Zero overpricing catch pays off

Reese has it first significant cash award winner under the Zero Overpricing Program, said Supply Customer Supply Chief Capt. Philip H. Gunderman.

Edward R. Kohanek, assigned to the 64th Field Maintenance Squadron Precison Measurement Equipment Lab, will get \$317 for catching a mistake with an item price.

Kohanek went to order an item he needed and found that there were two sources for the product. The first source sold the items for \$51.56 per item; the second source sold the item for \$11.82.

For Kohanek's price awareness, Captain Gunderman indicated that the Air Force will save \$3,179.20 annually by buying the lesser expensive of the two items.

Zero overpricing challenges at Reese now number 54, of which 14 are still in the investigating stage.

The Reese Exchange management's decision to stop selling Texas hunting and fishing licenses upset one airman. The sportsman felt that the BX should not be in the license sales for profits, and that participation may have been higher if more hunters and fishermen knew the store had sold the per-

Advertising the program might have helped, but it is unlikely that even then enough permits would have been sold to help the store recover its initial costs.

The bonding premium last year was \$30 and employee handling, exclusive of sales, was estimated at \$36 monthly. The total Reese Exchange expenditure was approximately \$462 last year. In the same year, the exchange sold only 18 Texas hunting and fishing permits—recovering only \$9, or 50 cents each.

The decision to discontinue the license sales was based upon their cost and availability in Lubbock. The exchange, like other government operations, is required to do more with less, and they too are forced to find ways to reduce their operating expenses. The permits, therefore, are just not feasible for exchange sale here.

In early September, the Military Clothing Sales Store received a very small quantity of the new female polyester-wool blouses. We certainly do not discriminate with regard to who is allowed to purchase new items in short supply, but sell one to a customer on a "first come, first served" basis. In the interest of fairness, that will continue to be our policy. As of yet, our store cannot order the new blouse for store stock as it is not available in the depots. We will, of course, stock the item when it becomes available and place an announcement in the Reese Bulletin. We certainly appreciate and understand the desire of Reese personnel to look sharp and will do everything we can to help you.

An airman wanted to know why the wing's static aircraft displays seem to be hidden by trees; including the newest static-T-28.

The small trees in front of the T-28 will be transplanted after they become dormant and can safely be moved. The trees in front of the older static displays, the B-25 and T-33, are much older and more mature. The possibility of moving them is being considered even now.

I received a series of calls regarding the Reese Village cable TV interruptions for the recent voter registration drive.

Voting is our greatest right, and I fully support the extra effort being made to get more people registered. I also realize that cable TV interruptions should be limited to important matters like freeze warnings, blood drives for critical blood shortages, and major emergencies.

Encouraging more people to register to vote may not fit into those categories, particularly with other means to spread the word, and I assure everyone we will be more judicious in future cable TV interruptions.

One housing resident found himself with leaky plumbing, and a plumber who felt ill told him to turn off the main water source until morning - a situation that did not sit well with the resident.

The resident wanted to know why this contractor could get away with not doing the job he is being paid to. The plumbing contractor cannot and has been reminded of his responsibility.

A caller wanted to know why, if the Air Force has set maximum weight standards, individuals here have to be 10 pounds or more under the standard, or they get in trouble.

Weighing individuals within 10 pounds of their maximum weights was ordered because there are personnel who were and are in this category. Some may present a poor image of the military. The Management Effectiveness Inspection team will weigh individuals who are near their maximum weight standards or appear that way.

Weighing just because a person is within 10 pounds of their maximum weight does not mean the individual is in trouble, or that he or she is on a formal weight control program. It means an individual's weight is being monitored more closely, a commander's responsibility.

The weight management program is set to help Air Force personnel remain fit by maintaining an appropriate weight that is commensurate with their height.



Five earn DOD recognition

Five Reese employees earned Department of Defense recognition Sept. 11 for their participation in the Model Installation Program.

Capt. Donald Davies, Capt. David Wormald, Dan McIntire, Marie Matthews and Erlene Stolk received DOD Certificates of Appreciation in a brief ceremony with Pentagon visitors and the Deputy Commander for Resources Col. Donald McCullough.

Captain Davies, USAF Hospital Reese administrator, was honored for proposing that an Air Force obstetrician be permanently assigned to the Reese hospital. The hospital administrator's proposal was received and a new slot approved beginning Monday.

Since an obstetrician will be here permanently, all military and military dependent OB and GYN

related care can be performed here. The proposal will save CHAMPUS more than \$200,000 per year.

The 64th Transportation Division chief, Captain Wormald, followed through on an earlier Air Force idea to send pay advices, and leave and earnings statements, through on-base distribution to cut postage expense. Instead of pay advices, however, Captain Wormald applied the idea to enlisted and officer club billing statements. Estimated savings at Reese will run close to \$1,400 a month. The idea is getting consideration for Air Force-wide use.

A proposal to change the aircrew watches issue and turn in procedure at Reese earned Budget Officer Dan McIntire DOD attention. The change will save Reese approximately \$7,800 annually.

