"I drive down the road and people can sometimes see the bears," the field maintenance squadron safety NCO said, "Hopefully someone will take the hint."

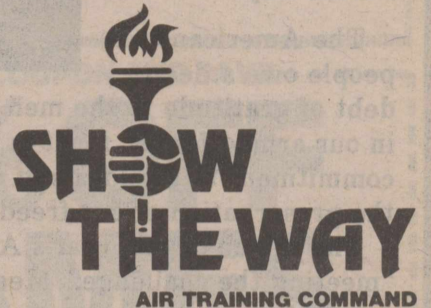
"I care about my bears so I buckle them up. If someone cares about someone, maybe they will buckle them up," he said.

## Base gets 'thumbs up' for neat appearance

Reese got the "thumbs up" on this week's base appearance inspection conducted by members of the Air Training Command staff.

"Outstanding" was the overall rating reflected in the report submitted Tuesday by Inspection Team Chief Col. George A. Romero to Col. Bob Hullender, wing commander.

Colonel Romero commented in his report on the outstanding military courtesy and the pride building managers had in their areas. The report also cited the street and building signs as excellent and the base exterior color scheme was called "very good." The base was free of litter and well mowed, stated the colonel in the report. Static displays were called "exceptional."

The inspection team identified several areas as better than average. The top areas began with the base entrance and extended down the flightline with the aircraft corrosion control shop (Building 96), fuels operation center, the flightline maintenance shacks, fire station, base operations, disaster preparedness (Building 75), and the organizational maintenance squadron hangar. On the east side of Hangar Line Road the areas which received high marks from the team were the Enlisted Open Mess, Officers Open Mess, Caprock Cafe (dining hall), theater, flight simulator facility, hospital, 1958th Communications Squadron (Building 20), and data automation (Building 36).

The care and pride taken by Reese Village residents was evident, said the team's report. They also called the edging and care of Village lawns "very good."

## Mission enhancement

Mission Enhancement Week kicks off Sunday through May 26. At Reese, wing safety officials have numerous events set up, among them a defensive driving course Tuesday and Wednesday and mass safety briefings Thursday at the theater (briefing times 7, 9, 11 a.m. and 1, 3, 5 p.m.)

"We're convinced enhancing the mission will improve our safety record," said ATC Director of Safety Lt. Col. William Thompson.

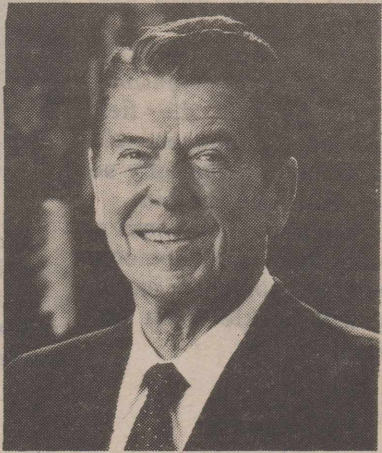

A movie-goer called to ask help in getting better projection work in the base theater. It seems that everytime he went to a movie this past year, the projection lighting was bad and the reels would frequently be shown in the wrong sequence with no explanation given to theater patrons.

I'd like to thank this caller for surfacing this problem to us. We have passed his comments on to AAFES regional headquarters. As a result, AAFES has now scheduled their projection specialist to visit Reese to check out the equipment and to provide further training for our staff. Once again, thanks for this call.

Two callers had comments to make about inspections in Reese Village. One resident was upset because after a great deal of time, work and money spent to improve the appearance of his home in the Village, the inspector said he needed to trim around the house and patio.

We really appreciate the efforts of all the residents in getting their houses ready for the inspection. In this case, the local inspectors were told to establish high standards in the housing area and in this case, the grass around the house and patio was slightly beyond the acceptable limits. These high standards were set because of the Air Training Command Base Appearance Team's visit this week. In order for Reese to receive an "outstanding" rating on the inspection, a lot of work and extra effort on everyone's part was required.

The second inquiry about the housing inspection involved a resident who was written up for an area that was not in his area of responsibility.

The caller felt that this mistake was a result of the inspectors using a different map than that used in the housing office when identifying areas of responsibility.

The housing inspectors do occasionally make mistakes and this time they read the map wrong. That is exactly why they put their phone numbers on the inspection form. Anytime anyone has questions concerning a housing inspection write-up, feel free to call Ext. 3715 and one of the housing inspectors will come to your quarters to discuss it with you.

