keep going? And if I keep going, how much gas is in my tank and can I make it to the next exit or should I just take what's in front of me?'

"For me, I never did the Christian circuit," he continues. "I did a lot of the clean circuit. I would do shows in like Utah, for example, or Disneyland, places where you had to be clean. That was as close as I came to doing religious shows. Although that being said, I did do some Jewish shows. I've dabbled and I've certainly done some

It's not often you hear restaurant owners say nice things about food trucks, what with the business they tend to take away. So when stuffed with Cajun grilled shrimp. Los Angeles-based chef and restaurateur Brad Miller extols their virtues on his new Cooking Channel series "Food Truck Nation," his

"Some of these people are putting out sometimes Michelin-level food on food trucks," he says. "The cool thing about all these food trucks for me is just that they have so much creativity and so much energy and the reason is because when people find out about them, they go to them. ... Because people are checking their Instagram or checking their Twitter, they're checking their Facebook just to go for that cuisine. They're going there specifically for those food items, for exactly what you're doing."

In the six-episode half-hour series, which premieres Tuesday, Jan. 22, Miller heads to different points across the country to sample some of the unique and varied creations coming out of these mobile kitchens, such as the surf and turf burrito from the Bibuta food truck in Minneapolis; the Belgian waffles topped with cookie butter from Belgian Waffle Crafters in Durham, N.C.; the funnel cake courtesy of Drizzle Truck in California; and the wood-fired Neapolitan-style pizza produced in under 90 seconds by Blue Fire Pizza in St. Paul, Minn.

But in Tuesday's opener, Miller stays local to check out Billionaire Burger Boyz in

South Central Los Angeles, home of the Hello Burger, which is an oversized beef patty

"It's like literally a burger where they cook cheese and shrimp in the inside of the burger and it has like two fried eggs on it, and a lobster. It's insane," he says. "You take a bite and it's like leaking shrimp. Cannot not hear about it if you live in L.A."

And while that was a culinary delight, Miller says equally as impressive was the subject of an episode airing later in the season, Bibuta's surf and turf burrito. The invention of owner and master sushi chef Billy Tserenbat, it's filled with raw tuna and wagyu beef and was, says Miller, "one of the best things I have ever tasted."

"They do the rice paper on the outside; that's your tortilla, sort of," he explains. "And then on the inside he does tuna, scallions and then he does basically like a reduction of soy sauce, sugar, ginger and a little bit of sesame seed oil and he just purees that up and that gets drizzled over that. And then he does the A5 wagyu cut in little pieces, cut into strips, and he actually sears them ... with salt and he gently places them in the burrito and then rolls it up with the sushi rice and paper.

"I was shocked," he continues. "I mean, the whole crew was like, 'This is one of the best things I've ever tasted.' And it's in Minnesota.




