

RENUDAN CLASES ENERO 9 Y 10

Las clases de educación básica resumirán sus actividades en Enero 9 y 10. Estas clases son gratuitas para todos los adultos de 17 años o más que han terminado su high school para que puedan obtener su diploma.

Estas clases son designadas para poder elevar la educación de las personas que no han terminado sus estudios secundarios y al mismo tiempo prepararlos para un mejor empleo, al mismo tiempo son designadas para la preparación del examen para su certificado que es equivalente a su diploma de High School. Los libros y todo material de educación serán proporcionado por el estado y el gobierno federal.

Lunes y Miércoles, las clases se juntaran en los siguientes lugares: Makenzie Jr. High, Harwell Elementary, Struggs Jr. High and Matthews Jr. High en Lubbock.

Martes y Jueves, las clases se juntaran en Alderson Jr. High, Martin Elementary, O. L. Slaton Jr. High, y Monterey High en Lubbock y en Crosbyton, Idalou, y Morton.

Lunes y Jueves, las clases se juntaran en Frenship y Muleshoe. Martes y Jueves las clases resumirán sus actividades en Slaton, Texas en Enero 17 y el Miércoles y Jueves, las clases volverán a comenzar el día 18 de Enero en Post Texas.

El Centro de Ensenasas de Adultos (Adult Learning Center) situado en 2013 13th St., resumirán sus actividades escolares en Enero 3 y las clases de la tarde para High school.

Los adultos pueden matricularse durante las clases están en sesión desde las 7:00 a las 9:00 p.m..

Adult Basic Education and GED classes will resume January 9 and 10. They are free to adults 17 years of age and older who have not attained a high school diploma.

The classes are designed for upgrading in basic education areas, providing possibilities for improved employment. They are also designed to help adults prepare for examinations for high school equivalency. Books and materials are provided by the state and federally funded program.

Monday-Wednesday classes will meet at Mac-

kenzie Jr. High, Warwell Elementary, Struggs Jr. High, and Matthews Jr. High in Lubbock.

Thursday-Thursday classes will meet at Alderson Jr. High, Martin Elementary, O. L. Slaton Jr. High, and Monterey High in Lubbock, and in Crosbyton, Idalou, and Morton.

Monday-Thursday Classes will meet at Frenship and Muleshoe. Tuesday-Thursday, classes will resume in Slaton on January 17 and Wednesday-Thursday classes will resume in Post on January 18.

The Adult Learning Center, 2013 13th St., resumed on January 3 and the Adult Evening High School resumed on January 4.

Adults may enroll when classes are in session, session, 7:00-9:30 p.m. For additional information, interested persons should call 765-9338 in Lubbock or the superintendents office at schools outside of Lubbock.

SCHOOL HEARING

Lubbock Public Schools have announced an open hearing January 11 concerning the allocation, request, and use of Title IV, Part B and C, funds under the Elementary, and Secondary Education Act.

Part B funds are used to purchase library materials and audiovisual equipment. Warner Sims, director of special projects for the school district, said that he anticipates a grant for next year similar to this year's allocation of \$101,759.

Part C involves funds that are allocated through competitive requests for innovative projects. There is no local allocation this year for this part of Title IV, Sims said.

The hearing will begin at 1:30 p.m., in the materials center of the School Administrative Offices Building, 1628 19th St.

Renunciaré Si Hay Deportaciones

Austin, Texas — "Si hubiera alguna deportación masiva, yo renunciaré", severas palabras vertidas por el Comisionado Nacional de Inmigración y Naturalización, Leonel Castillo, en una conferencia sobre inmigración, en la Universidad de Texas, en la ciudad de Austin.

Aludiendo al Plan Carter sobre la materia, manifestó que "este es un nivel más alto para los trabajadores indocumentados, pues ellos son los más vulnerables". Reconoció que la frontera entre Estados Unidos y México, es la más activa del mundo y que se detecta en la población mexicana inmigrante, factores de desempleo, inflación y alto índice de nacimientos.

