Select Laying Birds Carefully

There is no place in the laying house for an unprofitable egg producer. Such birds will only consume valuable feed and take up room needed by their more prolific sister — without paying for their keep.

When the time comes to select the pullets which will comprise your laying flocks, remember that every poor layer you choose will lower the efficiency of the flock as a whole.

The type of bird to select is one which will come into production early, will maintain a good laying record throughout the winter and will continue to lay well into the summer. There is no assurance that every pullet you select will equal this standard. However, there are certain markings and

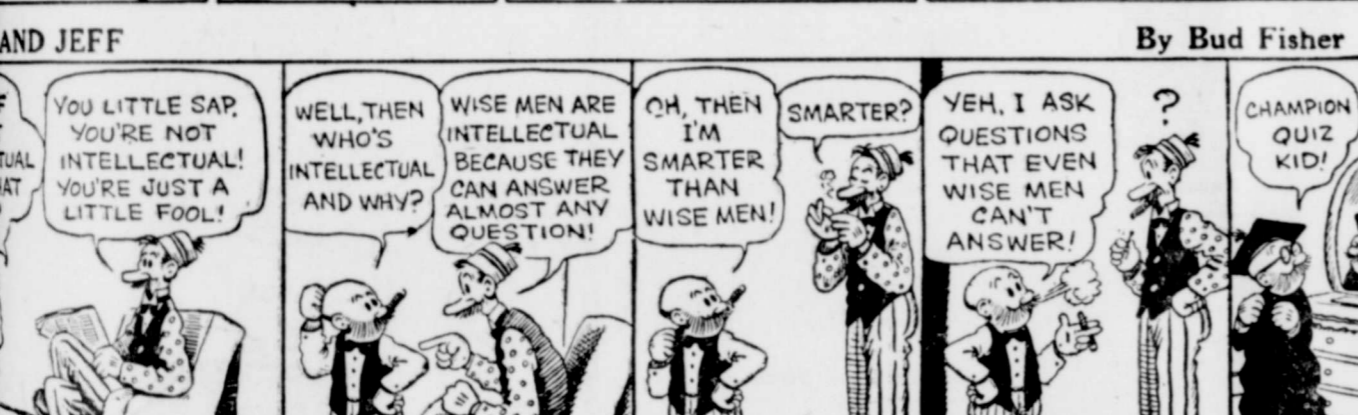

Traffic Law Says

These are provided; to use sidewalks where they can, or to walk facing the traffic, on the left side of the road, where there is no sidewalk. A pedestrian in a cross walk has the right-of-way over all vehicles. These are the first real pedestrian regulations we have ever had in Texas, and the observance of them will keep a lot of people from walking themselves to death.

Drivers are required to stay on the right side of the road, with certain sensible exceptions; dangerous maneuvers in passing are outlawed; right-of-way rules are set out; teeth are put into the stop sign law; the safe manner of making turns and stops is designated, and uniform hand and arm signals are required for these maneuvers.

Following radiator-to-bumper is forbidden, and so is racing trains to crossings. Parking on a highway is outlawed except when the vehicle is out of order and can't be moved. Drivers are required to dim their lights 500 feet from an approaching vehicle at night.

Driving while under the influence of drugs is about the same

as driving while drunk under the new law, even if the drugs were given by a dentist or doctor.

One part of the law that will make it rough on deliberately dangerous drivers is the new reckless driving clause. As it is now, a man can drive recklessly without violating any specific law, such as speeding, and the officers can't do anything with him. But under this new clause the reckless driver has a special noose to stick his head into.

The code requires every vehicle to have good lights and brakes and a horn. Trucks and buses must also have mechanical signalling devices when they are so built that hand and arm signals can't readily be seen.

Anyone who has a highway accident must stop and identify himself, give any help that is needed, and immediately notify the nearest Highway Patrol or Sheriff's office. The driver must also make a written report to the Department of Public Safety within 24 hours if anyone is killed or hurt or if damage amounts to \$25 or more.

These accident reports are very important. They are confidential and are not used to get evidence against a driver, but to help us figure out where and when and why accidents are happening, so that whatever is necessary can be done to prevent future accidents—whether the remedy be engineering education, or enforcement.

All traffic control signs and signals put up by any city or county of the State Highway Department will have to be like those used in most other states. This is to make it so that a person driving from one city to another, or from one state to another, can find his way around without being confused.

These are the briefest highlights of the law. Another article next week will discuss some of the major details.

Telephone Co. Asks Hunters To Be Careful

With 2,500 telephone wires shot out of commission last year the Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. today urges hunters to use care in shooting at or near its pole lines in the coming hunting season.

About one-third of all cases of trouble on open wire long distance telephone lines last year was traced to gunshot damage, C. C. Kirby, telephone company district manager, said.

"Even good shots miss occasionally," Kirby said, "and a shot at a bird on a telephone line, or flying in front of it, may cut a wire and interrupt telephone service between towns until we can get men out there to repair it. Some important messages could be delayed."

Admitting that it might take a lot of will power to pass up a "fat" shot, Kirby said, "care and thoughtfulness on the part of hunters now will go a long way toward protecting the community's vital telephone service."

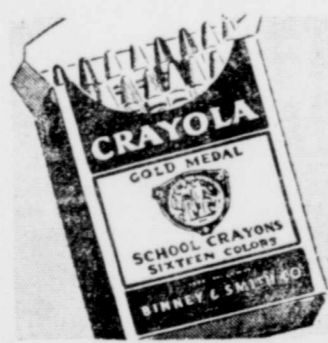
