Schwab says. "Parents may think they can pull a young child out of two or three feet of grain, but it's very difficult if not impossible, Schwab says that to rescue a
53-pound child caught in kneedeep grain, an adult must be able to lift 71 pounds-;-the weight of
the child plus the frictional force the child plus the friction al force of the grain. The strength required
to lift the same child out of to lift the same child out of
shoulder-deep grain can be 240 pounds, more than most men can handle.
He adds that even if you could
lift that much lift that much, the child would be
injured. As a person gets caught deeper, grain exerts more force, sometimes as much as a small car. Contrary to popular belief,
Schwab says it requires just as much strength to pull someone out flowing grain. The only difference is that a person is being burie
