IT'S THE LAW
There is one almost absurdly simple way in which Texans could reduce the annual traffic accident toll of dead and injured, and that is to observe the now archaic admonition of the old railroad crossing signs: "Stop, Look, Listen."
The most important third of that advice is "Stop", since every driver with normal vision and hearing presumably looks and listens as he drives.
There is a State law which requires trucks and buses to stop at every railroad crossing. Most bus drivers, both in the cities and on the roads, observe this law. Some truck drivers ignore it.
Remember, the crossing sign's warning applies to the man on the road, not the engineer in the locomotive. He can't stop at every crossing. You can stop, and if you are operating a truck, the law requires you to do so.

A comfortable home means protecting from wind, rain and cold—and it means a good environment helps the birds lay more eggs through the winter. A poultry house provides room, light and fresh air. It is dry at all times and free of drafts, and has enough space for the various kinds of birds so that the flock can move around the feeders, nests and roosts. The amount of room necessary depends on the number of birds and whether the birds are allowed to range. The light breeds require three square feet of space per bird while heavy breeds need about four square feet. This amount of space

should be provided when birds are confined or on restricted range; they may require slightly less when given plenty of range. Climate is the determining factor when deciding on the type of construction best suited for your flock. In sections which endure long, cold winters, special attention must be given to insulating the house so that the birds are protected from extreme cold, yet are allowed plenty of fresh air. A good system of ventilation provides fresh air without drafts, and helps keep the house dry.
Window Light
 Windows should be placed in the front of the house to provide a good source of light. There should be at least one square foot of window space for every 20 or 30 square feet of floor space in the house. Equipment should be located so that it is easily reached by the birds. It should be of a type that is not difficult to clean and disinfect and there should be enough of it for all birds to use without crowding or the flock will be handicapped and profits may be lost. Crowding around feeders or waterers discourages good sanitation and may be the cause of disease outbreak.
