C.—Leaders of the Democratic party, particularly on Capitol Hill in Washington, were thunderstruck when President Truman issued his civil thunderstruck when President Truman issued his civil been shown by the fact that Southern Democratic dissenters arose in wrath, threatening to bolt their old political party.

But the wrath against the President has been dying down and careful observers believe that Southern Democrats will vote—as usual.

The real weakness of the Democrats is in the North—one reason being that Mr. Truman has not worked harmoniously with his fellow Democrats in Congress.

The third ticket by Henry Wallace landed a surprise victory in the recent election in the Bronx, New York.

When the Democratic problems are all sized up the condition may be stated in a very brief sentence: "Truman is admittedly a weak candidate." He has been at outs with his own party in Congress over budgets, taxation, foreign policies, high prices; he has failed to stand shoulder to shoulder with Democratic leaders in the two branches of Congress.

Nevertheless, in the opinion of the "wise leaders" in the National Capitol, Mr. Truman will be nominee of the Democratic party.

The Army and Air Force saved more than \$9½ million last year as a result of suggestions made by employees who received \$176,241 in cash awards for 4,631 successful ideas. More than 25,000 suggestions were submitted and the awards ranged from \$10 to \$918, the amount being based on the saving effected by the idea.

Chick Chats

Watch Out For Flock Colds

Infectious coryza (commonly called colds) is a common respiratory disease of chickens which occurs most frequently during the

cold weather months. While it does not cause heavy mortality in most instances, it is feared by most poultry raisers because of its marked effect on egg production and because it creates many culls.

Coryza is a common problem among birds which are exposed to cold drafts and dampness. It causes the severest harm in young adult flocks, although it affects birds of all ages.

A characteristic symptom of infectious coryza is the discharge from the affected bird's nostrils. In the early stages this material is thin and watery, but later it becomes thick and sticky. The face, wattles and skin of the neck often become swollen, the swellings being filled with fluid. Sometimes the bird's eyes are completely puffed shut due to the swelling. Difficult breathing and coughing may also be symptoms.

The danger of a coryza outbreak is lessened considerably when birds are quartered in tight well ventilated houses which are warm and free of drafts.

Within recent years sulfathiazole has been used extensively to control coryza outbreaks. This drug, when used as soon as the early cold symptoms appear, hastens recovery of affected birds — the diseased fowl usually appear normal within 48 hours after treatment has been started. Sulfathiazole is now available in commercial form as a drinking water medicine for easy use.

S-Sgt. Willett Leaves For Germany

S/Sgt. Kenneth E. Willett, B-29 mechanic in the 9th Bomb Squadron, 7th Bomb Wing, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. J. Willett, Burk Burnett, Texas, left this morning for Furstenfeldbruck, Germany.

The bombers which are a unit of the 8th Air Force, a part of the Strategic Air Command, will arrive in Germany, February 29.

All but two of the super fortresses will take the middle Atlantic route to Germany by way of the Azores, a distance of approximately 590 miles. Two of the B-29's will fly the northern

route, traveling from Carswell Air Force Base to Westover Air Force Base, Massachusetts and then to Furstenfeldbruck by way of Keflavik, Iceland, a flight of approximately 4300 miles.

Sgt. Willett's plane will follow the northern route. The flight is part of a routine training program designed to give B-29 air crews training in the flying techniques and procedures in long-range, over water

The SNAPSHOT GUILD



Close-ups with a punch are possible even with the simple box camera when a close-up attachment is used.

Closer Close-Ups

FROM time to time in these columns we've talked about the wisdom of taking close-ups, about the impact which a close-up picture often has. So it's no surprise that a reader raises the question of making close-ups with a box-type camera. "Sure, close-ups are fine," he chides us, "but my box camera manual says, 'Only subjects eight feet and farther from the camera are photographed sharply.'"

The best answer here is to use a device called a close-up attachment, an inexpensive supplementary lens which comes in several sizes and snaps in place on the front of the camera. With such a lens it's possible to use a box camera 3 1/2 feet from your subject.

