Ask the Geek

Office Productivity for Free
Last week we talked about the difference between your operating system (such as Windows XP Home Edition) and your office productivity software (such as Microsoft Office). This week I'll focus on an office suite called OpenOffice.org (OO.org).
From the OpenOffice.org web site: "OpenOffice.org ...includes the key desktop applications, such as a word processor, spreadsheet, presentation manager, and drawing program, with a usier interface flexible, OpenOffice.org also works stransparently with a variety of file formats, including those of Microsoft Office, and the vendorneutral Open Document standard from OASIS. Available in over 65 supported languages with more being constantly added by the community, OpenOffice.org runs stably and natively on Solaris, Linux (including PPC Linux), Windows, Mac OS X (XI1), and numerous other platforms.
OpenOffice.org contains all the software necessary for you to creat ocuments, spreadsheets, presentations, edit photos and clip art and much more. It also allows you to read those same types of files that processor can open a document that was created by someone using Microsoft Word, and the OO.org presentation module can open a
Microsoft PowerPoint presentation.
The big difference, however, is that OpenOffice.org is completely free. You don't pay to download it, install it, register it, use it or keep it updated. Also, when you save a file in an OO.org format, you can est assured that they're not keeping any secrets - the format that thei files are saved in is an approved, "open" format. That means that your files will never be enslaved by corporate copywrites o proprietary formats. Anyone with the gumption could include code in heir software that could read an OpenOffice.org file without having to reverse engineer the file to try to guess how it's been created. I have used 00.org for many years and could $t$ be happier. I write this column using the OO.org word processor, and when Im ready to submit it, I click one button in the toolbar that creates a "PDF" (oherwise known as "Adobe Acrobal" format) of the file to send to he Star. What you are reading right now looks exactly as it looked my screen, and the software fused to create it cost exactly zero. Getting it is easy, just visit their web site: www.openoffice.org You can join their mailing lists and read user guides and other documentation on their site. Find a bug in the software? Submit it the developers and take part in the ongoing improvement of the software! When have you ever had that kind of control?
