Reese pilot gets exas DAR honor

Capt. Thomas C. Skillman, a 35th Flying Training Squadron flight commander, was honored Feb. 15 by the Texas Society Daughters of the American Revolution with the Armed Services Award.

In his congratulatory letter, Col. John R. Hullender, wing commander, pointed out that Captain Skillman's award was based upon his "academic achievement, the qualities of dependability and good character, his adherence to military discipline and leadership ability.'

Mrs. Wayne D. Tiner, Texas DAR state regent, expanded the society's program for two years (1984 and 1985) so that an outstanding officer in the undergraduate pilot training program at Reese could be

Reese gets a free hand to try out new program

Reese has been picked to experiment with clever ways to get the job done while making the base a better place to live and work.

If they save money in the process, they get to keep it. If they find a regulation stands in the way, Air Training Command, the Air Force and the Department of Defense will help them find a way around it. And if they fail in any attempt, they will be forgiven.

It's called the Model Installation Program and, according to Maj. Gen. James P. Smothermon, ATC vice commander, it will encourage commanders "to find new, better ways to achieve excellence."

The idea is to simplify life for base level personnel by streamlining base support procedures, cutting through administrative red tape, and where necessary, waiving defense directives, Air Force and ATC regulations to increase efficiency. As an incentive, savings which result from increased efficiency may be used by the base to improve living and work-

DOD initiated the idea and each service was given the opportunity to designate bases to participate in a three-year test program. Reese is one of five Air Force bases taking part in the test.

Reese will be encouraged to try innovative ways to do just about any task better. If regulations stand in the way, waivers can be requested with quick answers. Answers to waiver requests can be expected in about 72 hours. About the only restriction is that public laws must be followed. To speed communication, a "hot line" between Reese, ATC headquarters and the Air Staff will be set up.

Other Air Force bases participating are Whiteman AFB, Mo.; Moody AFB, Ga.; Kirtland AFB, N.M.; and Hickam AFB, Hawaii.

AFAF kicks off Monday

The AFAF campaign will begin Feb. 27 and will run through March 30. Contributions to the annual fund drive are used to support the Air Force Aid Society, the Air Force Enlisted Men's, Widows and Dependents Home and the Air Force Village.

The 1984 target is well under the 1984 Air Force Assistance the \$876,826 figure that ATC members actually contributed to the AFAF drive last year.

The command goal is broken down further into individual goals for each center and wing, based on numbers and grades of people assigned.

This year's Air Force goal is \$4 million; this is up from \$3.8 million a year ago. Nearly \$5.8 million was donated Air Forcewide in 1983.

Appeals will go out to all Air Force people on active duty in the Force Reserve and to retired Air Force members.

The Air Force Aid Society is the official charity of the Air Force. It helps relieve financial emergencies of eligible activeduty members, retirees and reservists on active duty by providing interest-free loans or grants. Surviving spouses are also eligible for assistance.

Three educational loan programs are available for eligible Air Force people pursuing vocational, undergraduate or graduate studies. These loans are made possible by the Department of Education's Guaranteed Student Loan and Guaranteed Parent Loan Programs.





Through the years, people have tried about everything to cure periodontal or gum disease, the major cause of tooth loss in adults. The Romans, for example, believed that loose teeth could be made firm again by tying a whole frog to the jaws. Other treatments have included the application of pomegranate juice, camphor oil, or vinegar cooked with leek juice and honey to the diseas-

None of these remedies helped. This is not surprising when you know that periodontal disease is caused by plaque, a thin film of bacteria and their by-products that forms on the teeth. If not removed daily, plaque produces acids and other waste products that irritate the gums. The gums become swollen, bleed easily, and pull away from the teeth. Mineralized plaque, called calculus or tartar, builds up around the teeth, making them harder to clean. If the disease is not treated, the teeth eventually lose their bony support and fall flossing is in the prevention of

out or have to be removed.

The bad news about periodontal disease is that almost anyone can be affected by it, even children as young as five or six years in age. The older people are, the more likely they are to have periodontal disease. More than half of those over age 18 and almost two-thirds of those over age 65 have at least the early stages of this disease.

