The gravel bed has only been the Centennial gate receipts but punctured in the middle of the well which is 18 feet in diameter.

> The concrete curbing will be set just above the gravel bed on the hard clay in order to cut out the sand above the clay.

> When the well is completed the water will be pumped directly into the City pipe line at the big pump station at the lake. As soon as the work can he finished a concrete storage tank will be constructed at the station and kept filled with water for reserve use. In case of fire the big pump can be used to drive the reserve supply into the stand pipe tank in town.

CAN YOU

Austin, Texas, April 10th. Only five Texas Counties could boast a re cord of less than five per cent of their residents on relief rolls as of March , statistics compiled by the Texas Relief Commission reveal. These are Creckett, Kenady, Lavaca, Reagan and Winkler.

Fourteen others, Hudspeth, Terrell Upton, Parmer, Hutchinson, Carson, Hidalgo Cameron, Nueces, Bee Gonzales Fayette and Fort Bend, were in the respectable class in the eyes of state relief officials with not more than from 5 to 10 per cent of their residents receiving aid. Twelve counties had more than 40 per cent of their inhabitants on the relief roils as follows:

Loving, Yoakum, Cochran, Garza, Kent, Stonewall, King Cottle Titus Cass, lLano and Zapata.

"These high case loads have got to come down at once," said Adam R. Johnston, state relief director, as preparations were being made to send out funds for April.

"Federal Authorities have cut our applications drastically and this means we must reduce our caseload or the individual budgets of clients. We want to issue adequate relief to those in dire need and administrators have been instructed to examine their rolls closely and close out all cases where the need for aid is not clearly established.

A further reduction in the number of cases is hoped for in May as the peak will be reached for seasonal

> had placed in the garden plot for sub irrigation purposes. The three rows of tile irrigate a plot sixteen feet by about fifty which will be used for growing tomatoes. The tomatoes will be spaced four feet apart and in the middle such vegetables as radishes, lettuce and spinach will be planted.

By the time the tomatoes are large enough to interfer with the growth of these vegetables or vice versa one of the two will have been harvestd.

Th garden is near a windmill. The water is piped within a few feet of the garden. A hose is connected to the pipe and carries the water to an iron barrel which is placed in the ground with a lead pipe covered with screen wire opening into the tile line This irrigates the three rows.

Austin, Texas, April 10th. Only five Texas Counties could boast a re cord of less than five per cent of their residents on relief rolls as of March , statistics compiled by the Texas Relief Commission reveal. These are Creckett, Kenady, Lavaca, Reagan and Winkler.

Fourteen others, Hudspeth, Terrell Upton, Parmer, Hutchinson, Carson, Hidalgo Cameron, Nueces, Bee Gonzales Fayette and Fort Bend, were in the respectable class in the eyes of state relief officials with not more than from 5 to 10 per cent of their residents receiving aid. Twelve counties had more than 40 per cent of their inhabitants on the relief roils as follows:

Loving, Yoakum, Cochran, Garza, Kent, Stonewall, King Cottle Titus Cass, ILano and Zapata.

"These high case loads have got to come down at once," said Adam R. Johnston, state relief director, as preparations were being made to send out funds for April.

"Federal Authorities have cut our applications drastically and this means we must reduce our caseload or the individual budgets of clients. We want to issue adequate relief to those in dire need and administrators have been instructed to examine their rolls closely and close out all cases where the need for aid is not clearly established.

A further reduction in the number of cases is hoped for in May as the peak will be reached for seasonal

"NSURANCE AGAINST GARDEN

"It actually works," said Mr. Sid funsey in speaking of the tile he had placed in the garden plot for sub irrigation purposes. The three rows of tile irrigates a plot sixteen feet by about fifty which will be used for growing tomatoes. The tomatoes will be spaced four feet apart and in the middle such vegetables as radishes, lettuce and spinach will be planted.

By the time the tomatoes are large enough to interfer with the growth of these vegetables or vice versa one of the two will have been harvestd.

Th garden is near a windmill. The water is piped within a few feet of the garden. A hose is connected to the pipe and carries the water to an ron barrel which is placed in the ground with a lead pipe covered with screen wire opening into the tile line This irrigates the three rows.