The use of such a lens will not affect exposure in any way. It merely permits you to focus close in, to get an image that fills your negative. The one important thing to remember here is: compose your picture carefully. For the viewfinder of a box camera shows the picture

you get working at a greater distance. Consequently, when using a close-up attachment, it's necessary to tip the camera up so your subject will be centered on the negative. A few trial shots will show this.

Similar supplementary lenses are also available for folding cameras and for miniature cameras. These can be had in several different powers, the strongest of them making it possible to shoot from as close as ten inches.

One word of warning should be given, however, about the use of such attachments: always measure this lens-to-subject distance with a rule or tape; with the normal box camera, just as is, everything between eight feet and infinity will be in fairly sharp focus. But working close in with a close-up attachment, the depth-of-field is small. An error of six inches in your lens-to-subject distance may mean a fuzzy picture.

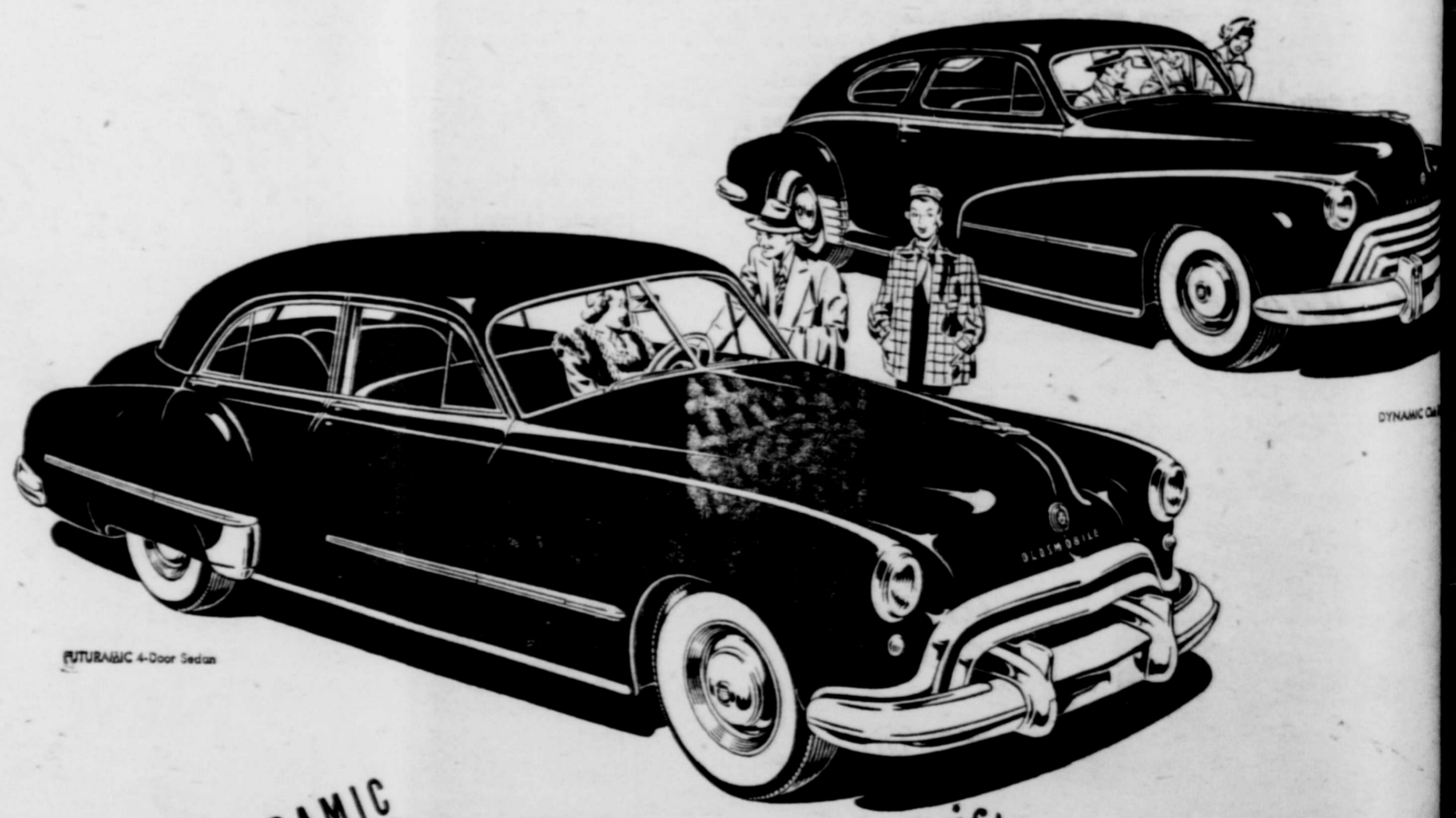

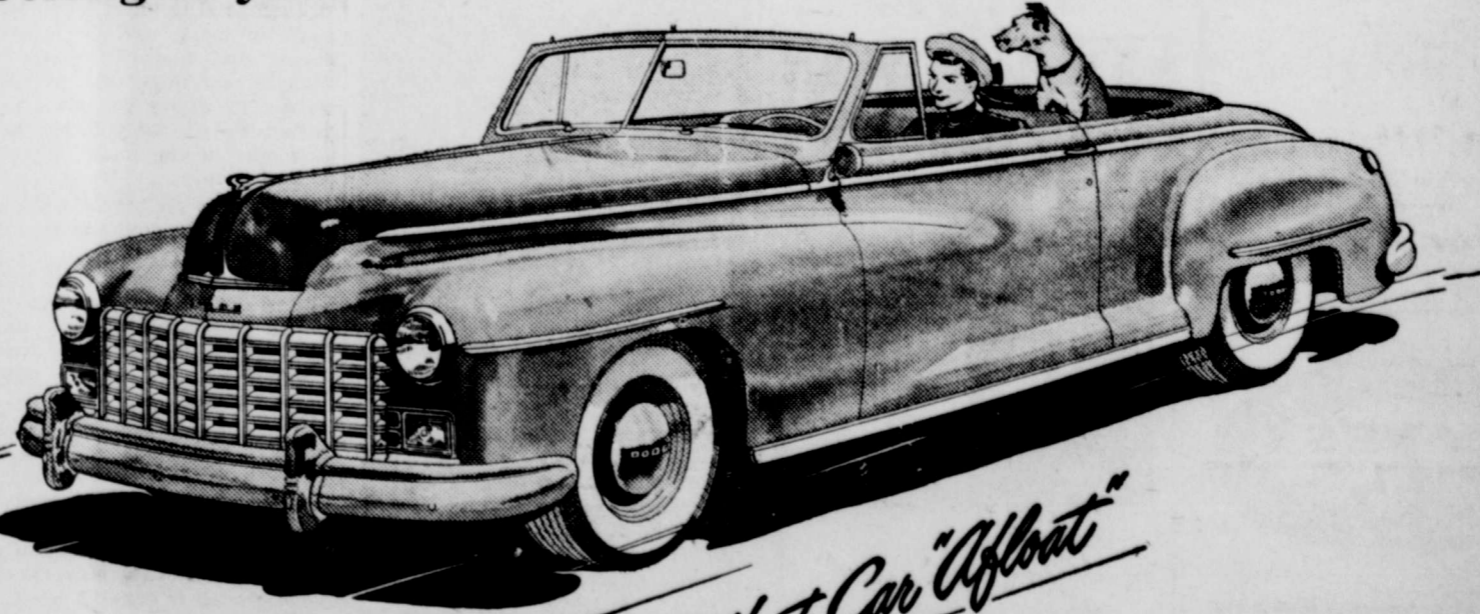

Never a man inclined to extremes of optimism, Secretary of Agriculture Clinton Anderson has warned that although the world grain situation has improved considerably this year it has not yet caught up with world needs.