Why would anyone want to paint portions of the chain link fence near the fuels area, asked to CARE Line callers. The answer is simple. It makes the fence look better and the added protection preserves the original investment in the fence.

Safety, safety, safety. We talk about it, promote it, monitor it, and do everything possible to make Reese a safe place to work and live. But sometimes the most obvious hazards go unnoticed for a while. A caller recently pointed out that the yield sign at the intersection of Fifth, Main and Eleventh Streets had been removed, but was still needed.

The yield sign was inadvertently removed when the "no right turn" sign was installed. The base traffic engineer has been notified and the yield sign will be returned as soon as possible.

Thank you for the call. It's instances such as this that re-emphasize that safety is everyone's concern, because people are our most important resource.

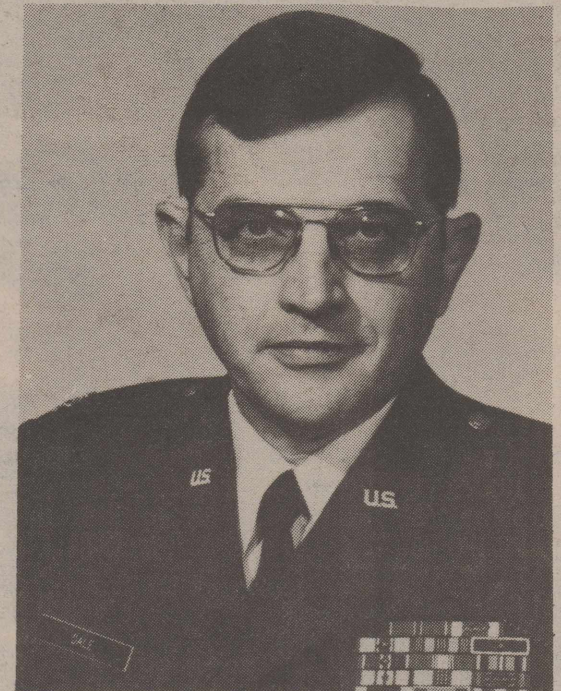

# Summer term starts soon

Wayland Baptist University's summer term begins June 4, and now is the time Reese education officials urge students to think about their summer schedule.

Wayland is the only college to offer Reese airmen a four year degree program. Registration for classes at the education office are set for May 28, 4-7 p.m.; May 30, 8:30-11 a.m.; May 31, 4-7 p.m.; and June 1, 8:30-11 a.m.

The Education Office has a listing of the classes to be offered by WBU as well as what Houston Baptist University and South Plains college have to offer Reese students.

To help save on the high cost of upper division education, Bill Trafton, education services officer, recommends

that students check around with former students for books to buy or borrow.

Trafton restated the tuition assistance policy, and its considerations. Students, he said, should consider the aspects of the course load they want, daily duty requirements, any upcoming TDYs and family obligations before registering.

Tuition assistance forms are available at the Education Office in the new CBPO. The financial aid for airmen in enlisted grades E-1 through E-4 and commissioned officers is limited to 75 percent. NCOs, E-5 through E-9, can qualify for up to 90 percent tuition assistance.

Those NCOs seeking the 90 percent assistance must have

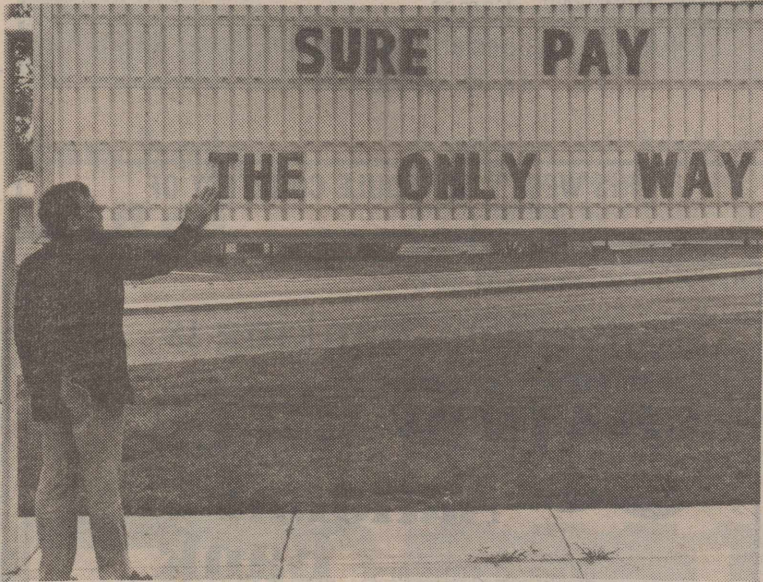
no more than 14 years of service, otherwise they're only eligible to get the 75 percent.

