Tax Assessor Refuses To Deputize Texan Criticizes Elimination Of Bilingual Program

Mexican-Americans Hurt, Professor Says

EL PASO (AP) — Elimination of an \$8 million federal program aimed at instructing thousands of Mexican-American school children in the English language will have disastrous effects, a professor at the University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP) said today.

Dr. Raymond Past, director of the program at UTEP, said the Nixon administration has decided to eliminate the training of teachers in bilingual education. Past called the move "an educational tragedy."

The announcement of the termination of the bilingual education program known as the Basic Studies Program in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW) came in a letter from HEW associate commissioner Don Davies, Past said.

"STAND UP AND TAKE A LOOK"

This coming Wednesday, Oct. 15, over 500 Universities across the nation will take part in a peaceful demonstration in respect to the memory of over 45,000 Americans who died in Vietnam. The movement, known as the Vietnam Moratorium, will consist of the signing of petitions to be sent to the President, a silent vigil, and a symposium of speakers discussing varying aspects of the Vietnam war as related to their respective fields of employment.

The Moratorium is supported by numerous organizations and groups stretching from Wall Street to Berkeley. Some of the organizations include The American Friend Service, Lubbock Ecumenical Council, The University Young Republicans, Wesley Foundation Student Steering Committee, and the Student Action Organization, all in Lubbock. Of the nations congress, 54 senators and 101 representatives signed petitions in conjunction with the Moratorium. Sen. Edmund S. Muskie, (D) Maine, said, "...your aim is constructive and the method suggested for using the time made available by the Moratorium is useful."

Perhaps the Moratorium will be an important step in bridging the generation gap but if the Moratorium Committee and its allies succeed in bringing an end to the war, both generations may breathe easier. Stand back and take a look, think carefully, and support the men in Vietnam by observing the Moratorium and bringing the boys home. NO REGISTRATION Tax Assessor Refuses to Deputize

In spite of the great need to begin early to register the Lubbock voters, Russel Hardin, our local tax assessor, refuses to deputize anybody to help register the people.

This information came to us directly from our own editor who had a personal interview with Russel Hardin. This interview was asked for by Neptali De León, our editor, because of 2 letters sent out by the secretary of state, Martin Dies Jr.

In the letter sent to all newspapers, the secretary of state urged all editors to cooperate with the local tax assessors by disseminating as much information as possible concerning the need to get people to register early.

In another letter sent out to all tax assessors, the Secretary of State requests all tax assessors to immediately deputize some people to go out and register all qualified voters.

Our editor went with this information, but Mr. Hardin stated that the Secretary of State did not run his office, and that he would not deputize anyone until January. He did give our editor a few blank copies of the forms to request registration and did show him what the forms used for applications to become deputies look like.

The reasons given by Mr. Hardin were that he could not deputize our people (the Mexican American people?) because that would be unfair to the other groups and he would have to deputize them too. To this our editor responded affirmatively and simply asked that all groups be deputized.

Mr. Russel Hardin, our tax assessor, then stated that this would create problems in that if registration were to start this early some people would register 2 or 3 times. Our editor responded that a duplication now and then might be worth the creation of responsible citizens who would be able to vote.

All in all, Mr. Hardin was quite clear about the fact that he does not deputize, or ever did, anyone until January.

Indians Celebrate Gandhi Birthday

NEW DELHI (AP) — Subdued by rioting between Hindus and Moslems, India began celebrating Wednesday the 100th anniversary of the birth of Mohandas K. Gandhi—the independence leader who preached non violence and communal harmony.

The religious warfare in Gandhi's home state of Gujarat, which left a reported 1,000 dead last week, dampened the enthusiasm that had been anticipated for the festivities.

President V.V. Giri, in a special broadcast, said the latest fighting was a "rude reminder that we have not yet cleansed ourselves..."

"These happenings are no isolated phenomenon," he added. "They are a symptom of the malady that has gripped our body politic, our public life."

In an unusually strong speech, Giri questioned whether Indians could still "preach his (Gandhi's) message, to hold aloft his light to the world."

VEGA NUÑEZ GIVES RECITAL

Alfonso Vega Nuñez, Mexican Organist will present a recital, Thursday October 16 at 8:15 P.M. at First Methodist Church.

