## Commission suspends Michelle Araujo with pay

The State Commission on Judicial Conduct, on April 5, 2007, ordered that Lockney J.P. Michelle Araujo be suspended with pay from the office of Justice of the Peace and from the office of Municipal Court Judge for the City of Lockney.

The Order of Suspension was made after the State Commission was presented with information on the misdemeanor charges of Official Oppression filed by Floyd County Attorney Lex Herrington against Araujo on March 23, 2007 in County Court.

The ruling by the Commission stated, "Having considered the

information, the State Commission on Judicial Conduct concluded that the offense charged is a misdemeanor involving official misconduct, and determined that Michelle Araujo should be Suspended With Pay...and that such suspension should remain in effect until further orders of the Commission or an order of the court having competent jurisdiction over the offense charged."

The order was signed by the Honorable Michael R. Fields, Vice Chair of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct.

According to the Commission's Executive Direc-

tor, Seana Willing, this order stands until the Official Oppression misdemeanor case is resolved by a "Guilty" or "Not Guilty" verdict in County Court, or Araujo is indicted by a Grand Jury on the Felony Charge of Aggravated Assault With a Deadly Weapon.

Araujo was arrested March 10, 2007 for allegedly shooting her husband, Romeo. The case has not been brought before Floyd County Grand Jurors yet.

"Araujo is entitled to her day in court," said Willing. "If she is indicted the Commission would reevaluate this Order."

## Man killed in drilling rig accident in Floyd County

Brandon Garrett, 23, of Levelland, was killed Sunday, April 8, in an accident while working for the Patterson UTI Drilling Rig at the Maurice Campbell Lease Well #1 in Floyd County.

Investigations into the accident were still on-going as of press time, but initial reports say Garrett became tangled in a wench which led to injuries that caused his death.

Emergency personnel were called to the scene at approxi-

mately 2:00 p.m. Floyd County J.P. Tali Jackson was called to the scene and pronounced Garrett dead at 4:10 p.m.

The gas rig is located 2 miles North of Hwy. 70 & County Rd. 283, and 3/4 miles west of 283. The land is leased by BASA Resources Inc.

The Head Duarte Funeral Home in Levelland will be handling funeral arrangements.

Funeral services were at 1:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 11 at Head Duarte Funeral Home

Chapel. Garrett was born Feb. 23, 1984 to Robert David and Darling Garrett in Lubbock.

He is survived by his daughter, Cheyenne Garrett of Levelland; mother, Darling (Jerry) Murrell of New Mexico, sisters, Carrie Murrell and Cassandra Murrell, both of Levelland, and Christmas Murrell, of College Station; brothers, Michael Tucker and David Tucker, of Snyder. He was preceded in death by his father, Robert David Garrett.

## Late freeze may cause damage to promising wheat crops

Floyd County received a late freeze last Saturday and Sunday, April 7-8, which probably could cause some serious damage to the county's wheat crop, according to Floyd County Agent J.D.

Ragland.

Ragland told the Hesperian-Beacon, "I looked on the weather data recorded at our station located north of Lockney and it showed the temperature stayed at 28 degrees, or colder, for over 28

hours straight. The freeze began at 4 a.m. Saturday morning and continued to freeze until 7 a.m. Sunday morning."

"It will take from ten days to two weeks before producers will

Early voting can be done in the LISD Administration office.

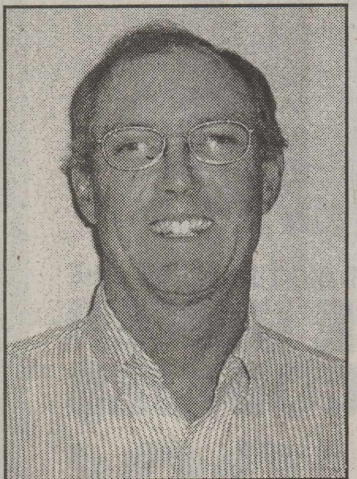
Running At-Large will be incumbent Lonnie Hooten. He is being challenged by Lindan Morris.

