The Stratford Independent School serves meals each school day. Children may buy, lunch for (Elem./Jr. High) \$1.25 (kigh School) \$1.35 and all breakfasts for \$1.00. Children also may get meals free or at a reduced price.

If you now get food stamps or AFDC for your children, your children can get free meals. If your total household income is the same or les than the amounts on the Income Chart below, your children can get free meals or reduced price meals. A foster child may get free or reduced price meals regardless of your income. The reduced price is $\frac{40}{30}$ for lunch and $\frac{30}{30}$ for breakfast.