Officers using the tuition assistance must also accept an additional two year service commitment. Enlisted members using the money incur no commitment.

Still another means of getting necessary semester hours is the College Level Examination Program tests. The tests are free to active duty airmen, officer and enlisted.

To take a CLEP tests, airmen must contact the education office in advance to be sure the test proctor will be present to administer the test.

CLEP tests range from the five basic, general tests to specialized tests.



## Former graduate returns to address UPT class

Brig. Gen. Earl S. Van Inwegen, the deputy chief of staff for intelligence for the Air Force Space Command and the North American Aerospace Defense Command, will be the guest speaker at Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 84-05's graduation ceremony today.

An Illinois native, General Van Inwegen is no stranger to Reese. After graduation from the Air Force Academy he began pilot training at Spence AFB, Ga., and here.

The general is a command pilot with over 5,000 flying hours. He has been awarded the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Medal and the Air Force Commendation Medal to name just a few.

# 84-05 graduates today

Fifty-one student pilots from the U.S. and around the world join the ranks of military pilots at 10 this morning when Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 84-05 graduates.

In addition to the expected full-house of graduates' family and well wishers will be Brig. Gen. Earl S. Van Inwegen.

General Van Inwegen is the deputy chief of staff, intelligence, for the U.S. Air Force Space Command and the North American Aerospace Defense Command. The general will be the key speaker at this morning's ceremony.

When the senior class began their training, they started with the basics; learning to use and land with a parachute, and the effects of altitude flying.

Hospital staffers, assigned to the aerospace physiological training unit otherwise known as the altitude chamber, produced altitudes equalling 35,000 feet for the new pilots.

In the chamber, a student removes the face mask at 35,000 feet to demonstrate the effects of that altitude. A second student does the same at 30,000 feet. At 25,000 feet the remainder of the class takes off their masks to experience first-hand the



physiological effects felt in the air. The first two students are the only exceptions.

At 18,000 feet the students are taught that even low altitude flying without oxygen is dangerous.

Each undergoes a visual acuity demonstration with colored cards—masks off, the colors begin to blend, but with oxygen, those same colors are distinctively separate.

Ready for jet flight, the freshmen pilots trained in the T-37. After 75 inflight hours and three successful check rides, the members of Class 84-05 were deemed basically knowledgeable in jet flight—now to the T-38.

The T-38, better known as the "white rocket," is the Air Force's supersonic jet trainer. The T-38 is capable of Mach 1.2 speed (more than 800 miles per hour) and altitudes above 50,000 feet.

Like the basic flight training program, each student had to pass three check rides. They spent approximately 100 hours flying the T38, too.

Class 84-05's tenure here hasn't been spent completely in the air. Each student attended classes ranging from flying academic to accident prevention to knowing their aircraft systems.

Following this morning's graduation ceremony, there will be a luncheon at the officers' club for the new pilots, their families and friends. Then they move on to the 64th Student Squadron's "red carpet" tour through the training facilities used by Class 84-05.

# Be careful this softball season

Last year was another banner year for Air Training Command personnel experiencing reportable (lost time) mishaps while playing softball. An even larger number suffered minor sprains, cuts and bruises, but were able to return to duty. The vast majority of these accidents occurred during off duty play such as pickup games or playing catch between the dormitories. The mishaps ran the gamut from getting hit on the head by a misjudged fly ball to crashing into the bleachers in pursuit of a foul ball.

By far the greatest cause of injuries resulted from sliding. Some were caused by split second changes in the plans of the base runner; a few injuries were caused by sliding into a home plate that was inches above the surface of the ground; however, most of the sliding injuries were produced by incorrect sliding techniques on the part of the base runner. Practice in sliding pits should reduce these.

Other mishaps were caused by slipping while making turns, colliding with other players or charging into base defender. Improper foot gear and wet surfaces contributed to these injuries. Supervisors and good judgement on whether or not to allow play on the wet surface will reduce this type injury.

In the outfield players are failing to "call" for the ball when it's an optional catch. Players fall into holes, trip over debris and slide in the mud. These mishaps usually occur in off-base when the outfield is in poor condition.

The "fiv" to reduce injuries is always the same year after year. They are:

- Supervision of the overall game
- Good playing facilities
- Physical Condition of Player
- Use of Umpire
- Warm-up
