Jail, both) and FELONIES (which are more serious crimes and are punishable

fine, or both). For a Peace Officer of the
State of Texas, to make State of Texas, to make an arre
for a Misdemeanor, the crim must be committed 'IN VIEW' of the officer. So, if you see a person
driving in an reckless manner, and you report it to the Sheriffs Office or Police Department, as you should, unless the officer catches
the person driving in that manner. the person driving in that manner,
the officer can not write a ticket $(r)$ make a arrest. If you want to do something about a persons driving, then you must go to a
Judge (City Judge or Justice of Judge (City Judge or Justice of
Peace) and swear to and sign a complaint, and you must be able to describe the vehicle and the
driver. Once this is done then driver. Once this is done, then a
warrant of arrest (the only other way that a Peace Officer may make a arrest) is issued by the Judge, and the officer will then
