Adams Named To ABFP Burk FFA Attends

KANSAS CITY, MO .-- Dr. Jerome M. Adams of Burkburnett, has been named a charter diplomate of the American Board of Family Practice as a result of passing a certification examination administered under the

aegis of the ABFP. To achieve diplomate status Dr. Adams through an intensive 2-day written examination, proved his ability in the areas of internal medicine, surgery, obstetricsgynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry, preventive medicine and other traditional specialties and now is certified in medicine's newest specialty -- Family Practice. The 3,285 doctors, nationally, who earned their diplomate distinction, are the vanguard of a new type of highly competent "people doctor" who accepts responsibility for the patient's total health care and serves as the natural point of entry into the complex me-

dical system. These specialists must continue to show proof of competency in the field of comprehensive, continuing care of the family by taking another exam and being re-certified every six years. No other specialy requires its diplomates to prove their competence on a continuing basis. The ABFP is unique among certifying boards because it

offered no "grandfather clause" which allows doctors practicing in the specialty when a board is created to become diplomates of that board without examination. To qualify for the examination each doctor completed a 3year family practice residency, or has been in family practice a minimum of six years and has successfully completed 300 hours of postgraduate medical education. The list of charter diplo-

mates released by the ABFP, the twentieth specialty board approved by the American Medical Association and the American Board of Medical Specialties, includes successful candidates from the first certification examination given in 1970, as well as those passing this year's examination. Most are members of the American Academy of General Practice, the national association of family physicians headquartered in Kansas City. The AAGP is the organization chiefly responsible for securing specialty status for Family Practice in February, 1969.


#### Theta Rho Girls Club Has Picnic

Forage treated with Parathion should not be fed to dairy animals being finished for slaughter. For further information on these materials contact your County Agricultural Agent or refer to the label.

Erysipelas may occur in any three forms; acute, subacute (diamond skin form) and chronic form. Acute swine erysipelas is characterized by a sudden apperance, with death of one or more animals. The subacute, or diamond

skin form, follows an attack

of the acute form. Diamond shaped skin lesions may develop which, at first, are areas of purplish-red discoloration, but may finally result in peeling away of some sections. Chronic erysipelas may follow the acute form or it may show up independently. The resulting arthritis causes joints to be stiff and enlarged. The extent of arthritis varies the duration of the

The diseaseusually spreads by direct contact, introduction of new animals into a herd, or from the droppings of birds and rodents. The bacterium can survive for some time in the soil and be a source of the disease year after year. Hollis warns.

#### Green Bug Control New **Avenues**

Lubbock... Although insecticides are the most effective tool producers have to protect their crops from insect damage, the role of insecticides may change in the near future as knowledge is gained for new avenues of control.

That's been the findings of research conducted by Dr. George L. Teetes, assistant professor and entomologist in charge of grain sorghum insect research at the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center north of Lubbock. Teetes is working at the Center on a long-range research program on greenbug

"Integrating insecticides with other methods of control is the goal of our research," explains Dr. Teetes, 'however, since almost any aspect of an agroecosystem can significantly influence the pest complex, and ultimately plant damage and crop lossed, changes in any one aspect can cause far-reaching changes of detacted cases and deaths in others.

"This year we used several nethods at different locations to dedermine the population levels of greenbugs that must be present to cause losses in grain yields," he explained. Determination of injury

important role. Research initiated by Dr. Dale Bottrell and Jim Cates in 1970, and continued in 1971, shows that low rates of several insecticides will keep greenbug populations below damaging numbers and yet have little

effect on beneficial species. "Our tests show that several insecticides applied at the rate of one-tenth pound actual toxicant per acre had little direct effect on beneficials," Teetes said, "however, such effective control of greenbugs was obtained that beneficials had no food supply on which to maintain themselves and rapidly decrease in numbers." These tests were conducted in small replicated plots as well as large fields with similar results.

Crop susceptibility is one of the main areas of research. The scientists are cooperating with sorghum plant breeders in selecting for plant resistance to the green bug and attempting to determine the type of resistance that is exhibited, such as tolerance, non-preference or antibiosis. "We have sources of resistance that is exhibited, but we must transfer this resistance into material that is agronomically acceptable," Teetes explained. This process often appears to go slowly but some of the crosses made this year look encouraging.

