

Poinsettia The Perfect Christmas Gift

By Susie Spurlock

These plants are usually grown in 4-inch and 6 inch pots but trees provide long lasting beauty in the basics in selection and care.

When purchasing a poinsettia, examine the plant carefully. Avoid one which has dropped the yellow flowers at the end of each branch. Select plants which have only three to five fully open flowers in a tight cluster. Also, avoid plants which have brown or moldy bracts. Look for strong upright plants that are well rounded.

Once in its new environment a poinsettia can easily last for more decorations. than a month if given proper care:

New Law Goes Into Effect Jan. 1, 1994

Austin - A new law that goes into effect Jan. 1, 1994, will eliminate the need for commercial vehicle operators to have their commercial vehicles undergo dual inspections. The new inspection program, to be overseen by the Texas Department of Public Safety, will combine the U.S. Department of Transportation inspection with the State of Texas safety inspection.

Beginning January inspections obtained at other than an official commercial Texas State Inspection Station will not be accepted.

Commercial motor vehicle means any self-propelled or towed vehicle except a farm vehicle with a gross weight, registered weight or gross weight rating of less than 48,000 pounds used on a public highway to transport passengers or property when: the vehicle or combination of vehicle has a gross weight, registered or gross weight rating in excess of 26,000 pounds; or the vehicle is designed to transport more than 15 people including the driver; or the vehicle is used to transport an amount of hazardous materials requiring placarding under the federal Materials Hazardous Transportation Act.

In medium bowl, combine all ingredients except sugar. Shape into 1" balls. Roll in sugar. Store in tightly covered container. Serves 2 1/2 dozen.