He predicted, moreover, that next year's demand against the United States' supplies will be about 300 million bushels of wheat and 100 million bushels of coarse grain.

Not only that, said Anderson, the high demand for U. S. grain probably will continue for from three to five years, and he expressed the hope that an international wheat agreement would be in effect by that time to assure a continued export market thereafter.

In presenting a detailed analysis of grain developments in the past year, Anderson: 1. Defended department of agriculture export grain buying practices...

As far as meat supply is concerned the situation is reasonably alarming, reported the department of agriculture, developing further its now familiar theme that the nation faces a meat shortage of considerable proportions this spring.

IRELAND: New Premier

Even to members of the Eire assembly who had helped defeat him it was strange to see Eamon De Valera, premier of Ireland for 16 years, sitting quietly on the opposite side of the house as leader of the opposition.

In his place as premier was John A. Costello, former attorney general, whom the assembly had voted into office after a new six-party coalition had taken control of the legislative group as a result of the previous elections.

Costello, in a dignified speech to the assembly, explained his sudden emergence as premier of Ireland: "I consented to this nomination at the request of a number of parties who felt that the interest of the country required that there should be an inter-party government and that the premier of that government should occupy a position in political life detached from the controversial bitterness of the past."

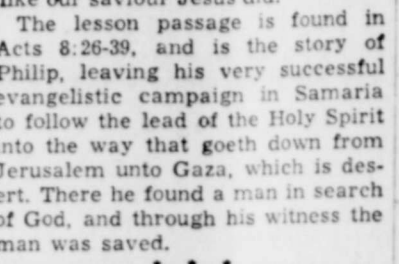

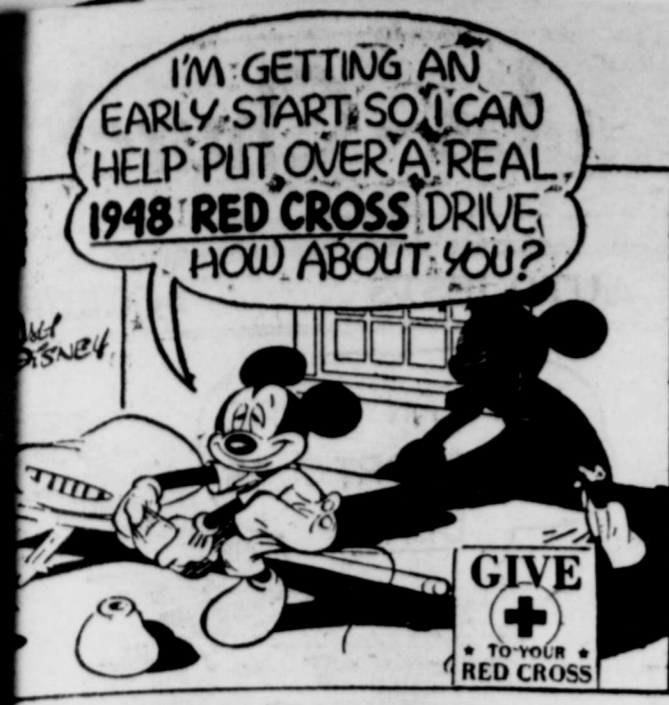

Don't Gamble Behind the Wheel

Don't throw your weight around advises George Clarke, managing director of the Texas Safety Association.

Remember that when you are sitting behind the wheel, you are driving a car that weighs more than 2,000 pounds, and the pedestrian crossing the street only weighs an average of 150 pounds. It isn't quite fair, is it?

The Texas Safety Association is cooperating in a nationwide "Know and Obey Traffic Laws" program during February, and Clarke said that accidents involving pedestrians are one of the biggest killers. He pointed out National Safety Council statistics to back up this assertion.

Pedestrians at intersections account for 28 per cent of all urban fatal accidents, and 35 per cent of all fatal accidents are non-intersection pedestrians mishaps. In addition, 27 per cent of were crossing at intersections all pedestrians killed in cities without signals, and 38 per cent were crossing between intersections.