Biological knowledge of the greenbug is gained every year. But scientists are primarily directing their research to studying the overwintering habits of this past.

Eventually researchers hope to incorporate all these findings into an integrated control scheme, not necessarily eliminating greenbugs from sorghum, but maintaining populations below economic injury levels using all available means in conjunction with limited insecticide appli-

# Commissioner Speaks To Agri. Clubs

Big cities will benefit the most from a rural redevelopment program, Texas Agriculture Commissioner John C. White said here Monday (October 11) at a combined meeting of the Dallas Agri culture Club, the Fort Worth Farm and Ranch Club and the Wichita Falls Farm and Ranch

Club. White called for a massive rural redevelopment program in the state, which, he said, "is absolutely essential if our cities and rural areas are to survive."

He predicted big cities will continue to receive untrained rural residents who will end up on city welfare rolls. "This has happened hundreds of thousands of times in Texas during the past 20 years. It can only continue to increase unless all of us -- city and rural people alike -- work together to reverse this trend," he said.

White said rural areas now amount to "a vast open-air home for old folks." City people, meanwhile, he said, "have their own subculture. They imprison themselves at night in maximum security apartments and they look out of their barred windows at the decaying blight and fail to see the solution before them."

That solution, White said, is a rural development program which joins together city and rural programs augmented by federal and state aid. Helisted these essentials: 1. Metropolitan officials are

going to "have to realize that rural areas do indeed offer solution to their problems." 2. A national policy of ruralurban economy and society must be developed and implemented.

3. Rural areas will have to be made attractive in order to keep and attract people to

them. rural trade area can be of great economic value to the servicing city as demonstrated by the fact that 60 to 80 cents of each dollar generated in rural trade areas will eventually find its way through the

"A rural development program can relieve the cities of the problems of the inmigration of rural people who are ill-suited to city life," White said.

Rural areas, too, will have to cooperate in providing the services to attract and keep These include, he people. said, jobs, topflight educational facilities, recreational areas, adequate housing, and adequate medical care.



# Student Aide Program Offers Services to Amn.

SHEPPARD AFB, TEXAS---Those noncommissioned officers seen around the 3750th Technical School student squadrons are student aids, participating in a pilot project to improve the everyday life of the student airman.

The Student Aide Program, a joint brainchild of 3750th Technical School commander, Col. Thomas B. Miller and the school's sergeant major, CMSgt. Alfred E. Keeler, has sent NCO instructors to the student squadrons on a fulltime basis. The sole duty of these student aides is to counsel and assist airmen on an informal and personal

"We started this program as another means to assist our students in adjusting to Air Force life. It's also providing them another means for solving the day-to-day problems that come up," said

Colonel Miller. Heading the program, which is new in the present day Air Force, is CMSgt. Robert A. McClelland. "The job of the student aide is basically way he can to make the airman more productive and satisfied," Sergeant McClelland stated. We try to give

the students a feeling that experienced service men care about their welfare and wellbeing, Sergeant Mc Clelland

emphasized. "Most of the student aides have offices in dormitories of the assigned squadrons, and are easily accessible to students," Sergeant Mc Clelland pointed out.

"These aides," explained Sergeant McClelland, "are all of staff sergeant grade or above, and have been in the Air Force long enough to know how to help students solve their problems.'

"If a student has a problem with pay, for example," said Sergeant Mc Clelland, student aide might go with the airman to accounting and finance to get the problem solved,"

Student aides are all volunteers, stressed the program head, and have all shown an interest in the welfare of young airmen in their jobs as instructors. "If a man applies for a job as a student aide because he is dissatisfied with his present instructor job, we can't use him," said Sergeant McClelland. "We're looking for people who genuinely want to help the airmen."

Women's Program "The need for Vocational Education" has been climbing in popularity among the various program kits supplied to women's organizations throughout the country

by the National Association of Manufacturers. The introductory letter in the work kit says we have "an appalling shortage of skilled workers, mainly because too much emphasis has been placed on a college education and too little on the value of

learning a trade." It points out that only 77 per cent of today's youth will finish high school, and of those, only 45 per cent will enter college. More than 1,100 women's organizations ordered the kit the first month it was offered. An earlier kit, "Drug Abuse, What you can do about it." has been distributed to 9,000 clubs. This was an important factor in the NAM's receiving a national award as the organization which made the greatest contribution to the drug abuse cause in the past year.


