## JOURNALISM CLUB ORGANIZED AT BURK JR. HIGH SCHOOL

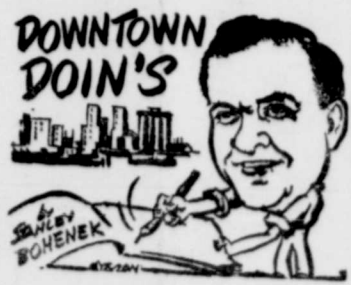

## Students Aid In March Of Dimes

"Teens on the team," has been one of the slogans of the March of Dimes Drive, as they seek the assistance of youngsters in the annual drive for funds to fight birth defects.

But in Burkburnett this month, the teens were practically the whole team.

When it comes to civic pride and effort, and the chance to help in a worthy cause, the students of Burkburnett High School took a back seat to no one.

That was evident this week as the Burk Dimes Drive neared a close, for the students of Burk High accounted for more than

65 per cent of the funds raised in the 1969 March of Dimes campaign.

Jingles Hayes, drive chairman for Burk, paid high tribute to the youngsters of BHS when he said, "All too often we hear only about that small minority of youngsters who stir up trouble and otherwise cause dissension. But it gives me great pleasure to commend the students of Burkburnett for their great efforts in the 1969 March of Dimes campaign to fight defects."

Hayes estimated that the drive will raise almost \$1,400. Of that amount, \$806.42 came

from the door-to-door canvass conducted by the Student Council, National Honor Society and Future Teachers at Burkburnett High.

In a spirited contest between classes at Burk High, another \$211.14 was realized.

The freshman class, by contributing \$70.00, was declared the winner of the contest.

Proper recognition was given at a special assembly Tuesday morning. High School Principal James Pearson, presented the class a handsome plaque.

The award was accepted by Vicki Littlejohn, class president.

The class was addressed by Mrs. Glen Veach, student council sponsor, Pearson, and Dale Lewis, assistant vice president of the First National Bank.

Also attending was A. R. Hill, president of the First National Bank, Hayes, and Mrs. Stanley Bohenek, who assisted Hayes in planning the city-wide drive.

Pearson lauded the freshmen for their zeal and devotion to the cause. He also singled out officers of the student council for their work in organizing the campaign at the school, and spoke highly of the Future Teachers club and the National Honor Society for their part.

The fund is drawing to a close with the collection of counter canisters from business places, and a special drive being conducted at Burkburnett Junior High School.