Clarke emphasized the following things to remember for the driver in giving pedestrians the right-of-way:

When pedestrians are crossing at unsignalized intersections, drivers must give them the right-

Regulations vary from place to place. Pedestrians are sometimes prohibited from crossing between

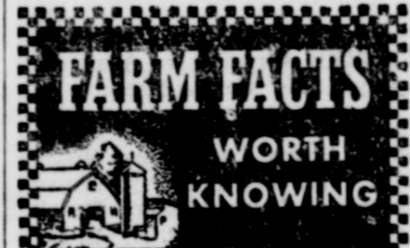
intersections in certain areas of the city. Sometimes they are allowed to cross if they can do so safely. Know your local rules.

Q. How can a poultry raiser overcome dirty eggs?

A. To insure clean eggs from your hens, be sure to observe the following practices:

1. Provide one nest for each seven hens.
2. Keep floor covered with good litter.
3. Keep nests well littered with shavings, excelsior or straw.
4. Keep under-side of perches covered with 1 1/2 inch mesh 18 gauge wire.
5. Keep hens in house when yards are muddy.
6. Have hands clean when gathering eggs.
7. Pack eggs in good cases with clean fillers and flats.

Q. What percentage of pigs that are farrowed are raised to market? Can this percentage be increased?

A. According to the U.S.D.A., normally only 56% of the pigs that are farrowed reach market age. This high mortality figure means an increase in production costs, including feed for those pigs that fall by the wayside. At the Research Farm of the Ralston Purina Company where a program of breeding, feeding, management and sanitation is followed, about 79% of the pigs farrowed are raised to market.

Q. Should broilers fed an all-mash ration be given grit?

A. No, grit is unnecessary as chickens can digest such a ration without use of grit just as well.

Q. What causes milk to become ropey after it has stood a while, and how can this condition be prevented?

A. Ropey milk should not be confused with stringy, clotted, gargety milk from mastitis infected cows. Ropey milk may look normal as it comes from the cow and usually the ropery condition is not apparent until it has stood for several hours during which time the types of bacteria responsible for this condition have had a chance to multiply. Bacteria causing this condition are usually found in stagnant water, and the trouble is apt to occur when cows get out on pasture and wallow in ponds or swampy places. Improper sterilization or rinsing milking utensils with impure water may cause contamination. This trouble can easily be overcome by improved sanitation practices.

for example, whether he is honest and sincere, or whether he is qualified for the office he seeks. Since it may be impossible for me to know every voter personally, although I shall try hard to do so, I invite you to inquire about my character from the people who know me and urge that you check my qualifications for this important post by talking to your attorney or any attorney in Wichita County."

Juvenile Views
 One of the duties of a District Judge is to preside over the trial of delinquent juveniles and serve as a member of the Juvenile Board. I will consider it a special privilege to work with the youth of our county. If granted that privilege, I will put forth every effort to help salvage and make good future citizens out of the boys and girls who have gotten off the path of right in their tender years. I am young enough to understand many of their problems and mature enough to have had several years experience dealing with the wayward boys in our fighting forces. Some of my most gratifying memories are those of helping to straighten out some of the boys who came into the Navy without any apparent regard for the rights of their fellow men and of seeing those boys become valuable assets to our nation, both as military men and as every day citizens."

I have enjoyed my tenure as Justice of Peace and have worked conscientiously to raise the standard of this humble but important office to the dignity of a court. I have tried sincerely to enforce that which I firmly believe to be right—one standard of justice for all, regardless of race, creed, or economic position in life. No man should be a District Judge unless he has the judicial courage to enforce this standard."

First Political Race
 "In entering a political race for the first time in my life, I enter not as a politician and without any desire of ever becoming one, but rather as an attorney and citizen of this County asking for a position more suited to my training, carrying a greater responsibility, and paying a better salary."