"La solución sería económica para México, puntuálizó, es el único camino para que la gente pueda trabajar en su propio país".

Declaró además, que "la mayoría de los trabajos en los que se ocupan los mexicanos en este país, son los más simples, en los cuales no existe mayor competencia. Pero es la categoría de trabajos de una posición un poco más elevada donde existen algunos desplazamientos."

Leonel Castillo, defendió en ese encuentro con la Universidad, el Plan de Carter sobre Inmigración, diciendo que "la política de Inmigración de los Estados Unidos, fue más liberal que la de México, puesto que este país impone una multa de 10,000 pesos a la persona extranjera que intenta trabajar sin el permiso previo para hacerlo".

Agregó que los miedos y preocupaciones al Plan Carter, son exagerados sobre situaciones que no existen en el acuerdo. Por otra parte señaló que el 10% de los que fueron deportados son Chicanos.

Health Issues Vital

While U.S. hospital costs keep rising, legislation which attempts to bring these costs under control is moving slowly in congressional committees, with significant action not expected until late next year.

The Administration has proposed a plan to cap rapidly rising hospital costs by limiting the amount that hospitals can charge for their services to only a nine percent increase. Unfortunately, past experience has shown that the selective control of wages or prices is an unworkable solution to any problem with the economy. Singling out hospitals for controls disregards the most blantant contributor to spiraling costs, which is inflation. Overlapping state and federal programs seem to require ever larger staffs to administer increasing bureaucratic procedures. Exorbitant malpractice insurance premiums, increased costs for sophisticated equipment, and rising employee wages and fringe benefits all add to these hospital costs.

The Administration has called the imposition of cost controls on hospitals the first essential step toward a national health insurance program, which may be submitted to the Congress in the coming year. In another attempt to increase the already imposing power of the Department of HEW, and to bring this country one step closer to socialized medicine, HEW issued on September 23 their proposed National Health Planning Guidelines. If implemented in their present form, these Guidelines would work a grievous injustice on small rural communities in Texas. They would force many hospitals to close, force an exodus of physicians from areas already deficient in quality medical personnel, contribute to rising medical costs and needlessly jeopardize health care Texans should be able to expect.

In its misguided attempt to contain hospital costs, the Administration has proposed programs and formulae that ignore the health care needs of localities and rural areas. Rural communities in many instances have but one hospital for miles around, and it is reprehensible for the Federal Government to dictate what will and will not be

available for the future of their health care. In their present form, these Guidelines must not be allowed to become the law of the land, and I intend to maintain my efforts to insure that such high-handed policy from Washington will not be implemented.

If hospitals are not allowed to meet their expenses, cutbacks in service must necessarily follow. We must find a way to solve the problems through incentives for efficiency, not through artificial controls, or arbitrary formulas that will deny so many Texans adequate health services. Texans and all Americans deserve the best health care for their dollar. The President's Hospital Cost Containment Plan, and his Guidelines for Health Planning will not give it to anyone.

A Year For Energy

Much of the First Session of this Congress has been taken up with consideration of the Administration's energy proposals. Much of the plan, although passed by one or both Houses, has yet to receive final approval by the Congress or be signed into law by the President.

Two major bills which have become law this year, however, are the Emergency Natural Gas Act and the Department of Energy Organization Act. The Emergency Natural Gas Act, enacted in early February 1977, was President Carter's first major legislative proposal. Designed to give the President authority to deal with natural gas emergencies threatening supply cut-offs to homes, small businesses, and other specified high priority users, the bill gave the President extremely broad powers to determine, in effect, who in this nation will have heat for their homes and who will be laid off from work when plants and factories close down for lack of natural gas. One of only two Senators to vote against the bill, I did so because of a belief that it gave excessive power to the President and a fear that it would ultimately serve as a vehicle to allocate unfairly gas supplies away from Texas to serve the needs of other gas-short areas of the nation.

The Department of Energy Act, which became law on August 4, 1977, created the first cabinet-level Federal government department in
