The following are good varieties of bulbs to plant at this time that may be obtained locally: Amaryllis, hyacinth, lily tulip, many varieties of narcissus, ranunculus, snowdrops, and anemones.

It is sometimes best to change the location of bulbs often, but some make themselves at home and come up year after year with a minimum of attention.

It is helpful to get the advice of the dealer or nurseryman who provides the bulbs, seeds, plants or shrubs, as the method of planting and care is so important to suc-


