

"What causes criminalty, Uncle Bud?" repeating our question.

"Well, folks don't take time to raise their children. for one thingjust plain old neglect for the boy. That's one angle.

"Another is we can't keep the lads busy. I was raised on a Hill county farm where there was work to do, and plenty of it. But the rush to town has put one boys on the streets and no boy can roam the streets, stay out at night and the like, and be safe

Bud Russell is a Texan. He stands square on his boost soles, looks at you with clear, honet eyes, and he looks at his work and his "boys" the same way.


"Boys who are brought up to hate authority, to see and hear tales where the outlaw is the hero, who are encouraged at home to ridicule the sacred things, these are the boys who furnish our acmy of criminals.

"Are the outlaw tribe fearless?" he was asked.

"Usually they are too selfish with their own hides and lives to be brave,' says Bud Russell. "They are so selfish that they become desperate and therefore dangerous, he says. Killers without conscience.

Bud Russell is a straight thinking man. "The very business of outlawry makes cowards of men. A man can't be brave when he knows his business is bad, and that goes for men both in side and out side of prison."


Russell has handled Ray Hamilton numerous times and also guarded him thru the trial that brought him the death sentence, taking him to the death cell from which he later escaped. Without appearing contemptuous, boastful, Russell impresses one as seeing all criminals alike, none too big to be handled none too meek to take the wrong chances with. Russells men have lost prisoners, some of them have been tied up, beaten. and nearly killed. But no prisoner has ever put a hand on Uncle Bud. And he has gone after them to the far corners, and brought them back in battalions.

Jue Palmer late associate of Barrow in his forays and killings, and most in the Hundsville death house, says Barrow on his last raids in Missouri and Texas, spoke of Bud Russell and his advice, and agreed that at the right time a few swings of the parental strap might have cured him of banditry.

"What caused criminalty, Uncle Bud?" repeating our question.

"Well, folks don't take time to raise their children, for one thingjust plain old neglect for the boy. That's one angle.

"Another is we can't keep the lads busy. I was raised on a Hill county farm where there was work to do, and plenty of it. But the rush to town has put our boys on the streets and no boy can coam the streets, stay out at night and the like, and be safe

Bud Russell is a Texan. He stands square on his boot soles, looks at yng with clear, homet eyes, and he looks at his work and his "boys" the same way.

"Boys who are brought up to hate authority, to see and hear tales, where the outlaw, is the hero, who are. encouraged at home to ridicule the sacred things, these are the boys who farnish our army of criminals.

"Are the outlaw tribe feartels?" te was asked

"Usually they are too selfish with their own hides and lives to be brave,' rays Bud Ru sell. "They are so selfish that they become desperate and therefore dangenous, he says. Killers without conscience.

Bud Russell is a straight thinking wan, "The very braness of outlawry makes cowards of man. A man can't be brave when he knows his business is bad, and that goes for men both in side and out side of prison." .

Russell has handled Ray Hamilton sumerous times and also guarded him thru the trial that brought him the death sentence, taking him to the death cell from which he later escaped. Without appearing contemptuous, houstful, Russell impresses one as sseing all criminals alike, none too big to be handled none too meek to take the wrong chances with. Russells men have lost prisoners, some of them have been tied up, beaten, and nearly killed. But no prisoner has ever put a hand on Uncle Bud. And he has gone after them to the far corners, and brought them back in Inttalions.






