That there are millions who are hungry and will face starvation this winter, we don't deny. That these countries can't afford to buy our higher priced foods, is understandable. Something must be done.

Those who favor compulsory food rationing, realize it can't be affected without an act of Congress. That takes a! long time. There are those who prefer the voluntary rationing of food, which could be effective at once, without the process of red tape and Congressional entanglements. During World War I, we observed meatless and wheatless days each week. Cities have now inaugurated a meatless day or two each week. It is proof that when Americans feel something is worthy and necessary they don't need a law.