Ms. Matthews was honored for a proposal to cut back the number of letters of justification for customers buying genuine replacement parts for any equipment. The supply Customer Support Branch assistant chief's idea should save approximately \$2,400 annually.

Supply Systems Analyst Ms. Stolk was noted for three MIP proposals. Ms. Stolk determined that reducing the number of brand name letters of justification would be to supply's and the customer's benefit.

And, since the Allowance and Authorization Section is required to revalidate items annually, it would probably save time and energy to allow the section to revalidate only local purchase items.

Finally, a proposal allowing the Repair Cycle Supply Unit, not allowances and authorizations, to handle items deemed special purchase recoverable was noted.

Fraud schemes aim at card numbers

"Congratulations, Mrs. Jones! Because you have such a good credit rating you have been selected to win one of these wonderful prizes: a new car, \$1,000 cash, a diamond, a large screen television, or a microwave oven. Can you verify your Visa or Mastercard number for me so we'll know we have the right Mrs. Jones!"

That's the pitch of a new consumer fraud that is apparently becoming widespread. After the unsuspecting consumer gives the caller his or her credit card number, the caller promises to send a gift. Instead, the caller and cohorts use the credit card number to charge other purchases to the conbably safe to give out the card number. However, when someone calls, refusal to give out this information may prevent an unexpected

number to someone over the phone. If a caller

knows to whom he or she is talking, or if calling a

motel or airline to make a reservation, it is pro-





Excess baggage is costly

A second lieutenant moves from Reese to Ramstein AB, West Germany. He is restricted to 600 pounds of unaccompanied baggage, but ships 700 pounds. He incurrs an excess cost of \$52.18 for being 100 pounds over weight.

A staff sergeant PCSing from Reese to Pease AFB, N.H., is authorized 7,000 pounds, but ships 8,000 pounds. The overweight baggage cost the NCO \$505.

Two simplified excess cost examples that prove it doesn't take much excess weight to add to an already expensive PCS move.

The Traffic Management Office suggests not shipping more than authorized.







Know the traffic rules

Traffic Safety has received many calls and questions pertaining to exits and access to parking lots. Many people are unaware of directives governing these areas.

In accordance with Section 92 of the Texas Motor Vehicle Laws, the operator of an automobile in a business or residential area, departing from a alley or parking lot shall stop the vehicle just prior to driving onto the sidewalk area extending across any alleyway or driveway. Prior to entering the roadway, the vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching. The same thing applies to access roads into parking lots. Whether entering or exiting parking lots, regardless of whether there is a traffic control device persent or not, the motorist must yield-the-rightof-way prior to entering or exiting parking

A good example is the access road between Buildings 75 and 76. This area can be congested with pedestrians and moving vehicles

from the north and south. There is no traffic control device at the entrance of this parking lot, but motorist entering the parking lot should maintain a speed of 10 mph or slower, and yield the right-of-way to approacing vehicles and pedestrians. In accordance with Air Force Regulations 125-14, Wing Supplement 1, Section 32a: "No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed greater than is reasonable or prudent." Section 14 states that the maximum possible speed in a parking lot is 10 mph. The access road between Buildings 75 and 76 is an entrance into a parking lot and vehicles should not be "zooming" into it.

Motorists need to be familiar with the possible changes in driving conditions. Slow down and yield-the-right-of-way prior to entering parking lots and stop just prior to departing from parking lots. Be alert and prepared for the other moving vehicles and pedestrians. Using common sense in these areas will aid in preventing careless mistakes, and help you to watch out for the





Music Review "Home by Dawn"

J.D. Souther is a member of a dying breed; California country-rock singer-songwriters. Previous stars from this category have either quit (the Eagles) or totally changed their style (Linda Ronstadt). It seems that there just isn't much of an audience for this kind of music anymore.

During California country-rock's heyday, Souther was a more important figure than his less-than-famous surname indicated. As a songwriter, he did songs for artists like Ronstadt, Bonnie Raitt and Nicolette Larson. The new J.D. Souther album, "Home By Dawn," is good enough to have been a big hit back in the '70s; if it had been released then. Its fate in the New Wave and Heavy Metal world of the '80s is less certain.

The LP starts out with a rockabilly swagger on the title cut. Souther still has the knack for apt descriptons, as the following lines indicate: "He said goodbye and just walked right out the door. He looked so good he must have practiced it before.'

The next song is the current single, "Go Ahead and Rain." It has a similar sound to a song J.D. Souther co-wrote for the Eagles, "Best of My Love." As a soft country-rock ballad, it's right on target.

The remaining songs on "Home By Dawn" get equally high scores. Souther has a dulcet tenor voice that sounds particularly good on the ballads "I'll Take Care of You" and "All I Want." There are also some fine instrumental performances by some veteran L.A. session musicians such as guitarist Waddy Wachtel and a duet with Ronstadt.

Maybe the quality of records like "Home By Dawn" will spur a mini-comeback for this kind of music. If not, those who appreciate country-rock will have to grab them quickly before they disappear from sight.







renovation project.