The good news is that most people can avoid periodontal disease by practicing good oral hygiene and seeing a dentist regularly. To remove plaque, you should brush and floss your teeth thoroughly every day. Toothbrushing cleans plaque from the outer, inner, and chewing surfaces of the teeth. Flossing cleans the areas under the gumline and between the teeth, where a toothbrush can't reach.

Although most people brush their teeth, only about 38 percent of them floss daily. Some people do not realize how important periodontal disease; others do not know how to floss. The method recommended by the American Dental Association is:

Take about 18 inches of floss (either waxed or unwaxed) and wind most of it around the middle finger of one hand. Wind the rest around the same finger of the other hand. Holding the floss tightly, gently insert it between the teeth. Curve it into a C-shape against the tooth, and slide it into the space between the gum and the tooth until you feel resistance. Scrape the side of the tooth. Repeat this method for all your other teeth.

Hardened plaque or calculus builds up along the gum line and makes plaque removal difficult. Only professional cleaning can remove calculus, so make regular dental appointments as often as your dentist recommends.

Don't be too busy to care for your teeth. Take a few minutes every day to brush and floss and a few hours every year to see your dentist. These simple measures can help you avoid periodontal disease. They're a lot easier - and more effective-than tying a frog to your jars.

Class 84-03 to accept wings today

Forty-three student pilots will join the ranks of Air Force pilots this morning following Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 84-03's graduation ceremony at the theater. The ceremony begins at 10.

In addition to the traditionally full-house audience of 84-03 relatives, friends and well-wishers will be Maj. Gen. James P. McCarthy, the director of legislative liaison, Office of the Secretary of the Air Force, Washington, D.C.

This morning's ceremony culminates the year of intensive hands-on and classroom training required of all student pilots. When the members of Class 84-03 walk the stage they will get their diplomas, wings, aeronautical pilot ratings and the increased responsibility of being an Air Force pilot.

Class 84-03, like UPT Class 84-02, began their training in winter of 1983, and as they arrived so did some of the greatest amounts of snow ever to blanket the Reese-Lubbock area. The snow was not the end though, each of the students had demonstrated their aptitude for flying in small, propeller-driven aircraft before being selected for pilot training. Many of the future pilots had done their flying at an ROTC unit or at Hondo Air Field near San An-



physiological training unit, better known as the altitude chamber.

Ready for flight, the students began training in the T-37 jet trainer. After mastering the basic flying skills in the T-37 (75 flying hours), the students were moved into the advanced flying at Reesethe T-38 Talon.

The students flew 100 hours in the "white rocket" called the T-38. The T-38 trainer is capable of Mach 1.2 speed (more than 800 miles per hour) and altitudes in excess of 50,000 feet.

During the tenure as a student, each new pilot must attend classes on the academics of flying, flight planning, weather, aircraft systems opeations, accident prevention and instrument procedures.

At the conclusion of this morning's ceremony relatives and the other guests of the new pilots will have lunch at the officers' club. Immediately afterward, the 64th Student Squadron-the administrative home for all pilot trainees-will guide the guests on a tour of the Reese student pilot training facilities.

Tonight there will be a dinner dance to honor the graduates at the officers' club . . . and, then UPT Class 84-03 will be history.

Legislative liaison to address graduates

Washington, D.C., will address the graduating class of pilots and the beginning class during Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 84-03's graduation ceremony this morning.

The Canton, Ohio, native graduated Kent (Ohio) State University with a bachelor of science degree and was commissioned through the university's ROTC program.

On active duty, General Mc-Carthy went to Marianna, Fla., and Greenville AFB, Miss., for pilot training. After he earned his wings in June 1959, the general was assigned as a B-47 pilot at Lockbourne (Rickenbacker) AFB, Ohio.

Following his duty as a bomber pilot, General McCarthy was assigned to the Air Force Academy as an air officer commanding. In that position he advised and assisted cadets with their training.

Once upon a time, a band of young men and women gathered in a desolate area of the country to study the magical art of aerology. They were brought to the wastelands of Texas by the grand wizards of aerology to perpetuate the art of flying. The band of young men and women were designated as Class 84-03 by the wizards-and they were special. The historians record that 84-03's arrival sparked strange and wondrous happenings. The air celebrated 84-03's arrival with unheard of snowfalls. The wizards of the wasteland showered 84-03 with green bags, shiny wizard hats and ancient books of learning. Life was good.

