



organizations to which the proceeds are targeted.



measure the unborn baby's heartbeat and the mother's contractions during labor, Ms. Seaton explains.

Monitoring also can be done during the pregnancy to check on the unborn baby's health.

"The baby's heartbeat is an excellent indicator of its health," she continues. "If the baby's heartbeat is too fast or too slow, the physician can decide on what treatment needs to be done. We also look at the baby's heart rate in relation to the mother's labor contractions to see how the baby reacts to stress."
