



Mammogram **Screening To Be** Held

On Tuesday, November 23, 1993, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., the Don & Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Hospital Mammography Unit will be in Stratford at the First United Methodist church, 520 N. Main. Exams are done by appointment only. For information or to schedule an appointment call 1-800-377-HOPE (4673) or (806) 359-4673.

The total cost of the screening is \$70.00. This includes the x-ray, physical breast exam, and the radiology fee for reading the mammogram. Funding has been provided by the Texas Department of Health to allow for free breast screenings for women who qualify.

The major goal of the clinic is the early detection of breast cancer. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self examination, and a mammogram. Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs of symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are:

1. Learn and perform breast self examination every month.

2. Have a physical examination

every year. 3. Have a mammogram according to recommendations by

Large Rice Pudding

Cook 1 cup rice, add 1/2 c drained crushed pineapple, 1/4 c raisins. Add cooked custard:

1. In a small bowl mix 3/4 c sugar, 1 1/2 Tbsp. flour, and 1/2 tsp

2. In large bowl beat 2 egg whites stiff-set aside.

3. Mix 2 Tbsp, cold milk to 2 egg yolks, add flour mixture and mix

4. Heat 2 c milk (I use canned milk) bring to a boil and add egg flour mixture-Stirring constantly. Cook 10 min.

5. Add 1 t vanilla and fold into egg whites while hot. Mix with rice mixture. Sprinkle with cinnamon-chill. Top with cool whip and sprinkle more cinnamon (lightly).