LONNY HOOTEN

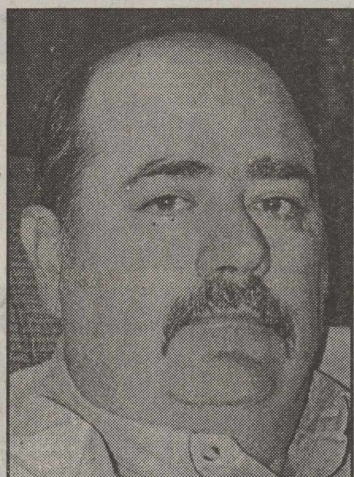

# FISD chooses First Southwest to sell bonds

The FISD Board met Thursday, April 5, and approved First Southwest Company of Lubbock to sell the \$5.5 million construction school bonds and the board cancelled two school district positions from the May 12th elections due to no opposition.  
Concerning the school bonds, Superintendent Jerry Vaughn told the board, "I recommend First Southwest to handle the marketing, selling and doing the paper

work for our \$5.5 million school bonds. They are already familiar with this and have been working with us."  
Following Board Member Kerry Pratt's inquiry as to how much would be First Southwest's fee for selling the bonds, Superintendent Vaughn responded, "This is a standard contract. First Southwest will get a \$9,000 fee for selling the first million dollars worth of bonds, \$4 per thou-

sand dollars for selling the next \$4 million worth of bonds (a \$16,000 fee), and \$2 per thousand dollars for selling the next \$500,000 worth of bonds (a \$1,000 fee). And it looks like we will get EDA funding. It looks good for us."  
The motion by Pratt, and seconded by Board Member Marty Lucke, to approve the First Southwest contract passed unanimously. (Board Members Rachel Castillo and Bart Greer were absent from the meeting.)  
The board approved both the certification and the order to cancel two election positions in the May 12th General Election, due to lack of opposition. Election positions cancelled were District 4 (Incumbent Amado Morales) and District 5 (Incumbent Bart Greer).

FISD Early Voting for Board position At Large, with Incumbent Marty Lucke running against Tom Farris, will be at the FISD office from April 30th to May 8th, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On May 12th in the General Election the voting will be at the Massie Activity Center, according to Superintendent Vaughn.  
In other matters, the board approved unanimously to spend \$12,744.50 for the upcoming New York City trip of FHS BPA (Business Professionals of America) group.  
Superintendent Vaughn told the board, "This is above our \$10,000 spending limit without board approval. However, we will get some money back from the 8 students and two sponsors with their fund raisers. This amount includes transportation,

hotels, taxis, etc."  
The board approved the selling of three older backup school buses at the ESC 17 Bus Auction at Abilene. According to Vaughn, these three buses are not being used and they are 1980's models. "These are the oldest buses in our fleet and we get better prices at these auctions. We will still have three other backup buses on hand that we can use. We may trade in one of these other buses for a new one maybe in May or June."  
Business Manager Sharon Rainwater gave the board the March Tax Statement and the Cash Flow Report. The Tax Statement showed \$1,842,587.97 collected, which is 93.56 percent. The Cash Flow Report showed General Operating at \$4,174,464.88, with CD's at \$3,387,000.00 and a Total of \$7,561,464.88.  
Board Member Pratt asked for clarification on certain bills paid. One bill was \$3,047.44 to Hammond Sheet Metal, which \$2,450.00 was for a new unit at R.C. Andrews Elementary and the rest was for repairs at other campuses, according to Vaughn and Rainwater. Another bill was \$1,910.00 to Pediatric Therapy, which was for the Special Ed

class, according to Vaughn.  
A bill for \$13,924.25 to Education Service Center, was quarterly payments, according to Rainwater. Another bill was \$1,834.85 to Apple Inc., which was for repairs on laptops not in warranty. Another bill was \$1,967.08 to Ashley Furniture Home Stores, which was for new furniture in the seating area of the newly remodeled high school library, according to Vaughn.  
Three resignations were accepted by the board. They were: Sam Skidmore, coach at FJHS; Jan Beedy, Grade 5 teacher at R.C. Andrews Elementary; and Ilda Vasquez, Library Aide at R.C. Andrews Elementary.  
The board conducted two closed meetings. One was for discussion on the performances of secretaries, teacher assistants, cafeteria, custodial and maintenance employees and the other closed meeting was discussion about the value of Real Property of the Caprock Shared Services Arrangement.  
Following the closed sessions, the board approved the continuation of the contracts of the previously mentioned employees and the board approved a motion to retain a legal firm for the dissolution of the CSSA properties.

