

## Wing names top enlisted

In ceremonies Friday night at the NCO Open Mess, Reese honored three men chosen as the Senior Noncommissioned Officer of the Year (NCO), NCO and Airman of the Year.

MSgt. Watkins Peyton Jr., first sergeant of Civil Engineering was selected as the Senior NCO of the Year. He served in the aircraft maintenance field for 15 years before cross training into the first sergeant career field with tours of duty in Okinawa, Spain, Turkey, Thailand and many stateside bases. He arrived at Reese in 1974 where he cross trained in

Sergeant Peyton received a Bachelor of Science degree from Wayland Baptist College and is currently enrolled with the University of Northern Colorado pursuing a Masters Degree in Business Administration.

"The calibar of competition was outstanding this year, and I feel honored to have been selected as the NCO of the Year," said TSgt. Frank Ballard, NCOIC, Administrations and Reports, Security Police

Sergeant Ballard has served in nearly every capacity of the security police field since his enlistment in 1963. A San Antonio native, he has accomplished the feat of spending three of his six duty assignments in his home state at Perrin, Sheppard and Reese.

## Reese student pilot killed

Pilot Training Class 78-05 was killed Monday morning when his T-38 Talon crashed just north of Reese.

The 23-year-old student was 2nd Lt. Glenn A. Mathis, a native of Olney, Md. He was on a solo training flight when the Talon crashed, approximately two-miles north of runway 17.

Lieutenant Mathis was scheduled to graduate in mid May. He would have returned to Maryland for duty with the Air National Guard after grad-

The lieutenant is survived by his wife Jeanne (23) and a onemother, Ruby, lives in Sykes- Sheppard AFB, Tex. ville, Md., and his father, Lon. resides in Westminister, Md.

Court convicts airman

A Reese airman has been sentenced to six months confinement at hard labor, following his conviction by general courtsmartial for sale and possession of marijuana.

The Jan. 14 sentencing brought to an end court-martial proceedings that began here on Jan. 10. Testimony was presented before a panel of six Reese officers, headed by Military Judge, Col. Eugene E. Kelly.

The airman first class had been charged with three separate counts of sale and one count of possession of marijuana, violations of Article-134. A total of 14 ounces of marijuana were involved. The court found him guilty on all four counts.

Few matters have recently been discussed more by military people than military compensation. The subject has received extensive publicity, and it has been openly debated from a number of viewpoints. The personal concern of "Blue Suiters" is understandable, because any changes made to military compensation will have direct, personal impact on all of us.

Fortunately, our concerns can now be heard by the group charged with studying military compensation and making recommendations on its future directions. The President's Commission of Military Compensation has asked people to express ideas or opinions on the subject in letters to the commission. The group has said it will consider the information in the

letters as it develops its recommendations on military pay, entitlements, and retirement.

The Commission's recommendations are scheduled to go to the President on March 15, 1978. That does not leave much time for writing the Commission, but it is enough time for those who are genuinely concerned to let their concerns be known.

Expressing our opinions on this subject, whatever they may be, is a right and a privilege which we have as citizens. I strongly encourage you to write the Commission if you want your ideas or opinions to be heard. #### Radio on blink

I would like to know why the ambulances in the Hospital do not have working radios. I feel that this is very dangerous.

During the past 30-day period, the Hospital has only had one ambulance that experienced any radio difficulty. (This ambulance is designated Medic 3.) Normal procedure calls for the communications squadron to be notified when ambulance radio problems are experienced and they in-turn make arrangements for contract maintenance of the equipment. Unless the contractor has difficulty obtaining parts, the normal repair time, from time of reporting to completion is 5-10 days.

In the case of the most recent radio repair on Medic 3, an additional 10 day delay was experienced because the hospital reported an incorrect radio serial number to the Communications Squadron. This mistake was not discovered until the maintenance contractor reported to the hospital to repair the radio.

The radio has now been repaired


and is fully operational. A dangerous situation did not exist while the radio was being repaired, because when the ambulance was dispatched on emergency calls, a "hand-held" portable radio was used to maintain communication with the hospital.

