Sterile flies are being released south of a line from Del Rio to San Saba and west of a line from San Saba to Port Lavaca. This is the buffer zone where the control is being ef .fected to Simisate the screw worm from Texas. Areas out side of this space that have screw worm cases are urged to contact the local screw worm committee of the county agent immediately so that samples of the worm can be sent into the lab and control measures set up in the affected areas.

M. V. Jay reported that the Kent Cornty committee submitted \$2500 to the state committee in mid April and about \$800 had been collected since that date. Each county committee sends its money to the state research committee on the 15 and 30 of the month.






