History

Mrs. J. G. Griffin of Wichita Falls was in the city this week on business and meeting former neighbors and friends.

C. N. Todd, 26, of Thrift, known as "Blondie Todd" among his relatives and friends, died Monday afternoon in the Seymour hospital, his death reputed to have been caused by knife wounds inflicted Saturday night on a fishing camp, 20 miles from that city, by Lee Crowder, 23, of Seymour, his friends, with whom Todd was spending the week-end. The altercation between the men seems to have been started in a friendly scuf-

file when Crowder became angry and drew his knife, cutting Todd with many slashes, which caused his death Monday.

The first load of wheat of the 1928 crop to be brought to the Burkburnett markets, was delivered Wednesday about 4 p. m. by Dave Abbott who resides 1 miles west of town.

The wheat was number 1 grade and brought \$1.20 per bushel. It was purchased by W. S. Duvall Co., who also gave a bonus of \$25 for the first load of new wheat.

The second load was brought in Wednesday about 6 p. m. by Joe Slama, and sold to J. F. Kelley Grain & Coal Co. for \$1.20 per bushel. He received a bonus of 10 cents per bushel, the second load brought to town.

The work of rebuilding the approach to the Oklahoma end of the free bridge across Red River near Burkburnett is progressing, although working under the handicap of high water.

The Oklahoma State Highway Commission let the contract soon after the washout work started two weeks ago. When it will be open to traffic cannot be definitely answered but it is doubtful whether it will be opened Saturday according to best information obtainable.

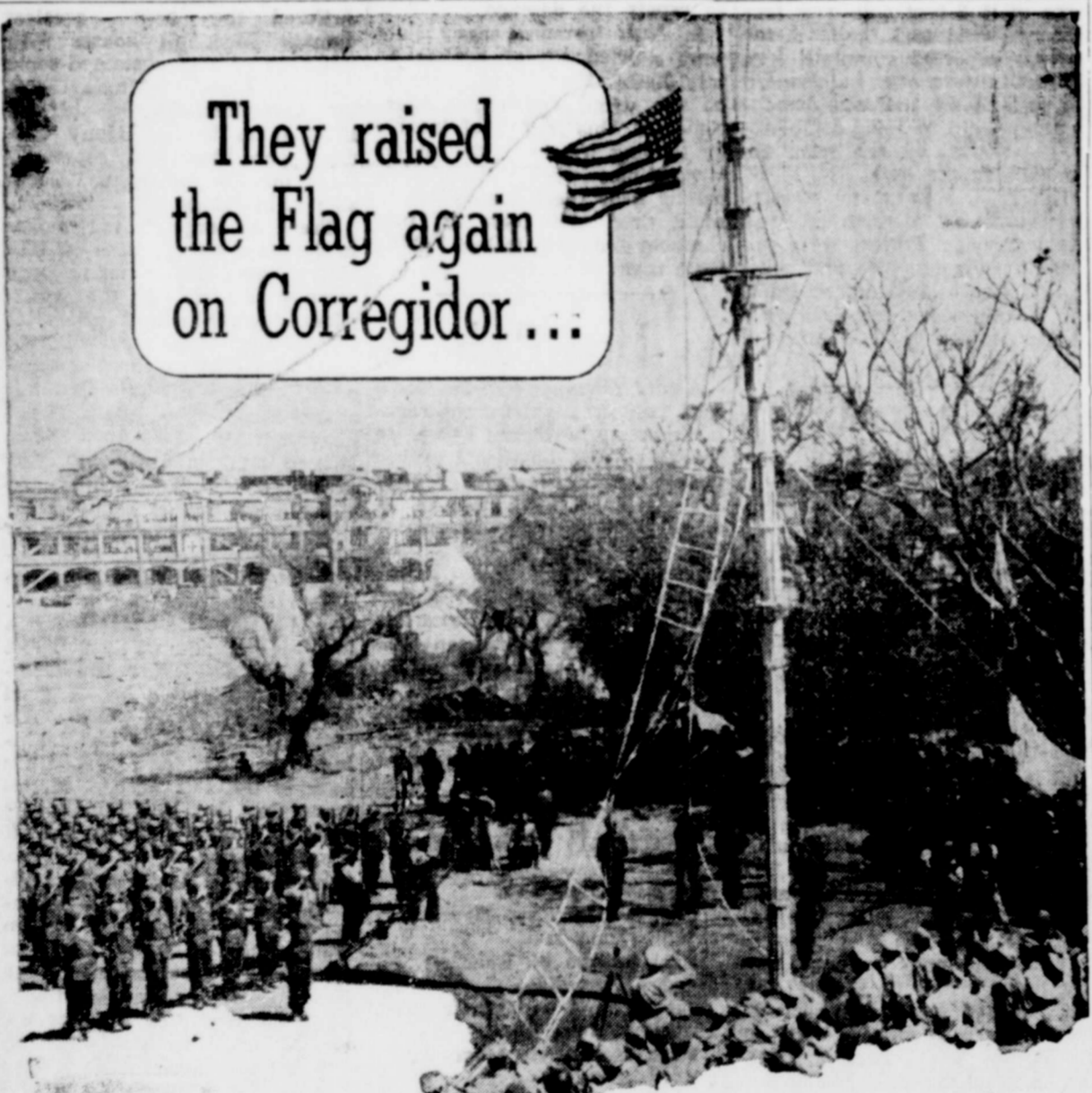

Cleanliness Urged to Fight Disease

In addition to the general instructions for community sanitation which may be important in preventing poliomyelitis, Dr. Geo. Cox, State Health Officer, today issued an urgent warning to every individual in Texas to practice strict personal hygiene to protect his own health and that of those about him.

Of course, cleanliness and personal hygiene are ordinarily taken for granted. Dr. Cox said, but this time with poliomyelitis creeping into every section of the state and with more than 100 cases already reported, it is like to re-emphasize some personal sanitary measures which

may help in preventing the spread of this crippling and often fatal disease.

The State Health Officer stressed the importance of scrupulous cleanliness of the person. Frequent bathing and immaculately clean clothing are vitally necessary. Oral hygiene with thorough brushing of the teeth and the use of a mild antiseptic are recommended. The nasal passage should be kept clean and dental defects corrected immediately.

Rubber contracts and ripples into an unstretched state in much the same way as an earthworm moves across the surface of the ground. From April 1, 1942, to August 31, 1944, the total amount of natural rubber imported into the United States was 214,148 long tons. India and Africa supplied 35.3%; 31.9% came from Latin America, and 15.3% from Liberia. The remaining 17.5% came from shipments in transit when sources were lost to Japan. Buses now carry more than half the total number of persons transported by intercity public carriers in the United States.
