# Friona will receive \$84,362.16 in sales tax allocation

Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced that he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$1.2 billion in local sales tax allocations for May. This amount is 1.8% higher than the amount sent out in May 2021. These allocations are based on sales made in March by businesses that report tax monthly and sales made in January, February and March by quarterly filers.

The City of Friona will receive \$84,362.16 in sales tax allocation for the month of May. This amount is 52.68% higher than the \$55,252.03 received in May of 2021. This brings the year-todate total to \$347.324.95 for 2022. This YTD total is 47.81% higher than the \$234,967.19 received last year at this time. The Friona Economic Development Corporation (FEDC) will receive \$21,090.54 of the allocation for its operations.






#### Tale As Old As Time

Since 1991, Ukraine has been an independent country-one with almost eighty million acres of farmland. Unfortunately, for years a government moratorium prevented millions of landowners from creating a functioning agricultural land market, according to the Atlantic Council (a nonpartisan organization that galvanizes US leadership and engagement in the world, in partnership with allies and partners, to shape solutions to global

challenges, www.atlanticcouncil.org/about).

When the Ukrainian Parliament voted in March 2020 to lift the measures which had nurtured corruption among land developers and government officials, Ukraine was on a trajectory of living up to its nickname as the Breadbasket of Europe. Over seven million landowners could now have a say in the use of their land and their agricultural production. Then came February 2022. A



promising agricultural market in the hands of landowning Ukrainians is now on pause.

This agricultural beauty has caught the eye of several beasts over the course of Eastern European history. During the early 1930s, Joseph Stalin's push for a government takeover of Ukrainian land (collectivization) resulted in the horrific Holodomor, a manufactured famine. His policies put farmland in the hands of the Russian government, who chose to continue production and export a million tons of grain to the West while depriving Ukrainians. Four million starved to death during the Holodomor. Russia's current leader is not only waging a war of attrition with sieges but is willfully committing horrific crimes against children, women, elderly, and soldiers.

In the Disney musical Beauty and the Beast, the tale as old as time is that love can win over the ugliness inside the most hideous of beasts.

Sadly, the tale as old as time in the real world is that unchecked ambition and greed often swell into a permanent amoral state. All countries, including our own, have experienced leaders who abused power. When that abuse continues without consequence, evil has a feeding frenzy.

The propaganda and lies of one man and the government he controls have put Ukraine in harm's way again. The autocratic nature of Stalin and Putin reminds me of another Disney classic. Mirror, mirror, on the wall, who's the beastly-est of them all?

# Fuel prices hit new records

Average gasoline prices in Texas were unchanged during the last week, averaging \$4.13 per gallon. Prices in Texas are 44.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and stand \$1.37 per gallon higher than a year ago. The price of diesel has risen 3.0 cents nationally in the past week and stands at \$5.55 per gal-

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas was priced at \$3.19 while the most expensive was \$5.70 per gallon.

"Those filling their tanks last week saw another jolt at the pump, as both gasoline and diesel prices continued their multi-week rally," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis at GasBuddy.

De Haan added, "New records continued to be set on a near daily basis as the national average edges even closer to \$4.50 per gallon. Prices later this week could be closer to \$5 per gallon than \$4, as demand continues to edge higher and inventories of both gasoline and diesel continue to decline. While the increases may start to slow in the days ahead as pump prices catch up to oil, there isn't much reason to be optimistic that we'll see a plunge any time soon."

GasBuddy data is compiled from more than 11 million weekly price reports covering over 150,000 gas stations across the country.

# Teachers' retirement reception is Wednesday



# LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Clint,

On Tuesday, May 3, I was driving home from Lubbock when my heart suddenly went into V-Tach arrhythmia, which is a very dangerous condition. I went to our emergency department, and Dr. Johnson and his team immediately went to work on me. Jason McDonald, RN was on my left and Alexis Villanueva, LVN was on my right. Several other nurses, aides, and attendants were there as well. All were working feverishly following Dr. Johnson's instructions. However, the arrhythmia was still there so they shocked me. Unfortunately, my condition worsened, and my heart stopped completely.