Class 84-03 spent many weeks studying the mysteries of aerology. Numerous parties were given in joyous celebration of their expanding knowledge. Finally, the day came when the wizard Thomas deemed the young aerologists worthy of vaulting into the skies on the backs of the fabled 6,000 pound wizards' whistle, the T-37 Tweet. Before the wizards would allow the young aerologists to actually fly the Tweets, they had to prove their worthiness by memorizing and reciting the magical E.P.s. These powerful incantations had been handed down from generation to generation to generation of tweet flyers for as long as even the oldest wizard could remember. The E.P.s protected tweet flyers from harm when their loyal (but old) steeds malfunctioned.

When the members of 84-03 leapt into skies above the wastelands with their instructor wizards, they were excited-and they were sick. It is recorded that many white bags were filled to overflowing in the days of flying that followed. The instructor wizards, in their infinite wisdom, carried a copious supply of white bags for their young charges and frequently used 100 percent oxygen until their pupils learned self control.

The new aerologists had much to learn before they would be trusted to fly alone. Their vocabulary expanded as they learned about Fuzzy and Fizzle, the Bud and Poppet, Colt, Peak and Pogo. They learned to communicate with one another through the air and they were taught humiliation with a single

word-"disregard." More important than all the rest, they learned how to pray as they repeatedly hurled their bodies at the ground.

protect them and a new vocabulary with which to communicate. Fizzle and Fuzzy were replaced by Reload, Basehit, the Hub, Spur, Moore and Ruby Homeplate. No longer were the young flyers Colts. Now they were Dades, Bugles, Torts, Cubas and Chums. But one word and its affect upon 84-03 remained unchanged.

The hearty band of aerologists experienced many setbacks as they struggled to master the intricacies of their gradebooks. It is recorded that many failed to pass their first test of flying skill in the white rocket and that some members were unable to meet the challenge. But it is also recorded that those who succeeded were rewarded with formation. Life was very good.

Now 84-03 is graduating. The surviving members have earned their wings by avoiding the clerical pitfalls of their gradebooks and mastering the art of aerology.

Undergraduate pilot training is a strenuous year long program designed to mold qualified young men and women into Air Force pilots. Some of those qualified for UPT were unable to cope with the rigorous training. Those of us who survived have grown close and become good friends. We've flown together studied together and shared each others' setbacks. None of us are likely to forget our year at Reese. We can be proud of what we've accomplished as a class and of what we are . . . Air Force officers and pilots.

Sure-Pay saves

Tired of getting your check late? Or is it mangled when it arrives in your mailbox? Sure-pay is the answer according to Russell Moore, Sure-Pay program monitor.

Active duty military personnel hear about Sure-Pay from day one, but their civilian counterparts are rarely approached with the program—until recently.

Sure-Pay, a program whereby payroll checks are automatically deposited into bank accounts, offers savings to everyone involved.

•Civilians participating in the program know their checks will be in the bank payday. They don't have to wait in bank lines to make a deposit.

•The banking institution itself will be able to cut expenditures in its operating budget. Civilians and the banks (credit unions, too)

•The Department of Defense and the Air Force save on operation costs, too. Instead of printing one check per individual, the Air Force can cut a check to a financial facility to cover hundreds of payroll checks at a time. Again, savings are there.

Air Force finance officials say it works, but do bankers agree? Yes, "local banking facilities enjoy the savings and they indicate that they are better able to serve their customers," said Moore.

A large number of the civilian work force's Sure-Pay checks are personally delivered to

downtown banks, Moore said, and "as more of the civilian work force signs up for Sure-Pay, it will become increasingly more cost effective to hand carry all Sure-Pay checks."

Local institutions receiving the Sure-Pay checks through the hand carrying system have indicated that Sure-Pay participants usually get their checks deposited to their accounts that same day.

"I'd encourage all DOD civilians not now participating in Sure-Pay to consider it as a serious alternative to lengthy bank lines and sometimes mutilated checks," said Moore.




