Smart Jobs Fund Program Bill Passes

A bill creating an innovative program to assist Texas businesses in training workers and provide financial incentives for businesses expanding in the state passed the Texas House of Representative today. The bill is on its way to Governor Ann Richards for her signature. The Smart Jobs Fund Program will be administered by the Texas Department of Commerce.

"The Smart Jobs Fund Program will help businesses train and retrain workers, building a world's class work force second to none," said Commerce executive director Cathy Bonner. "Previously Texas had only limited financial assistance for worker training and retraining. through the Smart Jobs Fund Program, Texas will have the second largest state training fund in America--a financial incentive that will give us the edge when

In 1991, Commerce and the Council conducted a study that showed of all the factors determining where a company will locate, by far the most important factor was the availability of a skilled and trained work force.