### Treating the cold

## Doctors offer health tips

(Editor's Note: Air Force Surgeon General Lt. Gen. George E. Schafer recently announced the establishment of the Air Force Health Education Program (HEP). The program is designed to help active duty personnel, dependents and retirees become more knowledgeable about - and encourage greater participation in - the management of their own health care. This week the Roundup offers an article on self-treatment that can serve as a quick reference. "It is through this type of article that we endeavor to give you some guidelines in self-treatment so that you may comfortably and safely treat yourself and your family at home for minor medical conditions that may not require the attention of a physician," said Col. Giles W. Hall, ATC Health Education Program coordinator. Health Education Program coordinators have been appointed at each ATC base and the HEP coordinator for Reese is Capt. Mark Harmon, ext.

#### Common Cold (Head Cold) - Adults

The common cold is a virus infection usually involving the nose, throat, and sinuses. People may get a runny or stopped up nose, sore throat, hoarseness, a dry cough, weakness, an overall sick feeling and aches and pains. The common cold usually lasts for about one week. Antibiotics, such as penicillin, tetracycline, and sulfa, etc., are of no value and may make things

Treatment: All medicine and instructions needed to treat the common cold are available at the emergency room without a prescription. In addition, avoid excessive cold temperatures and excessive fatigue; increase your liquid intake drink eight ounces of water every hour (1 glass); stop smoking; and use throat lozenges.

When to seek professional medical help: Call the emergency room if temperature goes over 101 degrees Fahrenheit; there is an increase in throat pain; white or yellow spots appear on tonsils or throat; shaking chills occur; there is chest pain, shortness of breath, earache, skin rash, or pain in the teeth or sinuses; cough produces yellow green or gray phlegm (sputum); or you are not better in five days.



If you have a sore throat with fever above 101 degrees Fahrenheit and do not have a runny nose, stop by the emergency room and request a throat culture from one of the medical technicians (you do not have to see a physician to get the throat culture). Continue to treat as a cold and if the throat culture shows strep throat, you will be called for additional treatment.

## Don't obligate AF funds unless you're authorized

(Editors note: The following story concerns the illegal oblipurchase repairs, supplies, services or to obtain pricing information. The story is a hypothetical situation.)

Last Saturday night, four dancing girls showed up at the Forbes AFB, Tex., Officers Open Mess, even though they were not scheduled as part of the evenings events. The girls started off the evening at 8 p.m. by running in the back door through the crowd and up to the

Everybody enjoyed the evening except the band. Yes, the club management had hired a band to play at 9 p.m. None the less, the band collected their money and went home. The big question was, who will pay the

Later in the evening it was discovered that Capt. Bill Gruff had hired the girls. He had not remembered that the club had a band, however, he did remember a lot more on Monday morning when he reported to Col. Ralph Stonik, base commander and Capt. David Bruch, an authorized contracting officer.

"Who do you think should pay for the girls now?" asked Colonel Stonik. "The club had to pay the band and Finance can't

pay the girls without a purchase order signed by an authorized contracting officer. The base has experienced a number of gation of government funds to instances where personnel not authorized to obligate government funds have purchased repairs, supplies and services without prior approval. Believe me, if you are one of those persons authorized to make procurement actions, you'll know



Captain Gruff was ordered to write a letter explaining his actions in detail, citing specific circumstances surrounding the transaction and a description of a action to prevent a recurrence of his act. The statement will be forwarded to the procurement division for review by a contracting officer who must coordinate with the Staff Judge Advocate and prepare a formal statement of facts to be reviewed by the Deputy Commander of Resources (DCR).

If the illegal transaction involved \$2,500 or less, the DCR has the authority to approve the action. Actions involving more than \$2,500 must be referred to headquarters. If the ratification action is approved, a purchase order is initiated by the Procurement Division. This enables the Accounting and Finance Office to make payment to the vendor. If the ratification is not approved, Captain Gruff will be required to

As evidenced by the lengthy ratification procedure and disciplinary or corrective measures which can be taken, the unauthorized obligation of government funds is a very serious matter. It can be avoided simply by being aware of the limitations of your authority. Always act within those limi-



## Judge Advocate explains 'power of attorney'

Maybe it's just because it sounds so imposing, but, a "power of attorney" seems to have a reputation for being able to do more than it

According to Maj. David F. Sullivan, Reese staff judge advocate, several people come to the base legal office expecting a power of attorney to solve problems it just can't. "A power of attorney is a document through which one person authorizes another to transact business for him," explains the major. "Although sometimes useful, there are a number of reasons why it can't do many of the things people expect the power of attorney to do."