The public is invited and particularly the Mexican American people to welcome this fine artist.

He was born in 1924 in the small and picturesque village of Perundiro - near Morelia - in the State of Michoacan, Mexico.

Nuñez entered the Sacred Music School of Morelia at the age of eleven and the Cathedral Choir of the same city. At 16, he received the diploma of teacher in Gregorian Chant and three years later, he was graduated as a composer.

As a recitalist, he presented his first public performance on November 16, 1949 and for the First Panamerican Congress of Sacred Music. He received his doctorate in music at the same time.

Alfonso Vega Nuñez has performed throughout South America and the Caribbean, with all the Symphonic Orchestras of Mexico and in some southern States in this country as well as the East. This will be his second American tour. He has recorded for Cook Records and recently an all-Bach Stereo, Number 1450, on the Peerless Label.

He is now organist of the Morelia Cathedral, teaches at the Morelia School of Music and is Director of the Fine Arts Institute. He has a charming wife and six children. He was invited to play at the World Eucharistic Congress in Bogota Colombia.

bad since the Revolutionary War," the San Antonio Democrat said in an interview.

Gonzalez said the worst thing about the border-long crackdown on narcotics traffic was that the Nixon administration did not tell the Mexican government of the real scope and economic implications of Intercept.

"It was a unilateral decision," he said.

No Advance Notice

He said his sources indicate the details of the project were not disclosed in advance to Mexican officials, let alone any forecast on what their border cities could expect in dropping business and tourist funds.

A delegation from Mexico left Sunday for Washington and a series of talks with the State Department. The Mexicans will argue that Intercept be stopped because of its damage to border economies.

Last week a three-hour detention of a Mexican counsel at El Paso caused the Mexican government to file a protest with the State Department.

This weekend the U. S. Customs Bureau sent the word to its men on the 2,000-mile border that Mexican government officials, including policemen, should be passed through without the long wait and detailed examination which other travelers face.

Frustration Commonplace

Gonzalez said smaller-scale incidents of frustration and bitterness are becoming commonplace in the Mexican border towns left nearly deserted because tourist stay away rather than face hours-long delays in returning to the United States.

Worst of all, Gonzalez said, the Intercept operation is not as effective in catching drug smugglers than the previous method of surprise spot checks, which allows free movement of people between countries.

"But they're hardheaded," he said of the Intercept planners.

They're not running, they're determined to keep it going."

Gonzalez claimed that the U.S.-Canadian border has been left partly unguarded because customs agents have been sent south to help with Intercept. Gonzalez asserted that the majority of heroin smuggled into this country comes through Canada.

MY MODEST PROPOSAL

Yes, we have too many different smelling and different colored people. We also have too many women. But why not capitalize on this fact. Let us bring a virtue from a fault.

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
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La Juventud Sabe a Dónde va,

Think about it young Chicanos, if you leave the "barrio" for a better thing, who is going to fight for your brothers and sisters and children? Now is the time to fight for equality. Join the groups who are interested in you and your people who are interested in you and your raza.



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In general, with the exception of gasoline, tires represent a higher operating cost than any other single item on a car. Fast cornering wears tires as quickly as fast starting and stopping will, and in order to get maximum life from your tires, there are a few maintenance steps you must do.

1. Rotate the tires every 5000 miles. If the spare tire is as good or nearly as good as the others, include it in the rotation. If the tires are rotated properly, they will usually wear evenly, all needing replacement at once.

2. Have any shaky tires balanced. An unbalanced tire will wear down in some spots but not in others. A good way to tell an unbalanced tire:

Once a tire is removed from the wheel, it requires rebalancing unless care is taken to put it back in the same position.

3. Replace worn shock absorbers. Bad shocks will cause very rapid and uneven tire wear. The effects will often look similar to an unbalanced tire. Bad shocks also cause instability on curves.

4. Keep the front end aligned. The worst way a front end can be out of alignment is for the toe-in-toe-out to be misadjusted. This single factor can cause faster more uneven tire wear than can any other factor. Look for one side of a front tire to be more worn than the other: this means your toe-in-toe-out needs adjusting. Sometimes a front end part needs replacement. It may make it impossible to keep the front end aligned.