They quickly administered CPR and my heart began beating again. My heart rate then returned to a normal rhythm. Soon a helicopter arrived, and I was taken to Northwest Texas hospital where a defibrillator was implanted.

Clint, I would not be here to write this letter if it weren't for the people in our ER. THEY SAVED MY LIFE! Our

community should be grateful that we have a group of dedicated, highly skilled professionals committed to addressing the health care needs of all of us. I thank the Good Lord every day that these people are here.

# Overpass Project on track

Judge Ellis said that he met recently with the South Plains Rural Planning Organization. The SPRPO assists county officials with information, acts as a liaison between the Lubbock TxDOT District county judges and engineers, and coordinates quarterly meetings collaboration between the Lubbock Tx-DOT district and the 17 county judges.

There are three projects that are important to Parmer County residents. The overpass project near Cargill is still set for 2023-24. The road construction from Farwell back towards Bovina still has an uncertain finish date. The road construction project from Bovina to Parmerton Hill is set for 2026.

Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday May 9, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American

Flag and Texas Flag.

Minutes from the April 25th meeting were read and approved. Commissioners approved the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Treasurer Sharon May. The Treasurer's Payroll Report was also approved.

Parmer County Sheriff Eric Geske reported that the Parmer County Law **Enforcement Center was** currently housing 35 inmates. Of those, 22 are paying customers from Deaf Smith County. The InterLocal Cooperation Agreement between Parmer County and Lubbock County for the housing and care of inmates was renewed. The individual fee was reduced ten dollars to \$75 per day.

In other business, the annual ARPA Compliance Report was approved. No "American Rescue" funds were spent during the last reporting period. Recently approved funds will be listed in a future report. Also, a water line under CR 17 and CR T in Precinct 3 was approved.

The Commissioners Court met in Special Session at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, May 16th to consider two items of business that were tabled during the May 9th meeting. Votes from the May 7th election were canvassed and the results were approved. A request for gas line under CR E and FM 1172 in Precinct 1 was approved.

In new business, Commissioners received a report from Anthony Self of TXDOT concerning bridge inspections on county roads. All bridges passed inspection and no action by the county was requested. Also, Cybersecurity training through the Texas Association of Counties was approved for all county employees who utilize county computers.

All meetings are open to the public. Information in this article is only a summary. Any questions concerning specific actions should be directed to the Commissioners Court.





### Hereford Study Club makes "Bigs" donation

Hereford's L'Allegra Study Club recently presented a \$30,000 donation to Big Brothers Big Sisters of Hereford. The contribution will benefit Friona's Bigs In Schools, a satellite program sponsored by BBBS.

L'Allegra raised the funds in their annual spring fundraiser, hosting a plant sale, burger luncheon and raffle. The amount marks a record-breaking total for the spring event. The group has raised more than \$100,000 for civic and social improvement projects this year.

Big Brothers Big Sisters is a one-to-one community-based mentorship program. Students who are nominated by parents and teachers, meet with mentors called "Bigs" during their lunch hour one hour per week, excluding holidays and testing days.

The Bigs in Schools program began at Friona Elementary in January 2015. BBBS of Hereford is one of only eight BBBS agencies in the state and hosts Friona's program as a satellite pro-


In its early days, Executive Director Sara Pesina served as a match specialist with Connie Slagle volunteering as site monitor. Stacy Andrews is Friona's current match

specialist. The number of students has ranged from 20 to nine in 2021-2022, a re-building year following Covid restrictions. Students and mentors visit during lunch, work grade-level material and occasionally play games. They continue their relationship through the summer by mail.

"The Friona BBBS staff, Littles and Bigs appreciate the support of teachers and parents the last eight years and are especially grateful to the L'Allegra Study Club for their generous donation," Slagle said. "Bigs in schools is a worthwhile program that can truly change the life of a child as well as the adult volunteer."

Volunteer mentors are always needed, and can apply through the Hereford BBBS website.
