many Agricultural products. if only processes 8 percent of those products. The national average is 20 percent.

"If we reach that 20 percent processing rate, it would mean an additional \$26 billion every year for this state," Perry said. "When we reach the 20-percent level, it would mean what two superconducting supercolliders would mean."

Texas Agricultural Finance Authority has guaranteed 34 loans since 1991 and created more than 1,400 direct jobs, generating \$463 million in economic return for Texas, Perry said. "It's a great success story."

Texas has gone from some areas being 80 percent rural to 80percent urban. Buildings are boarded up in small towns, and there are no jobs to keep the youth in the smaller towns, he said.

"I wanted to find out if there was something we at the Department of Agricultural could do about that, or do we just have to accept it as the way its? "Perry said. "The answer is no, we don't have to accept it.
