## Jill Pronger Receives The New Professionals' Award



Jill Pronger received the New Professionals' Award from the Texas Association of Extension Home Econo-

mists. For her brief time in Extension, her accomplishments have been outstanding. She will be honored at the state meeting of the association August 2-4 in San Antonio.

The award is presented annually to a County Extension Agent who has worked from one to three years and has shown leadership in developing new and unique programs designed to reach Extension audiences.

Jill is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Pronger Jr. Jill served as an Assistant County Extension Agent-Home economics in Midland County following graduation from Texas Tech University. In May 1988 she transferred to Comanche County where she serves as home economics program leader.

The needs of the people have been identified by the home economics committee of her county. Following identification and planning of programs, this group assisted her with implementation.

Her foods and nutrition program targeted towards mentally retarded adults, Hispanic adults and youth, residents of battered women center and elderly persons have been outstanding.

More than 2500 people have been helped with wellness programming.

Because of her outstanding accomplishments, she has been chosen by her peers to be honored as the New Professional Award winner for 1989.

In the Texas Association of Extension Home Economists Jill has served on the state Ways and Means & scholarship selection committees and as the district Public Affairs committee chairman in 1987 in District 6 and 1989 & 90 in District 8. Jill's other professional activities include the American Home Economics association currently serving as the National Membership Committee chairman; membership eligibility sub-committee; national assembly of delegates 1984, 87, 88, 89; candidate for national student chairman and Texas Student Home Economist of the year in 1984. School days will begin again with students reporting for a full days class schedule on Friday, September 1 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. The kindergarten classes will run a regular schedule. The morning kindergarten class will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and the afternoon kindergarten classes will run from 12:30 p.m. to 3:35 p.m.

All busses will run at the regular time on the same schedule and routes as the end of last year. Lunch will be served in the cafeteria.

Registration for the 1989-90 school year will be as follows: Wednesday, Aug. 23, Seniors from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m.; Juniors from 10:00 to 12:00 noon. Thursday, Aug. 24, Sophomores from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m.; Freshmen from 10:00 to 12:00 noon.

All new students should have an immunization record with them at the time of enrollment. Students are required to have three DPT or TD immunizations with the last being after their 4th birthday. One immunization is required for rubella, measles, and mumps.

Kindergarten and first grade students are required to show a Birth Certificate and kindergarten students must be 5 years old prior to September 1, 1989.