The tables were decorated with a spring motif of bunnies and Easter eggs. Refreshments were served to fourteen members and one guest.

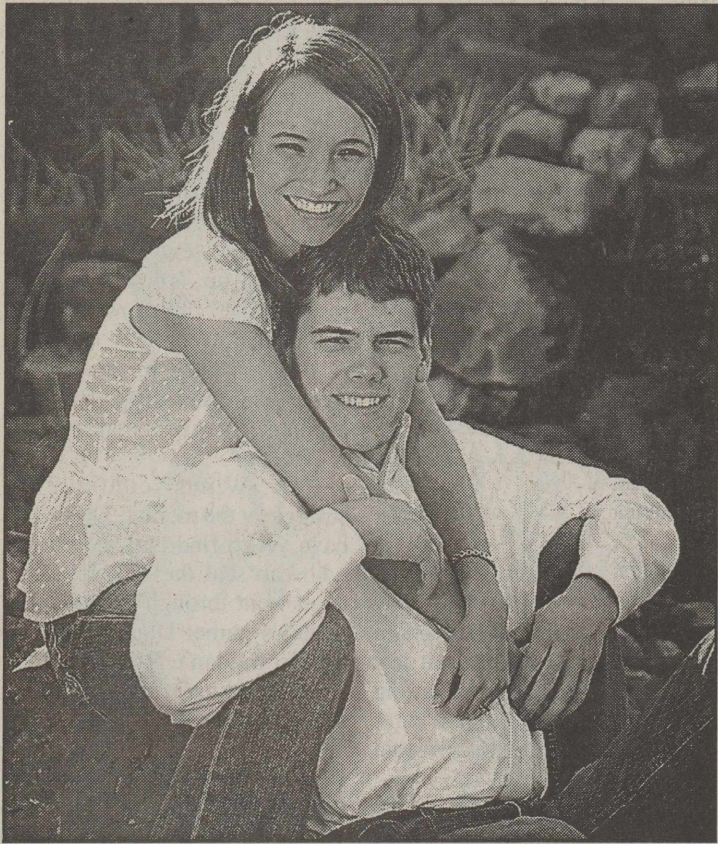
Roll call was answered with a description of the Easter hat each member was wearing.

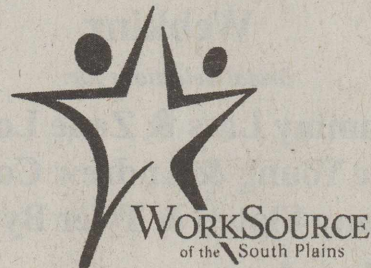

The schedule for the Plains Cotton Growers 50th Annual Meeting is set and High Plains cotton producers and all agriculture industry members are invited to participate.

PCG's meeting is scheduled for Friday, April 13 and will begin with registration at 8:30 a.m. in the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center Banquet Hall. Immediately following the PCG meeting FiberMax Cotton Seed is sponsoring a free luncheon honoring members of the 2006 FiberMax "One Ton Club" and for attendees of the PCG Annual Meeting.

The PCG Annual Meeting is being held in conjunction with the Texas Cotton Ginners Annual Meeting and Trade Show, April 12-13, at the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center.

Designed to give an in-depth look into the processes and issues that will shape the 2007 Farm Bill debate, PCG's 50th Annual Meeting will be an information packed event, sure to provide value to all who attend.

Congressman Jerry Moran of Kansas will provide this year's keynote address to the PCG membership. Moran is a ten year veteran of the House Agriculture Committee. He is also the Ranking Republican member of the General Farm Commodities and Risk Management Subcommittee that will write the Commodity Title of the 2007 Farm Bill.

Three other speakers have also been confirmed for the PCG meeting. Joining Rep. Moran are Washington-based farm policy analyst James R. Wiesemeyer, former Lubbock Congressman Larry Combest and Cotton Board Chairman Nancy Marino.

Wiesemeyer, who has covered farm policy in Washington, DC for more than two decades, is Vice President-Washington Bureau for Informa Economics and writes the "Inside Washington" column for Agweb's Pro Farmer newsletter.

