CONNECTICUT HAS A WAY

An operation is in progress in Connecticut that is being studied by other states. It is a program for reducing auto accidents by weeding out unsafe drivers. The system is, to provide a scoreboard for every motorist in the state who violates the law. A grading up from one to 10 points is marked on the card, according to the gravity of the violation. A police warning is one point, speeding gets three points, a fatal accident involvement, if the driver is held responsible, carries 10 points. Motorists who receive three points on their card within five years, are mailed a warning letter. Those with five points are invited in to a driver clinic conference where such problems are discussed in a friendly way and the motorist warned he may lose his license unless he is more careful. Six points and it means a hearing with the chance of having the license suspended. Connecticut reaches the percentage of drivers who are having more than usual number of accidents, convictions, warnings. It is working well there and has solved the "accident repeater" problem.

It would be well for us to consider the situation here in Burkburnett. You would be surprised at the number of people who drive here almost every day who could not pass a driver's test if they took it every day for a week.

representative of the Wichita Falls office of the Social Security Administration, will be at the City Hall in Burkburnett on Thursday, July 27th at 2:30 P. M. to take claims for benefits under the Federal old-age and survivors insurance program and to supply information on the system.

The Federal social security program, which applies to workers in industry and commerce, provides for the payment of monthly benefits when the qualified employee reaches age 65 and retires, for eligible members of the worker's family, and for the survivors of insured workers who die at any age.

When an insured worker dies and there is no one qualified to receive monthly benefits, a lump sum payment may be made.