"To start with," said the major, "nobody is compelled to accept the power of attorney, even though it is legally acceptable. Many will refuse to accept the document just because they aren't sure of its validity. Some businesses and institutions will only accept a power of attorney if it is in a format prepared by them."


The Reese judge advocate also noted that often an individual will request a power of attorney for his wife, thinking that will aid her in case of his death. "In truth," says Major Sullivan, "the individual's death would revoke the power of attorney."

The major pointed out that there are two types of power of attorney — general and special. A general power of attorney grants the designated 'attorney in fact" authority to make almost every transaction the grantor could. Because of the broad authority it gives, it is considered risky because the grantor has no control over how it is used. This power of attorney leaves the grantor open to diliberate misuse and accidental misuse through errors in judgement.

A special power of attorney is preferable to a general power of attorney. It authorizes the attorney in fact to act only on a single transaction, such as accepting government quarters or shipping a car overseas. Its limited authority makes it far less risky than the general power of

"One safety precaution should be taken in executing the power of attorney," stressed Major Sullivan. "An expiration date should be included in the document. By having it expire under its own terms at the earliest possible time, the risk of misuse is limited."

The major concluded that anyone needing a power of attorney should contact the base legal

## Tax break seen for moves

Each year, millions of Americans move for employment reasons, including thousands of Servicemembers who change duty stations.

If you incurred employmentrelated moving expenses in 1977, you can look forward to liberalized deductions for some of those expenses on your 1977 Federal tax return.

There are two requirements you must meet before you may deduct your moving expenses. First, there's the distance requirement, which has been liberalized by a change in the law. Previously, your new job had to be 50 miles farther from your old residence than your old residence was from your former place of work. That distance has now been cut to 35 miles.

For example, suppose the distance from your former residence to your former place of work is 17 miles and the distance from your former residence to your new place of work is 57 miles. Assuming you meet all other requirements, you would be eligible for the moving expense deduction, because the difference in distances is more than 35 miles.

The second requirement for deducting the moving expenses is that you must work at least 39 weeks during the 12 months following your move.


While you must ultimately satisfy the requirement, you don't have to do so by the end of the year. This means that if you moved in June and will have worked less than 39 weeks by the end of the year, you can still claim the moving expense deduction on your 1977 return even though the 39 weeks have not elapsed.

If you deduct the expenses before meeting the time requirement, and then later find that you have not worked the specified number of weeks, you must go back and amend your return for the year in which you took the deduction.

You can also deduct more of your pre-move househunting and temporary living expenses than in the past years. For 1977 and later years, the maximum

amount claimed as househunting or temporary living

For example, assume you incur pre-move househunting expenses of \$1,200, and buying and selling costs of \$2,000. Your pre-move househunting expenses would be fully allowable because they are less than the maximum of \$1,500.



## Chamber ride an experience

You're sitting in a closed environment, suddenly you begin to feel disoriented about what you are doing. You're trying to answer quiz questions, but even though the questions are simple the answers are harder and harder to give.

It sounds like a unfamiliar situation, but for all Undergraduate Pilot Training (UPT) students, instructor pilots, and some airmen who might be assigned to flight duty, the above can be a common experience.

Altitude chamber training is just part of the training UPT students receive while here at Reese before heading to the flightline. It all takes place in the Aerospace Physiology Unit (PTU) which is tasked, among other things, to train students, pilots and sometimes passengers, about what they might expect when experiencing high altitudes and possibly a lack of oxygen.

During an average chamber "flight", one might experience the feelings of climbing to a height of 30,000 feet then dropping suddenly to 18,000 feet. Or more interesting yet, experience the difficulty in answering even simple questions when the oxygen level is below normal and it's hard to think straight. The purpose is to allow each individual to recognize how the altitude or oxygen changes affect him so he will be better prepared if ever faced with the same situation while flying.

But the altitude chamber is again just a part of the training given by the PTU, headed by Maj. Jack Cusano. The Reese unit, which is one of only 33 units Air Force wide, also gives instruction on how to eject, parachute, land successfully, and even the first steps of survival once safely on the ground.

The Roundup will take a closer look at some of the other PTU activities in future issues.