Wiesemeyer has been asked on draw on his 20 plus year's of experience covering the Washington agriculture scene to give his thoughts and observations on the politics and personalities that will shape the 2007 Farm Bill debate.

Combest is a former Chairman of the House Committee on

Agriculture and was the driving force behind the development and passage of the Food Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, also known as the 2002 Farm Bill.

Combest has been asked to discuss the creation of the Southwest Council of Agribusiness (SWCA) and to share his views on the status of the SWCA effort to seek and extension of the provisions of the 2002 Farm Bill.

Rounding out the PCG Annual Meeting schedule is Cotton Board Chairman Nancy Marino, the first importer member to hold that position. PCG President Mike Hughes who will present his report to the organization's membership. PCG Executive Vice President Steve Verett, and a short video presentation highlighting the efforts of Cotton Council International, the export promotion arm of the U.S. cotton industry.

**Seed Use agreement now required for Bt Cotton purchased in Texas Panhandle**

Monsanto Corporation is mailing information to farmers and cotton seed distributors in the northern Texas Panhandle to inform them of a new policy regarding the sale and use of Bollgard/Bollgard II cotton seed varieties in that area.

The new Monsanto policy is being implemented to help insure full understanding of current Bt cotton label restrictions and stems from provisions of the federal Bollgard/Bollgard II technology registration which currently prohibits the planting of the cotton Bt technology in the following Texas counties: Carson, Dallam, Hansford, Hartley, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Roberts and Sherman.

Monsanto officials note that producers in counties contiguous to the ten listed above will be asked to sign a Seed Use Agreement (SUA) that explains the current planting restrictions and

asks producers to identify where the Bt cotton seed they purchase will be planted.

Growers purchasing Bt cotton in the following counties in Texas, New Mexico, and Oklahoma are included in the new rule and will be required to complete the SUA form before seed will be delivered: Texas - Armstrong, Carson, Dallam, Donley, Grey, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, and Wheeler; New Mexico - Harding, Quay, Union; Oklahoma - Beaver, Cimarron, Ellis, Harper, Roger Mills and Texas.

The Bollgard/Bollgard II planting restriction is required by the Environmental Protection Agency as part of the Insect Resistance Management (IRM) plan for ten counties of the Texas Panhandle region where a significant amount of Bt corn is also planted.

Details of the restriction are included in Monsanto's 2007 Technology Use Guide and 2007 IRM Guide. Growers are obligated by their Monsanto Technology/Stewardship Agreement limited use license to comply with this restriction.

Failure to comply with the label restriction would be a breach of the Monsanto grower license resulting in loss of access to the technology and could also be found to be a violation of federal law resulting in civil or criminal penalties.

Monsanto's goal in implementing the new SUA is to establish and document awareness of and compliance with the planting restriction in these counties. The Seed Use agreement must be signed by the grower prior to shipment or delivery of any Bt cotton seed in the specified region.

With the recent rise in cotton acreage in Texas Panhandle counties north of Amarillo, Plains

Cotton Growers and the Corn Producer Association of Texas are working together with Texas Cooperative Extension to evaluate entomological data and determine what alternatives may exist that would allow future planting of Bt cotton and Bt corn in the area simultaneously.

Until a more permanent solution is found, Monsanto's decision to have producers that purchase Bt cotton seed in the counties contiguous to the ten named in the Bollgard/Bollgard II label will improve the likelihood that Bt cotton is not planted in violation of current label restrictions.

know how much damage the freeze caused to the wheat planted in the county," said Ragland.

Floyd County may have fared better than some of the High Plains counties, according to Ragland. Perryton never dropped below 27 degrees, but Dimmitt dropped to 24 degrees and did not get above 26 degree for 30 hours.

Ragland said, "Temperatures around 25 degrees for a significant amount of time is when I start getting nervous about wheat in the joint stage. Temperatures

at 28 degrees are a concern in the late boot stage."

The real key is how cold and for how long did the wheat canopy (the stalk covering the wheat grain) get? The moisture in the canopy and in the soil helps keep the canopy temperatures warmer for a while compared to the air temperature, according to Ragland.

Floyd County received some snow along with the freeze, but not as much as the Lubbock area which received around 2.5 inches early Saturday morning.
